

Q1 When do you attend classes?



Q2 Where do you attend the majority of your classes?





Q4 During the current academic year, did you participate in tutoring provided at the Palmdale Center?









Q9 How far do you live from the Palmdale Center?





Study Design

- □ A total of 44 in-depth telephone interviews were conducted by ADR Associates on behalf of AVC during the months of June and July
- □ Interviews were semi-structured, using a discussion outline focused on specific areas of inquiry
 - This open-ended method allows the interviewing professional to focus on *listening* and pursuing new directions the respondents might take as they share their thoughts
 - Interviews typically lasted from 30 to 50 minutes, depending upon how much the research participant had to say
- ☐ For consistency, a small cadre of only three business professionals from ADR Associates were used to conduct the interviews



Sample Design

- □ Sampling to ensure best possible representation in a qualitative study is of extreme importance.
- □ The sampling frame for this research was designed around three key constituencies:
 - Community Leaders
 - Business Leaders
 - Campus Leaders
- □ The Director of Institutional Research and Planning at AVC, Ted Younglove, coordinated input from AVC staff on the sample provided to ADR Associates.

Executive Summary

- When describing the educational needs of the community, participants in this research generally focus on the need for —preparing young people for the workforce
 - Many are concerned with the high drop out rates experienced in community High Schools
 - Young people are not prepared for Community College and need remedial help with basic academic skills
 - Motivating young people is important
 - A key concern is the importance of education and training...of opening up their options
- ☐ With the economy in disarray, educational needs are now expanding to older workers in need of re-training
- All three key constituent groups interviewed agree that Community Colleges are uniquely positioned to meet the needs of both students and local businesses with an education that is accessible, available and affordable

Key Findings



- ☐ Economic pressures hit particularly close to home in the Antelope Valley
 - The area has been hit hard with residential home foreclosures
 - Building and construction industries are down
 - As many as 60,000 community members commute "down the hill" to jobs in Los Angeles county
 - Increased fuel prices are cutting into basic budget needs and requirements
- ☐ The aerospace industry fuels the Valley's economy with continued growth from agriculture and service industries such as healthcare, police and fire
- ☐ The entering skills of the student base for higher education reflect the social pressures of a high growth area
 - High Latino migration to the valley with 60% monolingual Spanish speaking
 - High drop out rate from area High Schools
 - Poor basic skills, social skills, life skills



Issues and Concerns

Community Outlook (continued)

- Business and community leaders agree that the lack of trained, EDUCATED, workers in the Valley is a concern.
 - Workers are not ready for the workplace
 - We constantly hear from employers that job seekers are not job ready because they aren't trained appropriately (skill set) or they lack basic job skills (e.g. arriving to work on time, appropriate dress, etc.).
 - DFinding quality staffing and making sure students are prepared to go to work and be educated. Students need to understand how to communicate and understand how to apply their education in the workforce.
 - □Overall there's a concern that the Valley must increase the skill level of the workforce.
 - □I'm not looking for rocket scientists, just solid workers with common sense and good work ethic. And, these two qualities are not very good with youngsters these days. If I get an AVC grad with an AA that's a bonus, but it's not a "must" for job consideration at one of our stores.
 - □THE big challenge in valley ... looking for workers with skills and a work ethic.

- We need to modify business practices in order to accommodate the new generation that has a different work ethic. We look to the community colleges for help with that transition.
- Job skills, technical training are needed more than 4-yr Degrees
 - ☐ The emphasis is still skewed toward a general college degree vs. job skill "training."
 - America had better think about getting home-grown technical workers rather than importing them from other countries.
 - □ Society and parents need to set more realistic expectations when kids are in high school ... not everyone is suited for 4 yr universities. 4 yr universities send roughly 150,000 students back to community colleges to get job skills each year ... so they can get jobs and pay the bills.
 - Some companies tell us that they actually have too many 4-yr-degree people.
 - Our high tech companies need more vocational-type workers.
 - ☐ The retiring baby boomers are a big problem!
 - We hear from the community that they are really interested in a trained work force. We know that there is a need for very specific skill sets.

Community Outlook (continued)

□ Impact of the economic downturn □

- Our community is suffering an economic downturn. The construction industry is especially suffering. We're a bedroom community and we're somewhat isolated. The impact of the building and construction trades is getting worse and this trickles down to retail and service companies here in the valley. So, competition for jobs is getting more and more severe.
- Another worry is how the current economic slump is negatively impacting banking with radically lower volumes of business loans ... this trickles down into all segments of our business community here in the Antelope Valley.
- Economic challenges here in the valley are amplified as we're somewhat isolated.

