Kathryn asked what the committee wanted to gain by looking at all the data and the committee decided we needed to ask ourselves if the professional development program is meeting the ever-changing needs of faculty. Looking at similar college programs, the average hours required is 28 hours, though those colleges with strong FPD programs tend require more hours; if we stick with the 48 hours we are closer to those institutions with strong FPD programs. It was noted that many programs offer several days at beginning of term, with opportunities to break up number of hours required in a day. This is an option on the survey, so we will return after we receive survey results.
		When asked about planned FPD trips, Kathryn reported that though trips are still allowed by various institutions, most have been limited due to liability issues.
		 c. Proposal Criteria Proposals are due by February 29, 2016. The committee informed Kathryn that they used the six categories and ranked proposals last year, and between the ranking and the limited number of proposals submitted, all were accepted.
