Fall 2022 Program Review Report

Part 1. Program Overview: Briefly describe how the program contributes to the district mission

The Palmdale Center is committed to AVC's overarching mission of serving a diverse population of learners and offering quality and comprehensive education to students. The south Antelope Valley location is also committed to student success by offering value and opportunity, in service to our community. The Palmdale Center truly caters to the demographics of the area from our Aerospace programs to assisting with low-income and diverse cultures. We were able to tap into one of our largest demographics, which is the ESL community, thus increasing ESL enrollment and the potential to increase course offerings.

The Palmdale Technology Annex, opening its doors in spring of 2021, is the main location of AVC's AFAB (Aircraft Fabrication and Assembly) program. In addition to our programs, the Palmdale Center can provide a variety of student services such as library, tutoring, Counseling, OSD, financial aid, CalWORKs, and Mental Health services, as well as offering Cashier's office and a bookstore on-site to help cater to the needs of our Palmdale student population. The location of the Palmdale Center itself and the growing number of class offerings is allowing students the opportunity to get more of what they need at AVC's Palmdale location without having to travel to the main campus.

Strengths and Accomplishments: (Guiding Question: What does your program/area do well, including capabilities and greatest accomplishments?)

The Palmdale Center has been highly successful in the first 5 years at its new location with the ability to meet more of the AVC student services needs in the south Antelope Valley area, as well as increase enrollment each year. In addition, the AVTA bus service links the Palmdale Center with the main campus, providing "doorto-door" express service in less than an hour travel time. The bus route also services the SOAR (Students on Academic Rise)-South Valley students, which is our newest location in the city of Palmdale, opening in Fall of 2022. This program is a joint project of the Antelope Valley Union High School District and the Antelope Valley College mirroring AVC's SOAR High School located on AVC's main campus in Lancaster, California.

Also, in collaboration with the Dean of Social & Behavioral Sciences, the Palmdale Center Director, Administrative Coordinator, and dedicated Counselor help with the Inmate Education Program, known as the Rising Scholars Program. The program is located within the California State Prison, Los Angeles County in Lancaster, California. The AVC Rising Scholars program beginning in 2016 continues its class offering to over 200 incarcerated students. The program graduated seventeen students in Spring of 2022. We have also generated more faculty interest in the program, as we currently offer the Communications Studies Associate of Arts for Transfer (AAT) degree option for the students participating in the Rising Scholars Program.

The EMT (Emergency Medical Technology) program has expanded, and currently has a dedicated classroom space at the Palmdale Center to include a mock emergency room to enhance scenario training within the program. The program located at the Palmdale Center currently has 40 students enrolled and is projected to continue to have steady enrollment.

Opportunities and Challenges: (Guiding Question: What does your program/area need to do better to support/improve student success?)

The opportunity to fully utilize the classroom space at the Palmdale Center and the Palmdale Technology Annex currently exist. We currently have eighteen classrooms, which includes 3 computer labs at the Palmdale Center. We are currently only utilizing 2 classrooms at the Palmdale Technology Annex, which is currently still being outfitted to accommodate a maker's space and additional classrooms.

There is always an opportunity for more communication between the Palmdale Center staff and the various departments located at the main campus. There has been some communicative disconnect regarding student support services and programs at the Palmdale Center. There is the challenge of better coordination and notifying students of activities, services, and workshops available to them at the main campus. For example, representatives from different departments are expected to keep office hours at Palmdale, but when there is a no show the Palmdale Center staff are not notified, which can create a hardship for students. As staff from both the Palmdale and Lancaster Campus get to a better partnership and rapport, this will be beneficial in assuring that services and events are communicated and collaborated between both locations to ensure we offer the best services and opportunities to our students.

In offering the best services and opportunities to our student there is the need for more tutoring services at the Palmdale Center. The Palmdale Center Tutoring & Learning Center has little to no staff, and a lack of tutoring services. This space is underutilized and services to this area could be enhanced, as this currently poses a threat to student success and retention to offer little to no on-site learning assistance to students.

In addition, there is a moderate demand for evening courses and hours of service. The Bookstore, Library, and Learning Center could be tailored to meet the needs of the students who take classes at the Palmdale Center, especially in the evenings.

Aspirations: (Guiding Questions: What does your program/area want to be known for? What is a desired future?)

The goal of the Palmdale Center is to be known for being an integral part of the community. With new branding and the dedication of staff and faculty we would like to continue to make the location a positive environment for our college community. The Palmdale Center held its first annual Summer Block Party in June of 2022 in partnership with community resources located in the area. This event was an excellent opportunity for vendors of the Antelope Valley, especially those located in the city of Palmdale to highlight their services and latest offers and build a relationship with Antelope Valley College- Palmdale Center. As we aspire to inform the community of our services and course offerings in rebranding the Palmdale Center from being known as a "technical college center", to building a bridge with the community and our main campus to highlight that students can take most course offerings at the Palmdale Center to assist them with obtaining a desired degree or certificate.

Palmdale Center staff will remain flexible to adjust and/or expand operational hours for student services as need dictates our past outcomes analysis (Action Plans) and progress towards those goals.

Part 2D: Review and comment on progress towards past program review goals:





Ed Goals (% | *N*) (If *N* of students > 10)




