Uniforms are an approximate cost. Cost includes two T-shirts, two collared shirts, 1 sweater. Does not include boots, pants, belt.

Background check and Immunization tracker will be performed through Complio. Clinical sites dictate immunizations required. Noncompliance may mean potential dismissal from program. Vaccines are considered valid if within 10 years, titers within 5 years. Immunizations required include MMR, Varicella, Tuberculosis (negative PPD and/or negative Chest Xray), Hepatitis B, Tdap, seasonal influenza shot, Covid-19.

CPR Certificate must remain current throughout all phases of the paramedic program. AVC provides certification in-house to meet this requirement. Parking pass and student health fees are set through AVC as well.

Testing software as well as clinical/field internship tracker will be completed through Platinum Education Testing and Platinum Planner as well. This software costs approximately \$200 and is subject to change.

Field internship fees are set through the field provider. Student pay the fee directly to the provider during this phase of paramedic training. If a student has a sponsorship through an approved agency, they must provide proof in writing prior to the first class session. If Antelope Valley College does not have an active affilation agreement with the field provider, then there is a possibility the student may not intern with the provider.