Dealing with the economy, trying to keep more people who work here... HERE

- There are a number of economic concerns for us. You can't concentrate on anything without economic stability. There has to be feeling of economic health, otherwise you can't fund anything and everything comes to a halt.
- Prices on everything are going up: shipping, raw materials, etc.
- With businesses going under, we'll need job training and/or courses so that our less educated workers can catching up or start a new career.

Gas prices = high costs

- Gas pricing is a big BIG problem for workers who commute down to below (like Los Angeles).
- Students commuting to campus are severely impacted by this increase in cost...making the idea of a Palmdale campus all the more appealing.

Business, community, economic development needs ...a VISION for the future

- From a top view, we must increase the skill level of the workforce of the community; In general, community colleges backfill career skills, conduct enrichment courses, provide ESL, ensure professional enrichment; teach vocational programs.
- A lot of factors. Economic development: how it's changing and how (recently) it's slowing. Our people need the right outlets to get a higher education; we have too many people who are not well educated -- and they need the OPPORTUNITY. The community college level is easiest to get accepted and the most affordable.
- We're trying to make the city of Palmdale a good place to live--not just a place people desire because of cheap housing. We want businesses to come out here so that people want to live and work in the area.

Community Outlook (continued)

- ☐ Too much crime
 - Public safety would be at top of the list, there has been a lot of focus on crime in Antelope Valley over the last years... increases of crimes, government housing being abused.
- ☐ Shift in Community Demographics
 - There's a population shift with more Hispanics who have moved into the Antelope Valley. Their language and culture are roadblocks sometimes, to better paying jobs.
 - Most of our staff works out in the manufacturing plant. For most of them, English is second language.
 - Low income single parent families have special needs and need the services and financial support of the community.

"So how does AVC fill these gaps? We have to provide the basics of reading, writing, arithmetic so that these young people (and also "out placed employees") are ready to do the job when they're hired."

- ☐ Young people leaving
 - There's a real brain drain here in the valley ... young people leave to go to school and never return.
 - The issue is to not have as many people going to LA for jobs. In LA there are lots more jobs and higher pay scale, but its a lot cheaper to live here, that's why people do so and drive a long way, economy out here is growing but not enough to match the people who live here
- Youth, employees, ill-prepared and struggling with basics
 - Job seekers are not job ready because they lack basic job skills (e.g. arriving to work on time, appropriate dress, etc.).
 - The challenge is to make sure that courses are rigorous and that we have adequate support for students who don't come from high school as prepared as we might like.
 - Employers are concerned that students who enter AVC come here without basic skills (elementary, junior high school, and high schools are letting our society down) ...

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Key Changes Impacting the Community

Community Outlook (continued)

- Population growth is now serving to help attracting businesses and jobs to the Valley
 - The biggest change is growth; our valley's population has doubled since 1991. Rapid growth like that creates real problems infrastructure, adequate education, etc. We need more money to build schools and we need forward thinking to plan and install infrastructure. Education is just one thing that needs focus.
 - The population growth, changing demographics, the economic downturn. The population growth means we have a larger work force.
 - People may start to look here locally rather than drive all the way into LA to look for decent paying jobs. The lower monthly output for gasoline (if a worker stays in the valley) may offset the higher pay rate in LA.
 - Despite the slow economy, some of our valley agencies have been able to attract more businesses to move into the valley. These companies are moving in from "down below" (Lower Los Angeles County) ... I'm seeing businesses moving to where their employees live. I think we'll see more of this as the cost of gasoline soars.
 - We have an economy here that would support outside businesses coming in. For example, land is cheap. We also have an employment base and we need to keep having that, staff needs to be there to fill jobs with new companies coming.

- The big issue is that there needs to be a highly talented and skilled workforce available. If we don't have that than businesses are not going to want to come here.
- □ Employment needs now go beyond the aerospace industry
 - Aerospace is still our main/big player. ..
 But we must respond to the new
 industries that are being recruited into
 the valley by the Economic
 Development people (some are:
 commercial/distribution, light
 manufacturing, DOD related suppliers,
 retail, housing/construction, service
 industries, etc).
 - It's still an aerospace industry based economy here in the valley for the most part. But retail and service industries are growing. And, look at the increased demand for hospital and medical services.

"Cal State Fresno, Cal Poly, and Cal State Bakersfield are supporting our valley's higher education needs with extension courses in various disciplines."

