

NURSING TRANSFER PLAN



To Azusa Pacific University from Antelope Valley College

This transfer plan is to be used as a guide for <u>traditional undergraduate</u> students wishing to transfer to Azusa Pacific University as a Bachelor of Science in Nursing major. Completion is <u>not</u> required for admission to APU. This is not a tool to aid students in knowing which courses APU will accept to fulfill General Studies and Nursing degree requirements. It is the student's responsibility to see that all of the requirements are met upon completing their degree at APU.

IGETC/CSU GE

APU accepts the completed IGETC or CSU GE as fulfilling the lower division APU General Studies program requirements. However, the student will need complete these provisions as part and/or in addition to their completed IGETC or CSU/GE.

- Students will need to meet the foreign language requirement of 2 semesters of the same language at the college level
- Students will need to meet the Health Education and Fitness for Life requirements
- Students will need to complete a math course from the Mathematics department with at least a prerequisite of Intermediate Algebra.

All APU students will be required to complete the requisite number of biblical studies and upper division elective courses. In the cases of both the CSU GE and IGETC, the certificate must be complete, and the certificate must be obtained from the respective community college before the student matriculates to APU. Students who do not receive certification of completion will be evaluated by standard course-to-course articulation and will follow the APU General Studies program.

Admission to the BSN Nursing Programs

Admission to the university does not guarantee admission into the School of Nursing. Students may declare their desire to be admitted into a BSN Program when applying to the university on their application. Once accepted to the university, these students will be recognized as "pre-nursing" majors and are eligible to apply to the School of Nursing for admission into a BSN Program.

Transfer applicants must meet the following admission requirements:

1. Submit an application to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions with copies of all high school and college transcripts.

2. Submit letters of recommendation as required by the university and School of Nursing.

3. Submit to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions a one-page statement of professional goals in nursing and a list of work experience within the past two years.

4. Submit a report of a physical examination including TB test, Hepatitis B, MMR, Varicella, and DT immunizations prior to enrollment in clinical nursing courses. (Physical exam forms are provided by the School of Nursing.)

5. Meet all applicable prerequisite courses with a grade of *C* or better including the following:

a. One year of high school chemistry (or CHEM 101 Introduction to Chemistry)

b. One year of high school biology (or BIOL 101 Fundamentals of Biology)

c. Two years of high school math (algebra or geometry). A math placement test is required unless it is waived by an SAT 1 math score of 540+ or ACT math score of 23+. The College Algebra course requirement is waived by a SAT 1 math score of 600+ or an ACT math score of 26+, but does not grant credit for the course.

d. Students with a verbal SAT 1 score below 580 must take a writing placement test in English during registration. SAT 1 verbal score does not waive Freshman Writing Seminar requirement. An AP English score of 3 or better waives the Freshman Writing Seminar course.

6. Achieve a minimum cumulative college or university grade-point average of 3.00.

7. Submit proof of current CPR with AED certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support (BCLS for Health Care Providers) for adults and children.

8. If a student is accepted to APU but not accepted into a nursing program including UNRS 105 or UNRS 270, he/she must reapply to the School of Nursing by submitting a School of Nursing Intent to Reapply form. Deadlines to re-apply are September 30 for possible spring admission and January 31 for possible fall admission.

9. Transfer students with nursing credit must meet the requirements for applicants above, plus:

a. Submit a letter of recommendation/academic standing from the dean/director of the previous school of nursing.

b. Submit course syllabi and catalog descriptions for all courses for which nursing transfer credit is requested.

10. Transfer applicants who have completed college nursing courses in nationally accredited nursing or other health care programs are evaluated individually and given credit for courses that meet the requirements. Up to 70 units of community college credit and additional units from a university (per registrar's approval) may be transferred. When sufficient documentation is not available, some nursing courses may be challenged by the applicant. Students with transferable nursing courses must take UNRS 270 Theories and Concepts in Professional Nursing prior to any other nursing course at APU except UNRS 220 Health Assessment, which may be taken concurrently.

APU transfer reminders:

- The university can give credit for no more than 70 units of junior or two-year college work, and there is a maximum of 90 units that may be accepted from a four-year institution.
- No course from a two year or junior college can transfer to meet an APU upper division requirement.
- Any course may still be transferable for non-general studies elective units *if* designated as CSU/UC transferable in the course catalog.
- Only courses where a grade of C- or above has been earned can be considered for transfer credit.
- A minimum grade-point average of 2.2 (academic GPA) for all college work completed is required for admission to APU.
- There is no minimum unit requirement for admission to APU.
