1.	Reports from the BS Committee Chairs	S. Lowry H. Williams	Susan Lowry introduced and welcomed Kevin Vasquez Cabrera, Student Representative. Heidi Williams reported that at the next meeting the forms for proposals and writing reports will be reviewed. They will be asking people who have been given money to report back. Notifications will be sent out.
2.	Reports from Associated Committees: • First Year Experience • SSSP • Student Equity	M. Hernandez	Issues Discussed: Michelle Hernandez asked that the minutes from the last meeting be changed. In the Brainstorming session section, the second sentence will be changed to read "Ms. Hernandez noted the need to clarify what we mean/define as 'Bridge' so that we all have the same definition." Michelle reported that there was a Bridge meeting today. They are starting a committee and working on Bridge programming. They will be meeting monthly.

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4. Complete brainstorm and discussion of Summer Bridge activities	H. Williams S. Lowry	Issues Discussed: Heidi Williams used a slide (attached) to go over where we are. There was discussion about assessment and reassessment after Boot Camp. Retesting could be an issue since there is a two assessment limit. They are looking into cohort groups (age, military status, ESL, etc.). Susan presented a possible model for a Basic Skills Boot Camp. She said that 85% of the student population tests into some sort of basic skills. We could give them an opportunity to attend Boot Camp. Those who choose to attend would agree to retest at the end of the session and enroll in that class where they place, and we would hold a space for them. Hopefully some will place into college level, or at least do better in Basic Skills. There could be four 1-1/4 hour sessions in Math, Reading, English, and Avid and Other College-Related Skills. Students would rotate and only take the sessions they need. There was discussion that in many cases one week would not be enough time to bump them up. Jane Bowers said that she needs at least three weeks four hours a day to move them forward in Math. Mary Rose agreed that it would not be enough time for Reading either. Riley Dwyer suggested two versions of Boot Camp to address these two separate needs. This one-week model could be for those on the edge who just need a little bump up, and a four-week full intervention would be needed for the others. There was agreement that the one-week model would work for those on the cusp, but they would have to commit to English, Math and Reading at the beginning. There was discussion about the CTE student needs. Ty Mettler said that the focus for them should be on Math and Reading. They need to be able to read a ruler and tape measure, and read technical data. They will identify areas with achievement gaps to create focus areas for contextualized learning. There was discussion about when the best time would be to hold Boot Camp. It was agreed that it should start right before fall semester, maybe the first week			
		of August. We could also have one in January for			

spring starts. Susan Lowry said that this will be grant



	funded to start, but once it is in place it should move
