The SLO Committee will determine a campus-wide process for the uniform implementation and assessment of Student Learning Outcomes at the course, program, and department level. A Faculty Co-chair and the Dean of Institutional Effectiveness, Research, and Planning are responsible for chairing the committee and overseeing that the functions of the SLO Committee are met.

- Provide support and data in program review