- There's an increased need for more programs and degree options.
- It is vital to our community that youth be employed. Also, it's important to keep people employed within the Antelope Valley

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Key Changes Impacting the Community

Community Outlook (continued)

- □ Skilled, educated, workers are a must
 - Not enough engineers in the valley; medical field needs new people; new teachers in math/science.
 - We're always looking for more skilled workers ... office/admin, welding, grinding, and metal workers.
 - We are seeing an influx of students. They are returning to school to retrain and retool.
- ☐ Job losses put more people into the re-training mode.
 - With layoffs and failing small businesses, we need to offer more courses for retraining.
 - Currently we have the economic downturn. This is impacting workers and a considerable amount of businesses. We are seeing an influx of students. They are returning to school to retrain and retool. Also, there aren't as many jobs available to students graduating from high school. So, more students are opting to go the route of higher education.
 - Lots of people are being laid off, we have people who have college educations and are laid off. That leads to frustration for these people. We try to create a situation that is win-win for college and community in creating new positions.
 - People are struggling. Lots of people are looking for jobs.

- ☐ Changing demographics require attention
 - Our first/biggest change is "changing demographics" Specifically those whose backgrounds categorize them as "English as second language."
 - Too many immigrants are moving in who do not have basic work or language skills. These immigrants seem willing to work but they need to fit into our community faster.
 - Education is not a panacea but it's a start for many of the people who might be defined as disadvantaged. They need for doors to be opened for them. Training/education can do that for them. They need to develop work habits that will give them success in life.
 - There are too many students coming here with gross academic deficiencies,
 - We're forced to expand course offerings for these ESL people.
 - For at least 70% of our first time students we must offer remedial courses for basic math skills, reading, general English.
 - Interestingly the average age of community college students has dropped to approximately 24 years of age (down from 30 a decade or more ago).
 - Too many of our children are going away for their education and not coming back.
 - One really big concern is: "How do we get students who travel out of the area for their 4 yr degree to come back "home?"

 - Educational welcoming center for new residents to our valley; a joint-venture with AVC and community.
 - 5 year outreach plan to forecast educational needs of the community.
 - AVC must hook its wagon to the board of trade and chamber of commerce so that AVC academics can stay a step ahead of changes (example: new aerospace contracts are continuing to come in for some very exciting new products).
 - Need a Dean of workforce development
 - Economic development to insure the needs of employers are matched.
 - Create partnerships with business that emphasize AVC's role in the future of the area.
 - Stay in tune with industry needs, communicate with industry leaders. Start catering the curriculum to needs of business community.

- Provide remedial programs to give students basic skill set needed for college course work.
- Work with HS teachers to provide more innovative instruction and ensure that the state increases its graduation rate with students who have a better grasp of the basics of reading, writing and arithmetic.
- Strengthen basic skills course work to meet the needs of under prepared students (the numbers are staggering).
- In reality, we need faculty who can deal with students coming out of high schools who act like 5th graders.

☐ Preparation for 4yr education

- Offering as many classes as possible to prepare well for the 4 yr university.
- Cost effective solution for transferring later to 4 yr college that allows local kids to stay at home.
- Ability to get general education classes out of the way and give a greater chance of getting into stronger schools like UCLA and USC.
- AVC could be a great launching pad for kids going from community college to 4 yr.

□ Needs of Business Community

- Graduates result in a big economic boost to the community they are in. Aerospace has been the focus in the past with a need for aerospace skills.
- Should have job fairs. Work together with companies in the area. Have an apprentice program.

- The Customer Service Academy is a result of the valley's business community request.
- Be flexible and innovative. Committed to the needs of the community.
- Supplement student deficiencies with remedial course work.

- The best way to LEAD students is to find the best and brightest and have them serve as strong, proactive role models.
- Encourage young people to get a higher education so they can have a better life.
- Start working with youth groups, church groups and high schools ...even junior highs to start planting the seed early that getting an AA education locally is good.
- Focus on the needs of youth in the community. Provide them with the goal of good jobs in the future
- Push kids to dream and have high goals.

Access, availability and affordability of local education

- Make 2 yr education more accessible to the South Valley.
- Need to provide continuing education for high school graduates at the local level.





