Why Denim?

In 1998, a teenage girl in Italy was raped by her driving instructor. The man was convicted, but his case went to the Supreme Court of Appeals in Rome. The court overturned the conviction arguing that because the girl wore very tight jeans she needed help removing them thereby giving consent to sex. The case made international headlines and the young woman's jeans became a symbol of awareness. What someone wears is **never an excuse for rape.**
