 - Mr. Miller explained that Chinese 201 and 202 are no longer on the books, but he was asked to recreate them so they can be offered when funding improves. He is asking for the class size to be reduced from 35 to 30. The committee felt that class size for second level foreign languages should be consistent. A motion was made and seconded to approve CHIN 201 and 202 with a maximum class size of 35. Motion carried.
- e. ENGR 120, Introduction to 2-D CAD
 - Dr. Richard Colgren reported that he had removed the pre-requisite and also changed the title. A motion was made and seconded to approve ENGR 120. Motion carried.
- f. ENGR 185, Digital Logic and Design
 - Dr. Colgren reported that he had changed the units on this class. A motion was made and seconded to approve ENGR 185. Motion carried.
- g. KIN 230, Intercollegiate Women's Soccer Cindy Littlefield reported that there was a change in terminology and also updated the textbook. She explained that this is an intercollegiate course and there is no homework. A motion was made and seconded to approve KIN 230. Motion carried.

LAC 100, Introduction to Tutoring Diane Flores-Kagan explained that a note was added that if the student completes the course with an A or B, has a 3.0 GPA, and accumulates 25 hours of supervised tutoring experience, they may be certified through the professional tutoring association. Ms. Flores-Kagan explained that, although this is an online course, all presentations and role plays will take place in a face-to-face setting. A motion was made and seconded to approve LAC 100 hybrid. Motion carried.

j. LAC 200, Advanced Tutoring

Ms. Flores-Kagan explained that a note was added that if the student completes the course with an A or B, has a 3.0 GPA, and accumulates 25 hours of supervised tutoring experience, they may be certified through the professional tutoring association. A motion was made and seconded to approve LAC 200. Motion carried.

k. MUSC 225, Commercial Music Ensemble

Dr. Berkeley Price reported that this course was converted to a lab to maintain repeatability. A motion was made and seconded to approve MUSC 225. Motion carried.

1. THA 120A, Rehearsal and Performance: Drama

Eugenie Trow and Jonet Leighton reported that the class maximum has been increased from 25 to 50 to accommodate the size of the cast. A motion was made and seconded to approve THA 120A. Motion carried.

m. THA 120B, Rehearsal and Performance: Comedy

Ms. Trow and Leighton reported that the hours and units had been adjusted to maintain repeatability. A motion was made and seconded to approve THA 120B. Motion carried.

n. THA 120C, Rehearsal and Performance: Musical Theatre

Mr. Hoffer noted that the course could be offered as a basic skills course instead of a transfer course, and he asked for comments from the committee regarding that. He is also considering offering it as a pass/no pass. A motion was made to approve ENGL 100 as a transferrable level course as either pass/no pass or for credit. Motion seconded and carried.

4 hours lec/lab weekly, 3 units

Eugenie Trow and Jonet Leighton reported that the repeatability had been removed and that these courses were not part of the TMC but were part of the local degree. Mrs. Lowry expressed concern that these classes were not directly transferrable when the Chancellor's Office has stated that our top priority should be transferrable courses. A motion was made and seconded to approve THA 130, THA 215, THA 218 and THA 220. Motion carried.

Mrs. Lowry stated that it would be helpful to have a list of some of the colleges who offer these courses. Dr. Harris will bring HD 102 back to the committee in the spring.

Mrs. Sharon Lowry stated that at the last AP&P meeting she indicated the assessment test cannot fulfill the requirement of meeting proficiency for mathematics. After a discussion with Ms. LaDonna Trimble, she would like to correct her comment because in fact the assessment test is an acceptable means for establishing proficiency per Title 5 55063. She reminded the committee member that this item needs to be discussed at the division level and comments need to be collected by the AP&P Representatives. Discussion occurred regarding a "P" or Pass notation to which Dr. Grishman stated that he needs to do more research to determine if this notation would be acceptable for transferring students.

b. Current Course Validation Study Process with Research - Aeron Zentner

Mr. Aeron Zentner was present to give information regarding the current course validation study process. He explained that 4 measures are used to validate a course as a requisite and analyzes 6 year worth of student data, which are Chi-Square, Fisher Exact, Right/Wrong, and Percent Increase. He explained that a student's level of success in a class is determined by the grade received and our college has determined that a student has been successful in a class if they receive a grade of P, C, B, and A. Dr. DeNean Coleman-Carew asked if we course use another form of measurement to establish students success in a class. Dr. Richard Coffman asked if the 6 year period includes the current year. Mr. Zentner stated that he uses 6 years of date up to the most recently completed term. Dean LaDonna Trimble stated that new courses are allowed to hold their prerequisite for a period of 3 years at which time a course validation study is automatically completed to determine the level of student success in the course. Mrs. Lowry stated that to avoid the course validation process, faculty are allowed to provide documentation for a like course from three 4-year California colleges that have the requested prerequisite and we will thus implement locally. Dr. Richard Coffman asked why our college cannot establish ENGL 101 as a prerequisite for all our courses if the UC's have already done so. Mrs. Lowry and Mrs. Harmon indicated that the faculty would just need to provide the required documentation and ENGL 101 will be added to each requested course.