□ Budget limitations

- I think that the state budget problems have a real negative impact unless AVC leadership can get really creative.
- What about corporate sponsorships? Other forms of cooperative fund raising?
- The state's budget restrictions are handcuffing higher education executives. I believe that the mismanagement in Sacramento is a public humiliation. Why does the state government continue on such a destructive fiscal path?
- ESL is very time consuming & expensive.
- Sometimes we're not fast enough to get some programs going. But some of these issues are beyond our control. Like funding for the Palmdale campus.
- Technical courses are more expensive than liberal arts.
- I know it's hard as a result of funding cutbacks, but AVC must really try and raise public awareness
- The Foundation will be key to raising extra \$\$'s for the Palmdale campus.

☐ Health center

We need to have a health center. Right now we have a free clinic once a week. However, we need to serve the needs of our students with health related issues. It would make sense if that was done through our health sciences.

☐ Need more awareness

- Conduct public relations about the success of AVC's grads at 4yr institutions
- How we can create a conduit for student "voice" throughout the community about what we do and how we do it
- How do you build community awareness about what's happening on campus
- There's also been too much rumor and misinformation about the Palmdale campus. □ Better counseling /retention

- AVC's educational counseling was way under par. AVC provided such poor counseling that after 2 years, she still didn't have enough credits to get her AA.
- My impression is its not a very high transfer rate
- Students need better exposure to all their options
- We don't have enough counseling available
- 4-year colleges don't accept so many of the credits from AVC
- The biggest thing that comes to mind is in the area of retention. We do good job on getting people in the door, but we don't retain them, because of a lack of appropriate counseling.
- There is not enough access to counseling
- Long standing issue: I don't sense that a lot of teachers are plugging students into a support system like the support center, if they pass or fail that's their problem, we are losing a lot of students
- AVC can support at-risk kids and foster youth--and that's our future.
- We don't have sense of why people are leaving after they've registered
- With retention, must be a little more customer-focused
- I think AVC needs to enlist more homegrown people into leadership and staff positions. The college needs people who are very familiar with the community.

□ Need better technology

- We need better technology resources
- Get better marks for online education
- It's only been recently that the "smart classroom" has been developed
- We have problems getting technology "things" fixed when they break.
- We need more quality IT personnel

☐ More effective Foundation

The Foundation could work more effectively with the community (the movers and shakers in our valley have not been endeared to the college). We could fill so many fiscal and community needs through more cooperative efforts by The Foundation (ie: raise funds for AVC's institutional advancement, and fund raising for scholarships & campus projects); I really think that The Foundation will be key to raising extra \$\$'s for the Palmdale campus.

☐ More staff


- We are limited by the number of staff available at this time.

Points of Differentiation

☐ Great Academics / great value

- I wouldn't go to any other community college
- I've talked to a few people that have attended Los Angeles Valley College. They left LAVC and switched to AVC and they have gone on and on about how great AVC is compared to LAVC. They are extremely happy at AVC.
- They (AVC) do a great job in comparison to what I've heard about other 2 year colleges.
- The cost is much lower and the opportunities extended to students is just wonderful.
- AVC vocational students are passing their certifications and licensing examinations
- The breadth of courses offered and disciplines is so much greater [than private JC's] due to the size of the student body and the state funding they do receive.
- AVC is head and shoulders above Cerro Cosa, Victor Valley
- AVC students maintain high GPA's when they transfer
- AVC has more transferable classes to 4 yr universities
- By my observation, AVC is doing a great job
- I think we do a fine job in comparison to others

Serving community & local businesses

- AVC's placement center not only offer services to the students but also coordinates with the community. That extra step is important in order to truly meet the needs of our community.
- AVC has active partnerships with Antelope Valley organizations
- AVC offers the students and the community assistance that many other schools don't
- AVC vocational students are passing their certifications & licensing examinations

Personalized instruction

- AVC has services for special needs students
- There is more connection with teachers, they help you, they are compassionate
- AVC's student to faculty ratio is around 30-1. Not bad if you compare that to 4 yr university student/teacher ratios!

□ Similar courses & degrees

- AVC has a similar reputation & problems
- I know College of the Canyons really well.
 I'd say they're about the same. Cerro Cosa is similar
- They are similar in classes and degrees offered
- On par, I think that there are many other community colleges that do good jobs too

□ Good transfer rate

- If you want to measure college you would use transfer rate as one measure
- Everyone at AVC with 3.5 GPA or greater, who applied to UCLA, with got in!
- High percentage of acceptance rates to UC schools (schools with high reputation)
- 4 yr universities will accept lots of AVC courses

☐ Great leadership

- I could give a AVC a 2.5 (on a scale of 3 as best) because of Jackie's leadership
- There's a saying: "those who accomplish their own goals are successful" ... so that's what I focus on here -- what our goals are (vs. competing against the reputation, perceptions, objectives of other community colleges). Each community is very different and that impacts what that community college must accomplish. I think it's difficult to compare apples and oranges.

