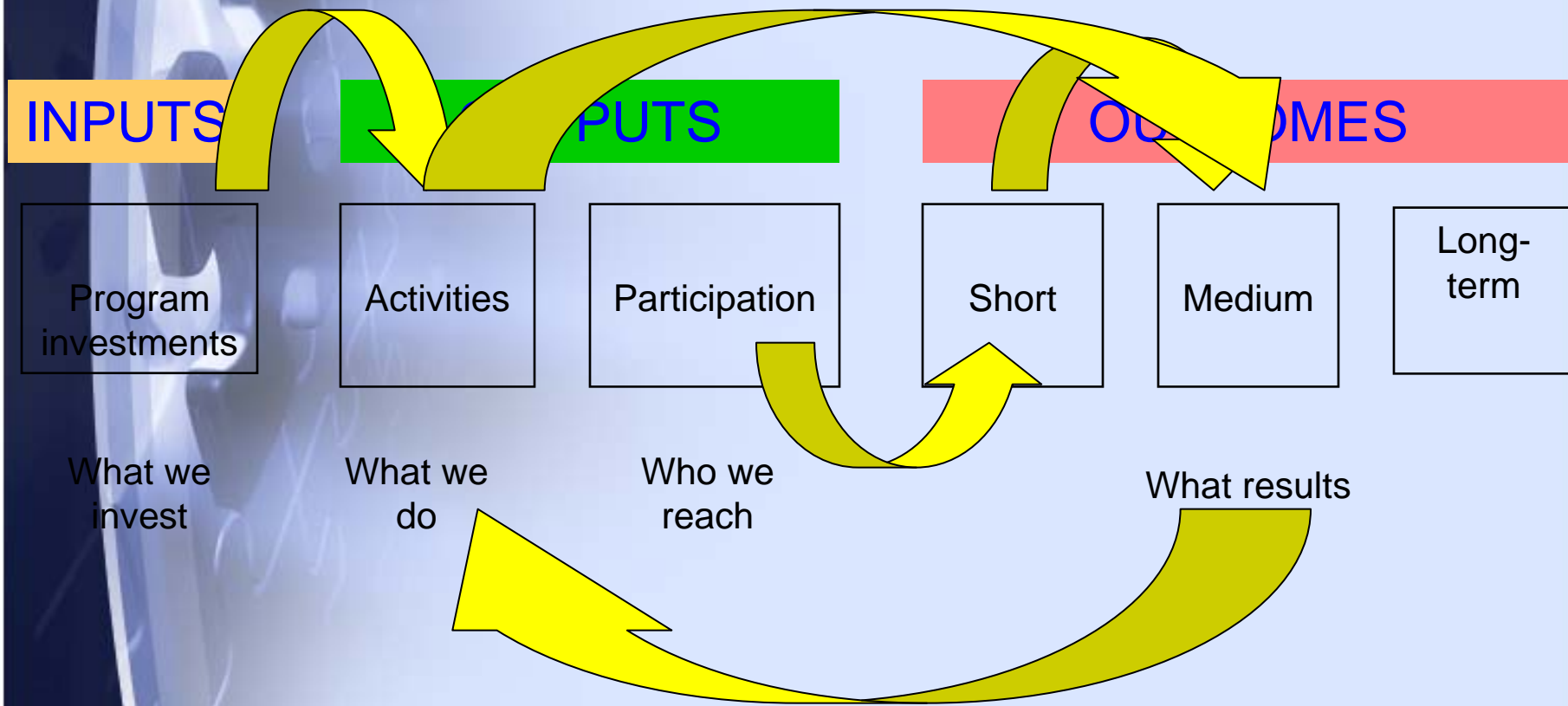

EOPS

EOPS-CARE student persistence rate from Fall 2009 to Spring 2010 reached an all-time high:

- CARE students persisted at a **96.3%** rate
- EOPS students persisted at an **87.7%** rate

Certificates Awarded to EOPS/CARE students - **41**
(34 in 2008-2009)

Degrees Awarded to EOPS/CARE students – **114**
(101 in 2008-2009)

13% of the degrees and certificates awarded by AVC this year were given to students who had been served in the EOPS-CARE program.

