ABOUT THIS MAJOR

Medical assistants are multiskilled health professionals (trained in cognitive, psychomotor and affective domains) specifically educated to work in ambulatory settings performing administrative and

clinical duties. The practice of medical assisting directly influences the public's health and well-being, and requires mastery of a complex body of knowledge and specialized skills requiring both formal education and practical experience that serve as standards for entry into the profession. The medical assistant program prepares people to work under the direction of physicians, registered nurses, and podiatrists in medical offices and clinics. The Certificate will allow the holder to sit for credentialing examinations.