- AVC has a large pool of adjunct professors

☐ The Same or Worse...

- College of Canyons does better job overall
- College of the Canyons is better funded and more effective due to the scope of their resources. They're good at securing their foundation, in marketing & public relations.
- We certainly can't rival Cerro Cosa's online program, but we are aware of the online possibilities.
- I don't think that other community colleges have had as much political "stuff" as us. They have a more stable environment to work in than we do.

- The new campus will be a welcome addition; I think it will create a major boom in the immediate area. It will help real estate here and it will help student employment.
- Finally! We don't want to depend on Lancaster ... everything seems to be up there ... not here in Palmdale,
- It will be closer for people that live in Palmdale and it will offer more options to those living in the area.
- We so need that presence in the Palmdale area. People are very excited about it.
- It meets community needs in Palmdale and puts us in a position to continue moving forward to meet the specific needs of Palmdale.
- Just having the campus there is a big plus...and it's been a long road getting here. I just think the idea of them finally getting a piece of land and getting the gears in motion is going to be a great boom to the Antelope Valley.
- Palmdale is growing.. In the end we'll need more higher learning capacity as this community grows.
- I think it only makes the valley itself more interesting. It's going to stimulate the area by bringing a lot of vitality, more visibility and hopefully have more indepth programs.

Cuts commute for Palmdale based students

- For people who live in south or east end of the Valley it would cut their drive in half.
- It'll make community college course work available to people who wouldn't drive the 15 miles or so up to Lancaster.
- Beneficial in reducing commute (and cost of commute) for Palmdale area students.
- The new campus will be accessible to a whole new set of students who may not be making the ~15 miles away drive up here to Lancaster ... and think about students in the more remote parts of the valley.
- Less travel for students in the southeast part of the valley. <u>Convenience will be</u> key to class attendance and graduation rates.

Makes college education more accessible, more convenient, to Palmdale students

- It puts the college into view; people who might not have gone to college before might now because of convenience.
- We have additional academic needs. Palmdale is growing... we'll need more capacity as this community grows.
- There are a lot of very poor students in the Palmdale area. For many of them, this is the only way for them to access a college campus.

- ☐ More focused on Palmdale needs
 - This will really work for students in outlying areas.
 - Palmdale will solve some population growth pains; the valley's biggest population growth has been in Palmdale.
 - Antelope Valley is so large, so widespread that for people that live in south or east end it would cut their drive in half.

"When it was built, AVC was at the center of the community. That's no longer the case... Palmdale went from 50,000 people to 140,000 people in 5 years."

- We've needed to serve the south valley for a long time.
- For students who live in the southeastern part of the valley ... it's a longer drive to Lancaster than Palmdale.
- Palmdale is a tough town to get around in. You can't throw a rock without hitting school in LA, but here there is not much schools and so on, students have a hard time getting to places so its good that they are doing that.
- I live in east Palmdale for example and to west Lancaster where the college is it takes me about 30 minutes.
- Finally! Palmdale will solve some population growth pains. The valley's biggest population growth has been in Palmdale. The Palmdale campus will serve their community culture (its similar to Lancaster ... but just a little different).

- Meet needs of a diverse population (ethnicity, lower incomes)
 - This will really work for students in outlying areas, especially many of them who are members of low income families; let's give exposure to academics for this population segment.
 - AVC/P will serve all age levels.. I see a lot of people with BS's going back for specific training and enrichment education. I see people going to college to backfill skill sets. I see lots of non-college age students on campus.
 - They will need to have a big bilingual department. There is an over the top number (49% according to the census) of Spanish-speaking families. It's like a third world country in East Palmdale.
- Focus in Palmdale needs to be different than AVC with separate programs and identity
 - We need to showcase programs that would differentiate the campus from Lancaster.
 - We have a need for "our own" in Palmdale. Palmdale needs its own identity -- it shouldn't be known as a satellite campus for Lancaster,
 - Make it totally separate from the Lancaster campus ... let it stand alone. Work on offerings that complement what's offered at Lancaster.





