ABOUT THIS MAJOR

The Child and Family Education curriculum is designed to meet the needs of students who wish

to qualify for work with groups of young children under private or public settings. The certificate program is designed to enable students to gain employment at the entry-level in selected occupational areas. Completion of certificate qualifies students for the California Child Development Permit. Students must receive a minimum grade of "C" or better in all required core courses and the specific courses listed as program electives in order to qualify for the degree or certificate. COUNSELING NOTE SECTION
