Part B - Completion

- 1. Proportionality Index Interpretation
 - 1.0 = Proportions of subgroups are equal
 - Less than 1.0 = Subgroup is less prevalent in the outcome group
 - More than 1.0 = Subgroup is more prevalent in the outcome group
- 80 Percent Rule Interpretation The 80 Percent Index is calculated by dividing the "completion" rate of a non-reference subgroup into the transfer rate of the reference subgroup. A result of less than 80% is considered evidence of a disproportionate impact.
- 3. Non-distance Education
 - a. by Age Several age brackets having difficulty in retention
 - b. by Race African-Americans are over the 80% for retention but still failing (71%)
 - c. by Gender All good in degree applicable; no discrepancies
- 4. Transferable Courses
 - a. by Age All okay except Distance Ed Success Rates. They are all low across every age group (.57 .69)
 - b. by Race African-Americans success rate is 71.2%
 - c. by Gender All okay
- 5. Vocational/Technical Courses
 - a. by Age 18-19 year olds at .667 success rate and 35-39 are at .754
 - b. by Race African-American .787 on non-distance success and .487 on the 80% rule.
 - c. by Gender Online Courses females fall to .548 success rate
- 6. All Credit Courses
 - a. by Age with the exception of the 1-17 year-olds, none of the groups are succeeding in distance ed.
 - b. by Race African-Americans are not succeeding in either online (.52) or non-distance education (.69). Watch the trend in numbers of Pacific Islanders.
 - c. by Gender -
