I. Meeting Minutes	All	<u>Issues Discussed:</u>			
		 3:03 pm – meeting was called to order by Perry. 			
		 II. Agenda approval – unanimous 			
		 III. 4/18 is the deadline for the Online Teaching 			
		Conference (OTC) in Anaheim. Perry highly			
		recommends going, he's gotten a lot of great			
		information from it in the past. He's trying to get more			
		people across campus involved in OEI. Faculty may not			
		know, but they can get hired by other colleges to teach			
		some online classes.			
		 IV. Dr. Beyer submitted an OEI course and he's waiting 			
		for the results. He has a conference call next week to			
		discuss the class, and he'll share the results with this			
		committee. He hopes he's pretty close to completion.			
		He's also considering using what he learns from this and			
		incorporating it into his workshops.			
		 V. Minutes approved from last meeting – unanimous. 			
		VI A. Perry showed some statistics from the success			
		rates of DE classes. There is steady improvement over			
		the years and our DE classes are at or above the state			
		average. He believes that the move from Blackboard to			
		Canvas has helped that as well as increased participation			
		and use on campus. Dr. O'Neil asked if a Canvas class			
		could be added in order to help students learn how to			
		fully utilize all of the tools. Rather than a class, could			
		this be added onto the items FYE covers with students?			
		Greg from ITS confirmed that it's not possible to have			
		common shells with open enter/exits. A zero unit class			
		can't be made a pre-requisite for online classes. There			
		are lots of variables as to why students are not as			
		successful in online classes. There are 3 types of online			
		classes, but the online schedule is not very informative			
		to our students. Is there a way to add more info or			
		different categories onto the schedule to help students			
		understand what the class will entail? Faculty needs to			



	on our website. There are no official procedures for this, and there needs to be adequate follow-up. There may need to be an email sent to faculty before the start of each semester asking them to send their DE class info to Stephen in ITS. Is there a way to put the type of class in the CRN info online? Remember that 50% of normal class load must be taught on campus, but that is being negotiated. • VI B. Mentorship hours – One-on-one mentoring would be easier, since each person is at different levels. Different classes need different approaches, and each teacher has different questions and needs. Would it be better to have fewer hours or make it by appointment only? 3 hours can seem too long at times, and only a couple faculty come in at a time. Another concern is lack of workshop space. Many of the computer labs in the BE building are filled with classes. • VII. Rubric Panel Letter approved – unanimous. • VIII. At the next meeting: OEI Course Rubric by Dr. Beyer – only one page long with 4 sections. Would it be helpful to have one workshop per section? It has been done that way at past conventions. Sitting through all 4 sections at once could be a very long course. This could be used in the future to help certify faculty as online







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To all Faculty,

Antelope Valley College is one of the pilot colleges in the Online Education Initiative (OEI) and is committed to participating in the OEI exchange through the submission of eligible online courses. In support of that commitment, the Distance Education and Technology Committee (DETC) is proposing a recommendation to the Academic Senate that will establish a design review process for courses being submitted to the OEI exchange, and for faculty electing to have their course design evaluated, whether that course be an online or campus course.

Members of the DETC believe that the design review process will support an enriched learning environment for our students, and provide support to faculty in the development of a quality Canvas environment, for both on-campus and online courses.

The process for submitting a course to the OEI exchange includes the application of a course design rubric, which was developed and is used by the OEI, for courses taught through the OEI exchange. The course design rubric is divided into the following four sections:

- 1. Content Presentation
- 2. Interaction
- Assessment
- 4. Accessibility

The DETC is seeking members to be part of a team that will utilize the rubric to review Canvas course designs for courses submitted to the review process. If you possess distance education experience and/or expertise in one the four sections noted above, and wish to contribute to the development of a quality Canvas environment for students at AVC, the DETC is looking for you.

Interested faculty members should submit a letter of interest to Perry Jehlicka, the DETC cochair, addressing their distance education experience and/or expertise in one the four sections as noted. Selected faculty members will be eligible to receive up to 20 hours Standard 1 flex credit for their participation; but more importantly, you will be joining a team committed to the development of a quality learning environment for our students. This position does not qualify as required committee work.
