		Issues Discussed: Cross-Referencing Ethnic Studies Courses For CSU graduates of the 2024-25 academic year, an ethnic studies undergraduate, lower-division course will be required. Dr. Eaton needs to submit courses for CSU approval by February 5th.
		Suggestion is to change the name <i>only</i> , no other change will occur (no TOP, CIP, description, etc.).
		Approval from faculty for English, History, Anthropology, as the pilot to submit to CSU. "ETHN 253EN" sample course number.
		Robust discussion about ADT and previous Ethnic Studies requirements before the ADT. Faculty discussed other courses that may qualify. VP Saber requested information if this will require modification for the existing ADTs. Dr. Eaton indicates that there is an existing requirement for Area F. Dr. Eaton to follow up. **Issues Discussed:** Prison courses are taught as correspondence. There is no clear policy on correspondence education, with the new requirements and proposed regulations. We need a sub committee to review, research, and create policy for correspondence education. **Action Taken: Correspondence Ed Policy** Scott Lee, Ariel Timbabga, Ronda Nogales volunteer. Dr. Eaton wants to attend the meetings and Dean Bormann is happy to assist with updates from the Prison Program. It is agreed that the timeframe will be 1 month to report back to the committee. Double Counting Area F

A question was asked at the last AP&P meeting regarding the Ethnic Studies requirement. Dr. Jessica Eaton checked and reported "that the double counting rule also applies to Area F."

Standardized Placement Language:

Clarification of Language for Shared Courses

In light of the confusion caused by adding an Ethnic Studies prefix to courses that already exist in various disciplines, AVC needs to have clear language for scheduling and counseling purposes.

Kyle's definitions:

- *Cross-listed*: refers to sections sharing enrollment
- Equivalency: one course being equivalent to another, typically in a historical context (e.g., ENGL 100A is equivalent to ENGL 099 which has been deactivated)

General definitions as seen in other colleges:

- Cross-listed: a single course is offered for registration under two or more departments
- *Linked*: courses are linked together and students take both courses at the same time; often linked courses are lecture-labs or credit-noncredit courses that rely on each other for students to receive credit.

eLumen also has a "cross-listing" button for courses.
