PAINTER Salary Range 18

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under the direction of the Maintenance Supervisor, performs a variety of skilled duties involved in the preparation and painting of District buildings and facilities to maintain proper appearance and protection from rust and decay; paint parking lot lines, directional markings, informational markings, handicapped parking zones and curbs. Performs other related duties as may be assigned.

REPRESENTATIVE DUTIES: E = indicates essential duties of the position

- Paints parking lot lines, directional makings, information markings, handicapped parking zones and curbs; measures and assures proper spacing; paints signs and use stencils as needed. (E)
- Remove old paint, graffiti, and other finishes by chipping, burning, scaling, scraping, sanding, dissolving, water blasting, or sand blasting. (E)
- Prepares surfaces for painting by dusting, wire brushing, washing, and patching holes, dents, and cracks. (E)
- Performs painting work in conformance with building health and safety standards. (E)
- Protects surfaces from spattered or sprayed paint. (E)
- Adjusts and maintains airless spray equipment; cleans brushes and other painting equipment. (E)
- Applies vinyl lettering, warning stripes, and slip resistant materials.
- Erects, rigs, move and maintain scaffolding, platforms, boom lifts, scissor lifts, forklifts, extension ladders, sandblasting equipment, and compressed air paint machines. (E)
- Applies a variety of primers, paints, and other material by brush, roller, or airless spray equipment to such surfaces and wood, metal, fiber, plaster, wallboard, brick, cement, canvas and wall covering; Mixes and applies protective coatings such as epoxy and fiberglass. (E)
- Hangs, tapes, textures, and finishes dry wall.
- Mixes, blends, and apply paints to match, blend, harmonize, and contrast specified shellac, enamel, lacquer and other protective and decorative finishes to a variety of surfaces such as wood, plaster, stucco, wallboard, brick, and cement; mixes and applies protective coatings such as epoxy and fiberglass; tests paints and makes recommendations accordingly. (E)
- Moves furniture, cabinets and other furnishings as necessary to perform required duties.
- Hangs, sizes, cuts, and applies wall covering to a variety of surfaces.
- Applies roof coating and sealers. (E)
- Maintains records and supplies and orders paint and other supplies as necessary.
- Obtains information pertaining to new materials, methods, and equipment used in the painting trade.
- Inspects the work of private contractors to insure conformance to painting specifications.
- Directs a diversified painting program frequently involving several crews of painters, helpers and laborers. (E)
- Inspects buildings and other structures to determine painting needs and develops scheduling for completion; also estimates costs of materials, supplies, and labor before proceeding with projects. (E)
- Installs directional signs and marquis on campus parking lot poles, posts, or other surfaces.
- Installs flooring (vinyl composition tile, glues carpets down, coving; frames new wall using light and heavy gauge steel studs for drywall applications periodically as required.
- Performs other related duties as may be assigned.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE: Any combination equivalent to: graduation from high school supplemented by completion of a designated painting apprenticeship program and three years journey-level painting experience.

KNOWLEDGE OF:

Methods, procedures, equipment and tools of the painting trade.

Tools and equipment used in painting.

Care and maintenance of tools and equipment.

Methods of preparing various surfaces for painting, repainting, finishing or refinishing.

Safety precautions in handling and storing of painting materials.

Safety regulations pertaining to erecting and working on ladders, rigging and scaffolding.

Methods of preparing a variety of surfaces for painting and finish work.

Technical aspects of field of specialty.

ABILITY TO:

Climbing ladders and working in high place or confined areas.

Lifting, carrying, pushing and pulling heavy objects.

Reaching overhead, above the shoulders and horizontally.

Heavy physical labor.

Bending at the waist, kneeling or crouching.
