It was noted that at this time Film, Television and Electronic Media along with Journalism cannot be developed since we do not have a full-time faculty member in these areas that can undertake this challenging work. Dr. Cowell informed the committee that in regards to C-Id descriptor AJ 160, the faculty have created a new course to fulfill this criteria, which when approved, will be AJ 210. This is also the case for C-Id descriptor KIN 100, the Kinesiology faculty have developed a new course, KIN 100, to match the requirements of this descriptor. It was also stated that CHEM 101 (AVC Course) is not the proper course to pair with C-Id descriptor CHEM 100, nor is AVC course ENGL 102 the pair for C-Id descriptor ENGL 110. As a result, Dr. Grishman indicated that he would need communication from the faculty requesting the courses to be resubmitted for the appropriate C-Id designation.

Ms. Trimble indicated that it would be but it is the role of this committee and the faculty to determine if it is appropriate to have both degrees. She suggested that the faculty meet with the counselors to provide them with the information necessary to properly guide students to the correct degree based on their needs. Mrs. Lowry stated that she feels we need to focus on the TMC and get that resolved first. Jonet Leighton requested clarity on the issues surrounding the TMC as she was not aware of any hold ups on that degree's approval. It was indicated that repeatability continues to be a concern under the new regulations and the courses that have been denied C-id approval need to be revised. Mrs. Lowry indicated that she does not understand why we would have two degrees all of a sudden when we went years without a degree at all. She feels we should finish and receive approval on the TMC first before pursuing approval on this degree. Motion carried without revision but with one abstention.

- ESL 059, ESL Skills Building 5

Scott Jenison informed the committee that a taskforce has been created to review the ESL course structure, which consists of Lucia Pozo, Angela Koritsoglou, Dr. Scott Lee, and Dr. Tom O'Neil. Mr. Jenison indicated that a survey went out to faculty to gather information. He also stated that it is not the intent of the faculty to add prerequisites to the current courses but to streamline the courses to move students through faster by not offering certain courses in the spring semester. The taskforce is also investigating the possibility of developing ESL 101, which will be equivalent to ENGL 101. Mrs. Linda Harmon requested clarification on whether the classes are lecture or lab based to which Mr. Jenison explained the courses. Mr. Jenison stated that we have

30-50% retention in the online courses and the face-to-face courses are about 70% retention. Mrs. Lowry asked Dean Parnell whether she knew our retention rate for all online courses. She responded that AVC online courses currently have a 56% retention rate. Mrs. Linda Harmon requested another update on November 14, 2013.

Mrs. Melissa Jauregui indicated that we were already out of compliance with the request from the Chancellor's Office to submit our report of how our college plans to proceed with the establishment of future requisites. ## Mrs. Linda Harmon reminded the committee again that at this time we cannot develop the TMC in three degree areas: Elementary Teach Education; Film, Television and Electronic Media; and Computer Science. She also indicated that in order to develop the degree in Journalism many courses would need to be developed and approved, however we also do not have a full-time faculty in this area. Ms. Lisa Karlstein offered to work with the Film/Television faculty to develop the degree. She indicated that she would discuss with her dean and the faculty and report back to the committee. Jeffrie Ahmad indicated that the discipline faculty members in Spanish are working to develop the TMC. Mrs. Lowry notified the committee of a discussion she had with the dean for Philosophy. It is her understanding that faculty are working to develop the TMC in this area.
