Part 1. Program Overview: <i>Briefly describe how the program contributes to the district mission</i>	
<p>The Antelope Valley College Palmdale Center (consisting of the administration and classroom buildings, the Palmdale Technical Center -AVC Makerspace, Soar Annex, and CTE classrooms/labs) are committed to fulfilling AVC’s mission to “provide a quality comprehensive education to a diverse population of learners” to “transforms lives” by providing access to 104 in person sections in Fall 2024 with an expected 79 sections in Spring 2025. The center’s location in the south Antelope Valley offers access, instruction, and services to its diverse student population of over 12,023 (81% identified as a student of color). Many of whom are from underserved populations, low income/wage earners as evidenced by the 52% Pell Recipient rate. Additionally, the center saw an increase of 19% in its in-person student headcount from the previous AY.</p> <p>The Palmdale Center offers access to Student and Academic Support Services including counseling, OSD, Library, and Learning Center. Looking forward into the 2025-2026 AY, the Palmdale Center will continue its development of Palmdale GE and Transfer Degree Pathways, noncredit programs (including the existing ESL courses), Contract Education (workforce training programs), and the Makerspace at the Palmdale Technical Center.</p>

<p>The Palmdale Center offers access to Student and Academic Support Services including access to counseling, student IDs, nursing badges, test proctoring, Admissions and Records support, OSD, Library, and Learning Center. The Palmdale Center continues to support CTE certificates, GE and transfer programs, highlighted by its support of the SOAR South, Aircraft Fabrication and Assembly, and Industrial Manufacturing Technology Apprenticeship program.</p>

A closer look at the Fall 2023 success rate for specific groups of students enrolled in sections at the Palmdale Center highlight the need to work with the academic departments and the available student and academic support services to improve success rates for the following groups: Black/African American (57%), Native American/Alaskan Native (55%), Pacific Islander (67%). Hispanic/LatinX continue to hold at 70% across the past three reported periods.

To better aid student success in the areas of career development and college preparedness, the Office of Workforce Development collaborated with the divisions within Academic Affairs to improve and increase the number of noncredit programs and courses as illustrated:

Additionally, the Palmdale Center's front desk provided point of contact information and coordination for student services support. For the 2023-2024 AY, the AVC Palmdale Center staff (classified and student employees) has provided service to thousands of students in the following areas:

One of the crowning, annual events, the AVC Palmdale Summer Block Party supported 270 attendees and 190volunteers and vendor participants. This event is focused on making connections with our community neighbors, like Olive Support Services, the City of Palmdale, and the Hispanic Chamber, while providing outreach to promote AVC’s programs and commitment to student success in the Antelope Valley.

<p>During the 2023-2024 AY, the Palmdale Center has provided access to instruction and student services to over 12,000 AVC students. The Palmdale Center continues to support CTE certificates, GE and transfer programs, highlighted by its support of the SOAR South, Aircraft Fabrication and Assembly, and Industrial Manufacturing Technology Apprenticeship program. The Palmdale Center offers access to Student and Academic Support Services including counseling, OSD, Library, and Learning Center. The Palmdale Center celebrated the following accomplishments:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Careers for a Cause (C4C): C4C was an eight-week pilot program that focused on career exploration and assessment, job shadowing, skills training, on-the-job coaching and job retention support. In addition, students received wrap-around support services and a stipend from LA County. The C4C program seeks to connect participants to campus resources that heighten students’ chance for completion and occupational success in the Social Services profession through the guidance of Amity Foundation. This certificate serves as pre-employment training for rewarding careers in the homeless services sector. There was a total of 24 graduates who completed the program with a certificate in Computer and Workplace Fundamentals from AVC. • Palmdale Technical Center development: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ SOAR Annex: In collaboration with the Antelope Valley Unified High School District and SOAR Palmdale, the AVC Palmdale Center opened the SOAR Annex, five classrooms in the west wing of the center. Serving 125 students, the space supports the high school math and science departments. This ongoing partnership will improve student access to and success in college level courses. ○ AVC Palmdale Center Makerspace: Opened on Monday, September 23, 2024. The Makerspace at AVC Palmdale Center offers a space where students, staff, industry professionals, and entrepreneurs can develop skills, create prototypes, and have access to advanced software, milling machines, 3D printers, and integrated manufacturing tools. • Extended Learning (Contract Education) Program Development: AVC's Extended Learning offers a wide range of online career & professional development programs for jobseekers, workforce training seminars for businesses and employers to Upskill their teams, and noncredit programs and courses for the lifelong learners and preparation for future educational opportunities. The department worked with a consultant to conduct a regional needs assessment with workforce development agencies, job boards, and educational partners to identify prioritized training and develop trainings in Essential Soft Skills,

Logistics (Warehouse, Transportation, and Distribution), and Food Services and Safety Certification. Initial clients included AV Fair Association, Lancaster Street Company, Project Joy, Olive Support Services, and Westside School District.

- **Annual Block Party:** One of the crowning, annual events, the AVC Palmdale Summer Block Party nearly doubled from over 200 attendees in its inaugural year to 490 attendees and 178 volunteers and vendor participants. This event is focused on making connections with our community neighbors, like Olive Support Services, the City of Palmdale, and the Hispanic Chamber, while providing outreach to promote AVC’s programs and commitment to student success in the Antelope Valley.
- **Avanti Market:** Due to the loss of the Barnes and Nobles Bookstore outlet, AVC explored additional food and beverage options to the existing vending options. The AVC Palmdale Center is piloting a micro-market, the Avanti Market. The self-service micro market is a self-serve kiosk that allows customers to purchase food and beverages without going through a traditional checkout line.

To improve student success and address equity gaps identified, the Palmdale Center staff will:

1. Evaluate the instructional, student and academic support service spaces/schedules to maximize available classroom, lab, and additional spaces.
2. Improve access, communication, promotion, and coordination of Academic Support Services.
3. Work with divisional deans to clarify Palmdale GE and Transfer Pathways to improve access, enrollment, and retention at the Palmdale Center.
4. Facilitate the continual development of Career Development and College Preparedness Noncredit and Adult Education programs with the Academic Affair division.
5. Develop and improve Contract Education Workforce Development Training including department infrastructure.
6. Plan and host outreach events with community partners to promote AVC programs and strengthen relationships.
7. Evaluate and create an appropriate center infrastructure to successfully execute and support AVC Palmdale initiatives.
8. Conduct a Palmdale Center Student Survey to measure operational outcomes and student expectations and needs.

Due to staff shortages and coverage issues at the main campus, the Palmdale Center often finds itself relying on remote student services. This is an obstacle for AVC students who have elected to use the center as their primary access point to the college services and processes. The center will work with the respective departments to better provide equitable access to support services such as Financial Aid, Office for Students with Disabilities and CalWORKs, and projected growth of Palmdale Learning Center.

Moving into the 2025-2026 AY, the Palmdale Center will continue its advancement of Palmdale GE and Transfer Degree Pathways, noncredit programs, Contract Education (workforce training programs), and the Makerspace/Innovation Hub at the Palmdale Technology Annex. Additionally, the center will support the expansion of the following programs: Aerospace Welding, Electrical Technology, and Medical Assistants.

At its inception, the Palmdale Center was intended to provide clear GE and transfer pathways to the AVC demographic in the south Antelope Valley. Importantly, the Palmdale Center will work to establish its identity as a primary provider of equitable education, workforce development training, and services to the immediate surrounding communities.
