1. **CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL**
A motion was made and seconded to call the October 13, 2014 Outcomes Committee Meeting to order at 3:07p.m. Dr. Fredy Aviles, SLO Faculty Co-Chair, called the meeting to order at 3:07p.m. Motion carried.

Outcomes Reporting Guidelines

Data: All outcomes (SLO/PLO/OO) should be assessed and data be entered into Weave each academic cycle no later than two weeks after the end of the spring term. All intersession data should be entered in the current year cycle. All summer data should be entered into the following academic year cycle.

Action Plan: The minimum requirement is that each course, program, or operational area should have one action plan entered in Weave each cycle.
