Introduction:

The position is a full-time tenure track teaching assignment in the Department of Mathematics in the Division of Mathematics, Sciences and Engineering. This department offers instruction for transfer in Mathematics and basic skills and transfer level collegiate mathematics courses required by students in other transfer and certificate programs. Instructors are able to teach across a broad curriculum.

Master's in Engineering, Physics, or Computer Science with at least 18 semester units of graduate level coursework equivalent to Mathematical Analysis (Real, Complex, or Numerical), Differential Equations (Ordinary or Partial) and Linear Algebra.

Desirable Qualifications:

- Competency to teach mathematics courses from basic skills arithmetic through differential equations, linear algebra, and calculus III.
- Knowledge of and ability to introduce innovative methods and strategies, including computer technology, to instruction in mathematics.
- Previous teaching experience at a community college or university level including graduate teaching assistantships.
- Evidence of and commitment to working as part of a team in departmental, divisional and campus wide activities.
- Sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, cultural, disability, and ethnic backgrounds od community college students.

Duties:

- In addition to teaching 15 lecture hour equivalents per semester, full-time faculty are responsible for five office hours per week and preparation time, and are expected to participate in faculty/division meetings.
- Full-time faculty also participate in curricular planning; student learning outcomes, program learning outcomes, development, assessment, and implementation; evaluation of educational programs; and college governance contributory to the attainment of the college's mission and strategic goals.
- Instructors may be assigned a combination of daytime, evening, and/or Saturday classes, as the college is dedicated to the
 educational success of a diverse student body with diverse needs.
- Continued professional development in Mathematics AND through the Faculty Professional Development Program or other sources or discipline related sources is expected.