In the past two academic years, EOPS-CARE students have received **215 degrees and 75 certificates.**

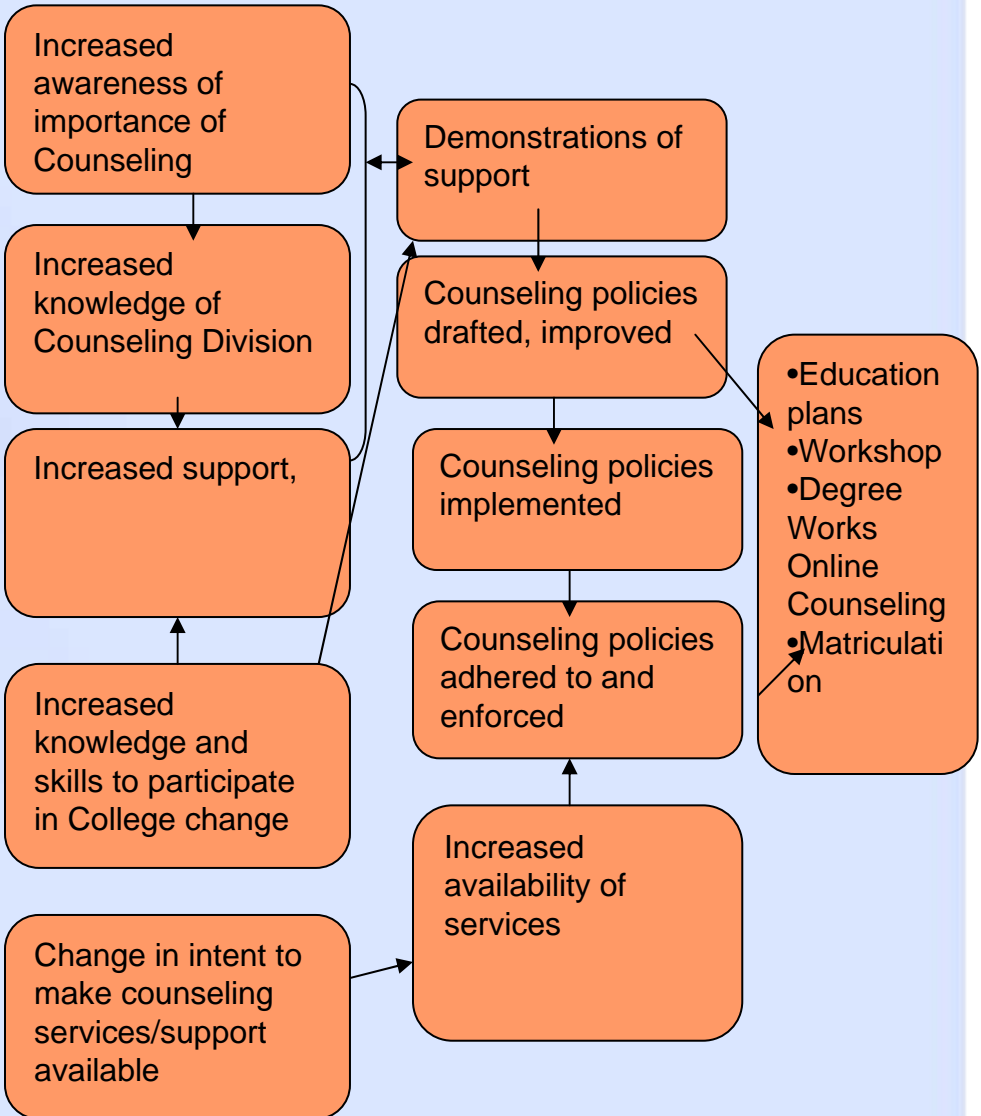

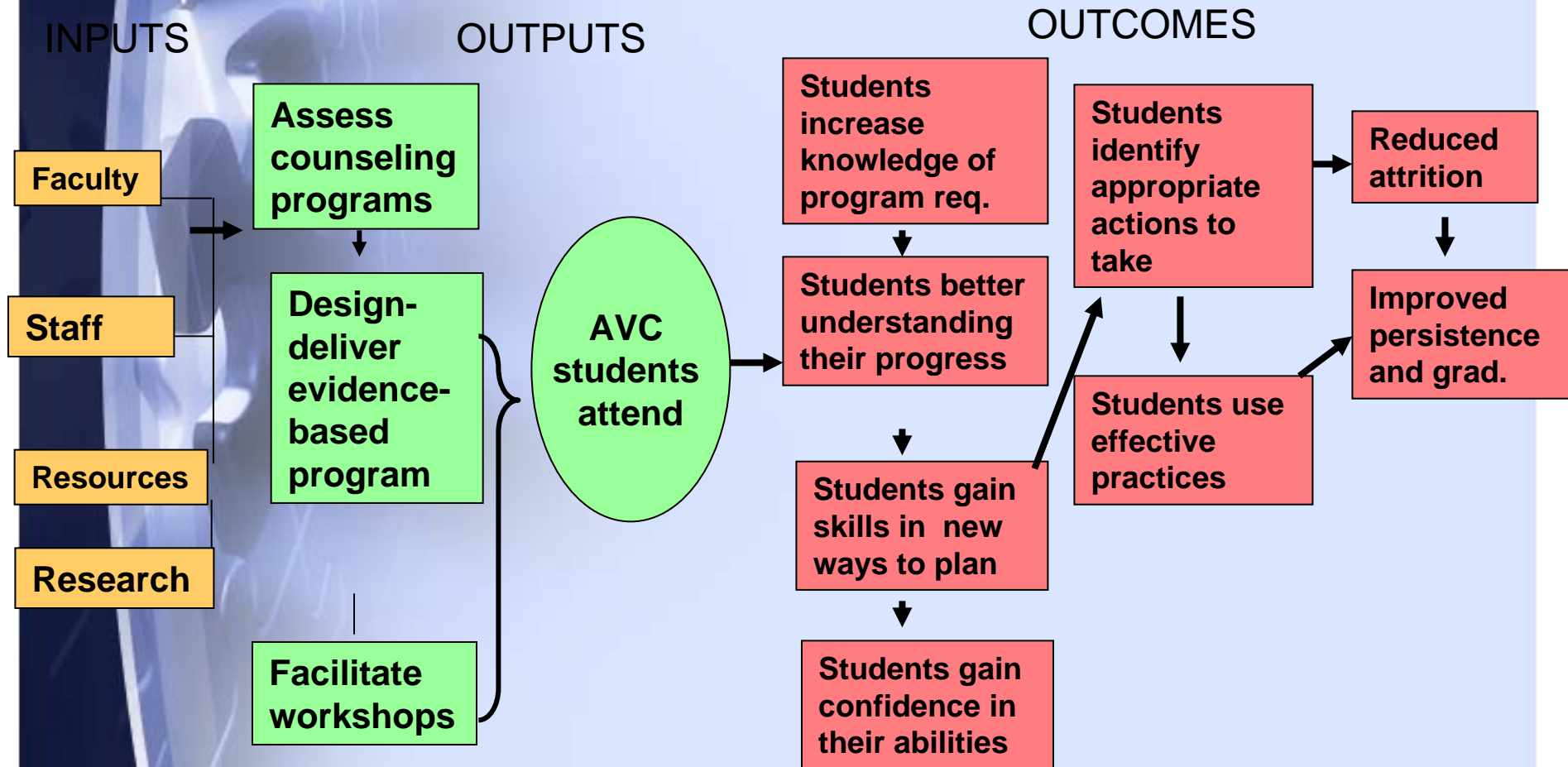




Enhanced Project activities include:

