

Version 1

A. Reading

Eligibility for College Level Reading (AVC assessment) or completion of READ 099 with a minimum grade of "P" (Pass), or completion of an Associate Degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution of higher education other than AVC.

Version 2

A. Reading—Can be met in one of three ways:

- 1. Eligibility for College Level Reading on AVC assessment test.
- 2. Completion of Reading 099 with a grade of "P" (Pass).
- 3. Completion of an Associate Degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution.
