2010-2011 Academic Policies & Procedures Committee Meeting No. 6 MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

A motion was made and seconded to call the November 18, 2010 AP&P Committee Meeting to order at 3:08 p.m. Ms. Maria Clinton, AP&P Faculty Co-Chair, called the meeting to order at 3:08 p.m. Motion carried.

2. OPENING COMMENTS FROM THE COMMITTEE CO-CHAIR

Ms. Maria Clinton stated that a policy is currently in place in the AP&P handbook requiring the Dean to be present at the AP&P meeting in order for the committee to review and approve any course or program/certificate material. This particular policy has not been enforced because it was only discovered recently when a request was made to have the AP&P Representative proxy for the faculty. Ms. Maria Clinton requested the committee to consider this particular policy and whether or not it needs to be revised. Ms. Nancy Cholvin, AP&P Representative for Mathematics, stated that she felt the faculty's presence along side the AP&P Representative was enough to approve a course. She did not feel the dean's presence was necessary. Ms. Maria Clinton also asked the committee to consider an appropriate alternative to the AP&P Representative and/or the faculty member. In some cases, the AP&P Representative is unable to attend the meeting however the instructor is able to attend or visa versa. A suggestion was made to allow the Department Chair to stand in for the faculty or AP&P Representative.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

a. October 14, 2010

Ms. Maria Clinton requested a motion to approve the October 14, 2010 AP&P Committee minutes. A motion was made and seconded to approve the October 14, 2010 AP&P Committee minutes. Motion carried.

4. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

a. SB 1440

Ms. Maria Clinton stated that she attended the Statewide Senate Plenary session last week and the new bill SB 1440 was discussed in detail. Five course transfer modals have been established thus far in the following areas: Mathematics, Psychology, Sociology, Geology, and Communication. It was recommended that only two of the degree areas be implemented and those areas should be chosen in accordance with our current selection of courses and programs. Dr. Lee Grishman felt that the two areas that were easiest to implement at this time would be Mathematics and Communications since our current program and course listing for theses areas closely resemble these modals. Mrs. Margaret Drake asked if the Chancellor's Office would require a full program approval packet. Ms. Clinton answered that the Chancellor's Office indicated that these program approvals will be on a fast track approval process if curriculum matched the transfer modal. Mrs. Drake was a little concerned that the approval process that the Chancellor's Office is referring to, is that within their office

and not the amount of work conducted at the Community College level to prepare the program request for their approval process. Ms. Maria Clinton stated that this would be discussed again at a future meeting.

b. 2-3 CurricUNET training workshops for Spring 2011 will be scheduled soon in TE7 room 103.

Ms. Maria Clinton stated that the CurricUNET working meetings have ended for this semester and 2-3 will be scheduled in the Spring for Flex credit.

5. DISCUSSION ITEMS

a. +/- Grades on Transcripts and Banner - LaDonna Trimble

Ms. LaDonna Trimble was present to explain to the committee that the use of +/- grades on transcripts and in Banner will be effective from 2010 forward for transfer coursework only. Any grades transferred prior to 2010 will remain as it is currently entered into Banner. Also the +/- grades will be established based on our grading scale. Ms. LaDonna Trimble is currently in the process of creating a conversion table, which will then be distributed.

b. Revising Diversity Studies Requirement

A motion was made and seconded to table item 5b Revising Diversity Studies Requirement due to lack of time. Motion carried.

c. Upper Division Units – Dr. Lee Grishman

Dr. Lee Grishman stated that last academic year the AP&P committee approved the use of upper division units by petition toward a students' academic record. However, the committee did not decide on a limit to the number of units that can be applied and whether or not those units can be used toward graduation. He continued to state that it is unclear whether or not students should receive subject credit which does not carry a unit value or if students should receive both subject and unit credit. Mrs. Margaret Drake suggested that the use of upper division units mirror the current process for credit by examination. Mrs. LaDonna Trimble stated that the deans are currently only looking at the description of the course and whether the students has meet a certain requirement. It was requested that the research presented last academic year be taken back to the divisions for consideration of a limit to the number of upper division units used by a student. Ms. Maria Clinton requested that Mrs. Melissa Jauregui email those result to the committee member. This will return to the agenda.

1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Ms. Maria Clinton encouraged the representatives and the faculty within their division to attend one of the above trainings to become familiar with the CurricUNET process. She asked that the representatives share these dates with their divisions and have attendees bring their revisions to the training so she can assist them with the process.