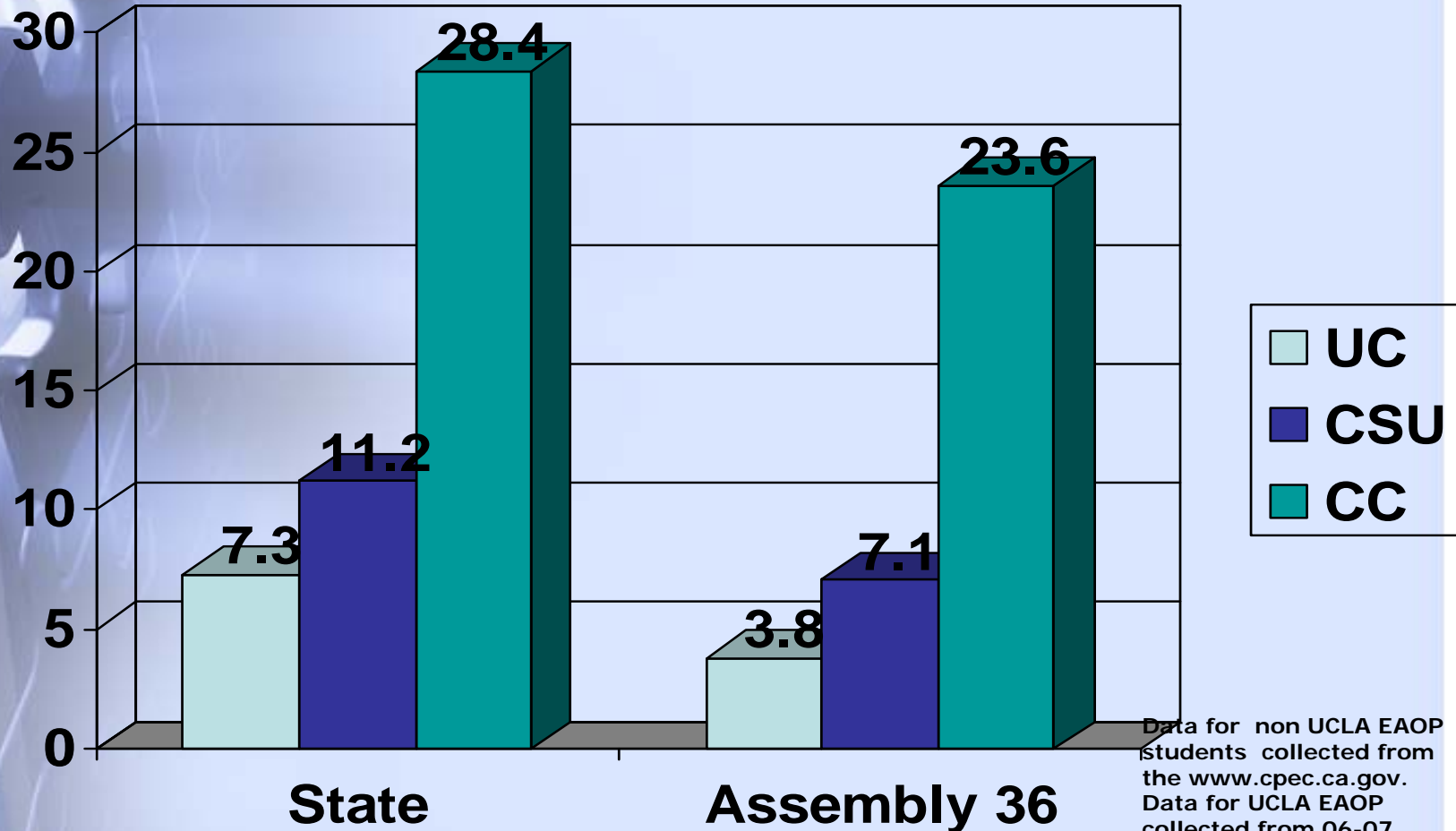

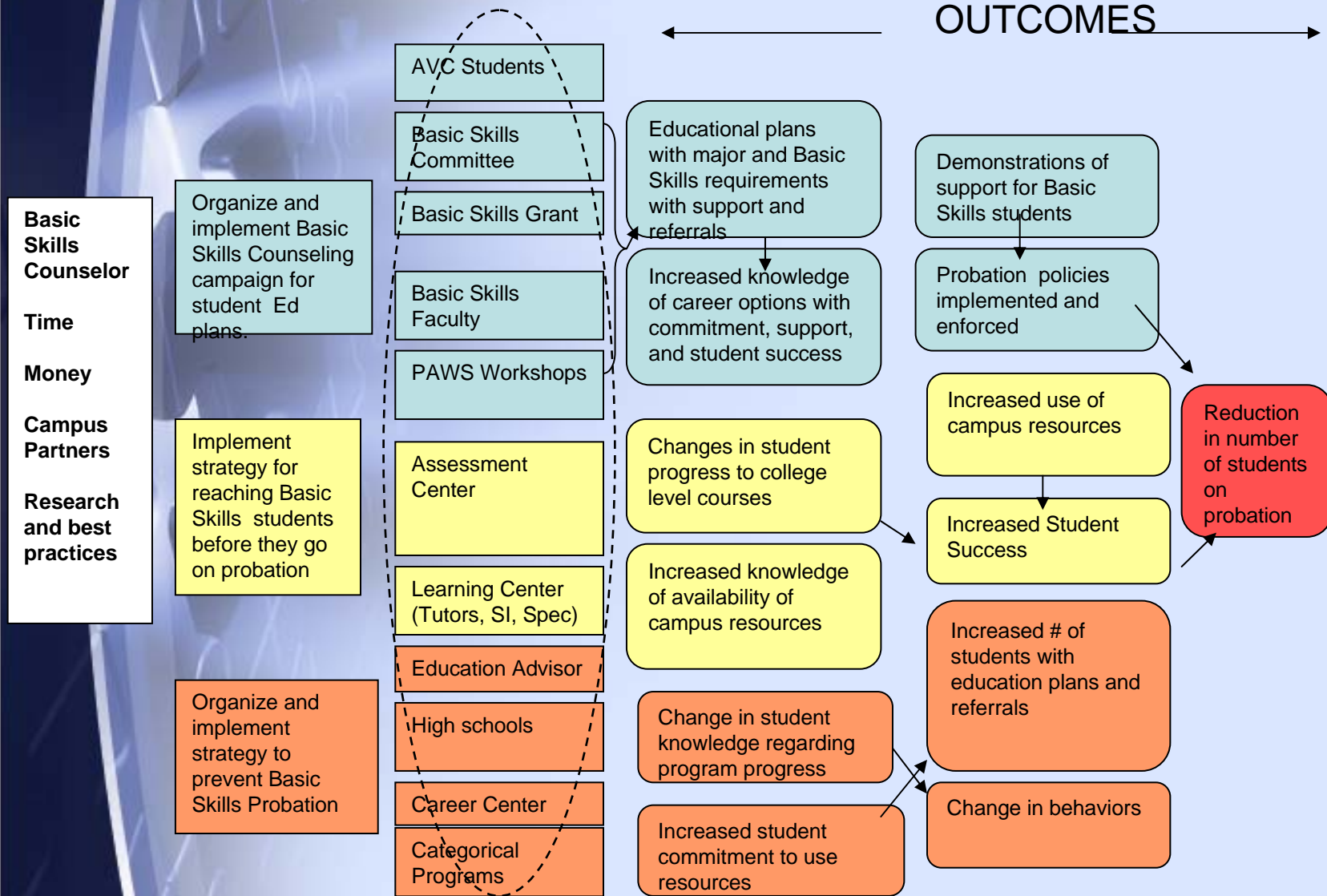
Demographics of the Antelope Valley HS union district