Expectations of Palmdale

- ☐ Research participants see Palmdale as a separate entity from the Lancaster campus:
 - Different brand identity
 - Different name (not AVC-Palmdale)
 - A focus on vocational, certification programs oriented toward jobs available in the Antelope Valley
 - A full-time Dean
- Master plan that looks ahead at needs of community
 - We must make sure that we plan out what we'll take onto this campus -- that's first.
 - Our community MUST be involved with shaping the college and the curricula content.
 - We need to clearly identify what's needed to deliver the education that students need and our business community requires.
 - We need to build a stronger bridge between AVC and the valley's existing AND growing business base.
 - The plan needs to assess the needs of the community on a regular basis.
- □ State of the art physical plant
 - There should be everything that we have in Lancaster AT LEAST.
 - Good security, good parking, good cafeteria, bookstores.
 - Smart classrooms, the newest technologies available.

Expectations of Palmdale (cont.)

☐ Supplement, not duplicate Lancaster

- We need to have the same quality as Lancaster -- but with a different campus "personality."
- Providing the classes the area needs. They might offer a bit different stuff there in relation to community needs.
- Palmdale will supplement the existing facilities in Lancaster. There is no way they're going to duplicate Lancaster in general, in athletic fields and so on Lancaster is still going to have all the big stuff.
- For the students, the Palmdale campus must have the same "feeling" as going to the original Lancaster campus. Make sure that the Palmdale campus isn't a third-cousin to the Lancaster campus. Palmdale must have a full menu of classes.

Palmdale needs to be a fully functional campus, NOT an annex to those people up in Lancaster

- That this campus continues same academic excellence and offerings as at Lancaster.
- The academics should be the same as with institution in Lancaster.
- It's going to have to be responsive to the needs of Palmdale instead of making it a mini AVC.

☐ Split the 2 campuses so each has a specialty (vocational, technical, certificate training programs vs 4- yr feeder program)

I think it'd be nice for Palmdale if they had more of a trade focus where people could get a certificate in a trade. That'd be a nice opportunity, and aerospace focus would be nice too, like introduction on nano technology...

I know the intent is to make the college more available to people, but I think the Palmdale campus should be known as one campus specializing in something and the Lancaster campus as something else.

With the distances between the two campuses, one should be a full college prep campus and the other be a technical institute to support the aerospace-type industries.

☐ Expanded curriculum available to E Valley, Palmdale residents

- They should serve the needs, providing as many diverse classes as they can.
- Palmdale needs to be a full community college definitely not "College-Light"
- Same services as up there... can take a class at the other campus and graduate sooner.
- We need to be able to expand at the rate of the people and our community. We can't stop growth.

 - If Palmdale can create and teach more entrepreneurial classes and practical finance courses and investing - all that can make them unique.
 - and ... overall we all want a better educated community.

- More basics to fill in what student's aren't getting in HS
 - We'll need to be strong with ESL.
 - We would like to see more integration with high schools.
 - Can we conduct more cooperative programs with high schools?
 - More of the "basics" (reading, writing, arithmetic) courses ... Their focus must be a follow-on from "what kids don't get" in high school.
- General Ed, Core courses needed for transferring to 4 yr colleges
 - We want to have core delivery of courses, we want to satisfy all traditional classes so we can transfer to 4yr college.
 - They should especially concentrate on the main classes, the ones that are transferable that students need to get to 4yr college.
 - I'm personally hoping that Palmdale will provide more basic skills coursework; Palmdale will also have a general education focus.
 - Could they eventually be a 4 yr institution?

 - Lower incomes, cultural diversity, lack of positive leadership contribute to an extremely low High School graduation rate
 - While the community tries to draw new businesses, a skilled employee base is hard to guarantee

Further, based on our examination, for items not tested, nothing came to our attention to indicate that Antelope Valley Community College District had not complied with the state laws and regulations.

Other Matters

Antelope Valley Community College District's response to the noncompliance finding identified in our audit is described in the accompanying Schedule of Audit Findings and Questioned Costs. Antelope Valley Community College District's response was not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the response.

Diana Keelen, Executive Director of Business Services introduced David Casnocha, of Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth, who reviewed the legal definition of what a Lease Revenue Bond is and that it essentially is a debt structure that utilizes collateral to a financing authority. In this case, the financing authority is the Community College League of California. The board asked if the the Lease Revenue Bond receives a better rate than a Certificate of Participation and Mr. Casnocha confirmed that it does. Frank Vega, with RBC Capital Markets, added that the benefit of a lease revenue bond is that it gives priority investing to the local community. The lowest level increment is \$5,000. The term of the bonds would be no longer than the terms of the Palmdale Facility lease, which is 20 years. He stated that the bonds would be at a guaranteed rate of return within a specified time period and the majority of the bonds would taxable in nature, meaning they would not create a tax shield to the investor.
