I.	Opening comments from the Co-chair	Dr. Scott Lee	The meeting was called to order at 3:02 p.m. Dr. Lee will continue to send reminders out to the committee for workflows at Stage 4 - Tech Review. He reminded everyone to promptly review their inbox and approve/send back as appropriate to move the workflows forward for the agenda.
			Howard Davis recognized the work of the Tech Review Committee. They had their first meeting last week. Having the Tech Review team meet together to look at the curriculum is a more effective, robust review. He thanked everyone for their work.
			In accordance with the Brown Act, Dr. Lee opened the meeting up for comments:
			Dr. Eaton shared the <i>Assist.org</i> website and showed courses that were approved and denied transferability. Those denied will receive an email from Dr. Eaton. She and Darcy Weiwall will be happy to meet with faculty to improve the application process for the honors program and are willing to resubmit them.



			Those denied approval cannot be submitted this December. At this point, there is no possibility for IGETC in the GE Path for 2023. Any updates will go through the cycle. They will need to be re-submitted by the final date, which is by the last AP&P meeting in the Spring. Honors content was not delineated as required for approval. In order to avoid confusing students, the courses that were denied will not be added to the catalog. However, the Honors TAP Certified Program, which is recognized by UCLA, will continue as status quo. LaDonna Trimble asked if credit will apply for students taking honors classes that don't want to go through TAP if they are submitted by May? Dr. Eaton responded that right now, the denied courses do not have approval to count for honors credit and will not have it by May 2023. Dr. Lee recommended that faculty reach out to Dr. Eaton with questions.

	Goals: Work Experience LaDonna Trimble commented that they are in the process right now of building a program to support employment for students with occupational work experience. Students need to be employed in that field of study or major. There will be more to come from the academic side of the house regarding this topic.
	Sam Darby commented that we need to work on how to set up the courses. She suggested having one course for work experience and to set the standard for all disciplines.
	Dr. Eaton said that when work experience comes to transfer (and it says in the catalog that it is transferable, but it's not in Assist.org), how will it be transcripted? AD-Ts don't require work experience units, so it seems best to keep it as an in-house AVC only course.
	A workgroup was formed to address these issues, which will include Dr. Eaton, Kathryn Mitchell, LaDonna Trimble, Travis Lee, and Nate Dillon.
	ADT Guide This guide was completed by Sam Darby. She will distribute it to the departments for review and is asking for feedback. Follow up Item: This will be an action item at the 10/13 meeting.
	SLO approval: Requirement for all courses and labs to have SLOs. Dr. Lee shared a statement sent by the Outcomes Committee. He requested that the committee share the recommendation and get feedback to see if it should become an official rule. Follow up item: This will be an action item at the next meeting on 10/13/22.

Associate Degree for Transfer Guide

Step 1:

Faculty need to visit the Chancellor's Office <u>site</u> for any updated Transfer Model Curriculum Templates (TMC).

Step 2:

Complete the TMC, review accuracy with a Counselor.

Step 3:

Submit eLumen workflow to include the required language per the PCAH (below), and to match the courses precisely the TMC.

All courses must have an articulation agreement (CI-D, Assist documentation, etc.)

The Recommended Plan of Study cannot exceed 60 units.

Step 4:

Request for approval submitted to the AP&P, Senate, and Board. After Board approval, all the documentation is submitted to the Chancellor's office for approval. The review window is approximately 60+ days. Final approval does not occur until the Chancellor's office approves.

Required Template:	
The Associate in	degree meets the requirements of SB 1440 for
Associate Degrees for Transfer	(ADT). These degrees are intended to make it easier for
students to transfer to California	a State University campuses but do not exclude admittance to
other colleges or universities.	
To earn an Associate in	degree a student must complete the following:
(1) Completion of 60 semester	units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the
California State University, inclu	iding both of the following:
(A) The Intersegmental	GE Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State
University GE-Breadth F	Requirements (CSU GE-Breadth).
(B) A minimum of 18 ser	mester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of
emphasis, as determine	d by the community college district.

(2) Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.

ADTs include both Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) and Associate in Science for Transfer



(AS-T) degrees. The law authorizing these degrees also requires that students must earn a "C" or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis. A "P" (Pass) grade is also an acceptable grade for courses in the major if the course is taken on a Pass/No Pass basis.

Chancellor's Office Program and Course Approval Handbook (PCAH)

Criteria for Approval

ADTs must meet the following criteria for approval:

- Submission includes all required documentation:
 - Program Narrative,
 - Completed Chancellor's Office Template,
 - o C-ID or ASSIST Articulation Information, as required by the TMC, and
 - o COR for all courses included in major or area of emphasis.
- Degree meets all standards as listed above. Verification of meeting these standards is conducted through review of required documentation.
- Degree is submitted with program goal of "Transfer."

Program Narrative

Only the Program Goals and Objectives and Catalog Description items are required for the Narrative. The catalog description must reflect the following:

- Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of degree-applicable courses,
- Minimum overall grade point average of 2.0,
- Minimum grade of "C" (or "P") for each course in the major, and
- Completion of IGETC and/or CSU GE-Breadth.

Submission of a COR is required for each course specified in the major. All ADT degrees are submitted with "Transfer" as the program goal.
