A. BACKGROUND

The MOU between the Children's Center of AV (CCAV) and AVC constitutes an agreement to work together toward the mutual goal of providing services to children ages 0-5 and their families through the CCAV School Readiness program that will result in improved health and educational outcomes. The goals of the program are to increase, in children 0-5 years of age, children's good health, safety and survival, economic well-being, social, and emotional well-being, and school readiness by providing a collaborative delivery system to address the needs of children and families residing in zip codes 93535 and 93550.


B. BUDGET IMPLICATIONS

C. RECOMMENDATIONS


The Board approves the MOU with Children's Center of Antelope Valley.

Scope of Work: This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) stands as evidence that Antelope Valley College and The Children's Center of The Antelope Valley intend to work together toward the mutual goal of providing services to children ages 0-5 and their families through the Children's Center of The Antelope Valley School Readiness Collaborative (AVSRC) that will result in improved health and educational outcomes. Both parties believe that implementation of The Children's Center of the Antelope Valley program as described in the program narrative, Logic Model (scope of Work) and budget materials, will further this goal.

I. Purpose

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to maintain the effective working relationship established during the First 5 School Readiness Collaborative for the purpose of implementing the proposed First 5 School Readiness center/program. The goals of the program are to increase, in children 0-5 years of age, children's good health, safety and survival, economic well-being, social and emotional well-being, and school readiness by providing a collaborative delivery system to address the needs of children 0-5 years of age and their families residing in zip codes of 93535 and 93550.

II. Term

This executed Memorandum of Understanding shall begin July 1, 2010 and extend through June 30, 2011.



III. Description of Services

The Children's Center will:

- Support one licensed preschool/school readiness center in Lancaster which serves Lancaster, 93535 and Palmdale, 93550.
- Develop and facilitate parent-child educational activities that support and encourage school readiness in children age 0-5.
- Provide central referral and linkage for families needing school readiness services, including basic health screening and immunization services.
- Coordinate support services provided through collaborative partner agencies for families participating in the AVSRC activities.
- Make workshops and trainings available to appropriate program staff.
- Refer low income families to Head Start from our waiting list.
- Conduct outreach activities to educate parents about resources and school readiness issues.

The Antelope Valley College (Child & Family Services) agrees to participate in the program, if selected for funding, by coordinating/providing the following services:

- Collaborate and cooperate in trainings, referrals and other Early Childhood Education activities.
- Inform the collaborative of upcoming trainings and other early childhood events and opportunities.

IV. Termination

This Memorandum of Understanding shall be effective upon grant award of First 5 LA and upon approval of both parties shown below. Should this Memorandum of Understanding require modification, such changes shall be added by mutual agreement by both parties shown below. This Memorandum of Understanding may be terminated by either party by issuing a Notice of Termination (30 day written notice) which includes reasons for the termination.
