

From classrooms to courtrooms. American Sign Language interpreters work to facilitate communication and access. If you are looking for an exciting and meaningful career where your work ensures equitable access to communication, you have come to the right place.

At AVC the Deaf Studies / Interpreter Training degree and certificate programs give students in-depth training in American Sign Language, the language used by the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community in North America. While the core components of each program are similar, each specialization differs slightly in focus. Interpreter Training students focus on developing and utilizing American Sign Language skills to provide communication access between Deaf/ Hard of Hearing and hearing people, while Deaf Studies students gain a deeper understanding of Deaf culture.

Students are prepared for transfer and/or for diverse careers as American Sign Language interpreters, instructional aids, and human service assistants.
