Subject: Mathematics Proficiency for AVC Graduation

Mathematics Department is proposing that the following change to be made to the catalog requirements for the mathematics proficiency for AVC graduation. The current 2011-2012 catalog requirements reads:

Completion of MATH 102 or higher or CIS 121 with a minimum grade of "C".

Change the requirements to:

Completion of MATH 102 or higher or CIS 121 with a satisfactory grade or placement by assessment into a math course higher than MATH 102.
