- <u>**Reading**</u>: Eligibility for College Level Reading (AVC Assessment) or completion of READ 099 with a minimum grade of "P" (Pass), or completion of an Associate Degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution of higher education other than AVC.
- <u>Mathematics</u>: Completion of MATH 102 or higher or CIS 121 with a satisfactory grade or placement by assessment into a math course higher than MATH 102.
- <u>Writing</u>: Completion of ENGL 101 with a minimum grade of "C." NOTE: Completion of ENGL 101 with a "P" (Pass) option does not satisfy this requirement.

Mrs. Sharon Lowry stated that at the last AP&P meeting she indicated the assessment test cannot fulfill the requirement of meeting proficiency for mathematics. After a discussion with Ms. LaDonna Trimble, she would like to correct her comment because in fact the assessment test is an acceptable means for establishing proficiency per Title 5 55063. She reminded the committee member that this item needs to be discussed at the division level and comments need to be collected by the AP&P Representatives. The AP&P Representatives will be asked to report on this item at the November 9, 2012 meeting. Discussion occurred regarding a "P" or Pass notation to which Dr. Grishman stated that he needs to do more research to determine if this notation would be acceptable for transferring students.

h. Course to meet both the major and general education requirements for local degrees

Mr. Aeron Zentner was present to give information regarding the current course validation study process. He explained that 4 measures are used to validate a course as a requisite and analyzes 6 year worth of student data, which are Chi-Square, Fisher Exact, Right/Wrong, and Percent Increase. He explained that a student's level of success in a class is determined by the grade received and our college has determined that a student has been successful in a class if they receive a grade of P, C, B, and A. Dr. DeNean Coleman-Carew asked if we course use another form of measurement to establish students success in a class. Dr. Richard Coffman asked if the 6 year period includes the current year. Mr. Zentner stated that he uses 6 years of date up to the most recently completed term. Dean LaDonna Trimble stated that new courses are allowed to hold their prerequisite for a period of 3 years at which time a course validation study is automatically completed to determine the level of student success in the course. Mrs. Lowry stated that to avoid the course validation process, faculty are allowed to provide documentation for a like course from three 4-year California colleges that have the requested prerequisite and we will thus implement locally. Dr. Richard Coffman asked why our college cannot establish ENGL 101 as a prerequisite for all our courses if the UC's have already done so. Mrs. Lowry and Mrs. Harmon indicated that the faculty would just need to provide the required documentation and ENGL 101 will be added to each requested course.
