

# **Antelope Valley College**

Community College Pathway to Law School

The California Community Colleges and the State Bar of California selected Antelope Valley College to participate in a new initiative that will provide a smoother pathway to six of California's top law schools.

The Community Colleges Pathway to Law School Initiative (CCPLSI) is an unprecedented effort within public higher education to enhance opportunities and advancement in the legal profession for diverse populations, particularly those who have been underrepresented.

The project, sponsored by the State Bar's Council on Access and Fairness (COAF), established agreements with twenty-four community colleges and six law schools and their respective undergraduate institutions. Students in the program will receive assurances that credits in prescribed courses will transfer. Students should plan on transferring to a four-year institution prior to applying to law school. An AVC designated counselor will work with scholars to develop an educational plan for short-term and long-term goals.

Participating law schools are: University of Southern California Gould School of Law, University of San Francisco School of Law, UC Davis School of Law, UC Irvine School of Law, Santa Clara University School of Law and Loyola Marymount Law School.

The Community Colleges Pathway to Law School Initiative requires students to complete seven courses based on a defined set of "success factors" that help make effective lawyers. The transfer initiative will align criteria from these success factors with community college courses already approved in corresponding Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) to prepare students for transfer, and eventually for law school.

## **Student Requirements**

- Attend CCPLSI Orientation
- Statement of Interest
- Work with designated CCPLSI Counselor to develop educational plan(s)
- Required Law Scholar Courses: (additional courses needed to satisfy IGETC requirements)
  - a. POLS101
  - b. POLS 203
  - c. ENGL 101
  - d. ENGL 102, 103, PHIL 201
  - e. COMM 115
  - f. MATH 115
  - g. HIST 107 OR HIST 108

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- h. HD 101 (If assessed below ENGL 101)
- Admitted students are expected to participate in all CCPLSI program activities, be active in the Law Club, and seek service learning opportunities.
