After discussion it was suggested that the following information be included in the statement: "Students are cautioned that other colleges and universities may restrict the acceptance of courses taken on a Pass/No Pass basis, especially for satisfaction of general education and major requirements. Students planning to transfer should check college catalogs for applicable policies. The Pass/No Pass option is elected by the student per the deadline specified in the class schedule and cannot be reversed. NOTE: Pass notation does not demonstrate competency for proficiency requirements." Mrs. Ahmad will work with her faculty and bring the wording back to the next meeting.`
