

- CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL The Academic Senate meeting of March 5, 2015, was called to order at 3:00 p.m. by Dr. Ed Beyer, Academic Senate President.
- 2. OPENING COMMENTS FROM THE SENATE PRESIDENT
  - Dr. Beyer reported that faculty door keys will open L-201 and the door into L-202.
  - Dr. Beyer asked that seats at tables be reserved for the 24 members of the Senate and proxies. Others present as guests or to give reports must sit against the wall if there are no available seats.
  - Dr. Beyer reported on his discussion with Dr. Bonnie Suderman regarding the Regular Effective Contact Policy & accessibility. He is considering the creation of a task force consisting of representatives from AP&P and Distance Education to ensure all online COR's fall in line with the new policy. The program, resources and training will be identified during the Spring 2015 semester, in preparation of compliance beginning Fall 2015. President Knudson has committed his support, that faculty may not teach an online course if they are out of compliance. Dr. Beyer expressed concern the project be faculty-driven.
  - Dr. Beyer pulled item 5B & 5E.
  - Dr. Beyer welcomed Ms. Lisa Vath, the new Adjunct Representative.

#### 3. OPEN COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

- Dr. Irit Gat reported plans are underway for Faculty Recognition Day, to be held Thursday, April 30, 2015. She is asking faculty for action pictures from childhood. Dr. Gat has \$1400 from Schools First for food, and possibly \$700 from the Senate. Dr. Zia Nisani is enlisting help from Alpha Iota to help with childcare, etc.
- Dr. Matthew Jaffe reported he was forced to reschedule a test due to the active shooter drill. He questioned the liability, as some students refused to participate and walked out. Dr. Beyer explained it is not faculty responsibility, and advised Dr. Jaffe to address the issue with administration or security.

Dr. Beyer clarified; it is not the responsibility of faculty to manage a student who elects to leave during an active shooter drill.

#### 4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made and seconded to approve minutes of the February 19, 2015 Academic Senate meeting. Motion carried with corrections; one (1) abstention.

- 5. REPORTS (5 minutes maximum)
  - a. Faculty Professional Development Committee Dr. Irit Gat (attachment)
    Dr. Irit Gat, Faculty Professional Development (FPD) Chair presented the FPD Committee report.

The FPD Committee's recommendation for a reduction in flex obligation hours is currently in union negotiations.

Dr. Gat reported receiving mixed feedback for the Spring 2015 Opening Day keynote speaker. Due to the negative feedback, the company offered a free workshop during the 2015-16 academic year. Dr. Gat reported survey results for Opening Day workshops were positive. The committee is looking at surveys and tying more to accreditation and how to use the information in the classroom.

Dr. Gat reported the deadline to submit 2015-16 professional development proposals was Friday, February 26, 2015. The committee received approximately 100 proposals.

The committee is currently reviewing two (2) sabbatical packets.

Dr. Gat reported a second keynote speaker will address faculty on May 1, 2015 at 1:00 p.m. in HS-201. The topic will be *Social Styles* – a team-building workshop.

Dr. Gat reported the committee will be taking into consideration cancelled flex events, when considering new proposals for the 2015-16 flex program. It was suggested all cancelled events must be rescheduled.

Ms. Tina McDermott asked if time could be built into Opening Day for outcomes and accreditation. Dr. Gat explained the topic previously received significant negative feedback, but could revisit the idea should Ms. McDermott make an appeal to the committee next semester.

- c. Tenure Review Coordinator Report Dr. Liette Bohler
  Dr. Bohler asked for suggestions for the Tenure Review Task Force name. It was suggested the *Faculty Evaluation Task Force*.

Dr. Bohler gave the Tenure Review Committee Coordinator Report - see attachment.

Dr. Susan Lowry noted any changes should be in consultation with the union, and included in the mission statement or guidelines.

Susan Lowry noted it is incumbent on the Senate President or Union President to get the board to recognize those who reach tenure.

 Accreditation Committee – Tina McDermott Tina McDermott, Accreditation Coordinator, presented the Accreditation Report – see attachment.

Ms. McDermott reported the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges affirmed Antelope Valley College (AVC) based on the last of the three (3) follow-up reports.

Ms. McDermott attended the Academic Senate Accreditation Institute in San Francisco recently, where the emphasis was on meeting standards using PLOs. She emphasized that everything in WEAVE is visible, and asked members to inform divisions that everything in WEAVE is subject to view.

Accreditation teams are meeting and are breaking into sub-standard teams. Things are going well. Most teams are working on  $2^{nd}$  draft and using the gap analysis and tracking tool to determine problems with meeting the standard.

Ms. McDermott is encouraging all faculty to attending an accreditation forum tentatively scheduled for April 28, 2015.

Dr. Zia Nisani asked if there was published material as evidence to show if faculty engagement with SLOs and PLOs prove effective. Ms. McDermott suggested he address the Outcomes Committee for such evidence.

e. Legislative Report – Dr. Glenn Haller None.

#### 6. REPORTS ON ACTION ITEMS AND IMPLEMENTATION

a. Regular Effective Contact Policy

Dr. Beyer re-addressed the Regular Effective Contact Policy as mentioned in his opening comments. He is in discussions with Dr. Bonnie Suderman and is considering the creation of a subgroup to AP&P and DETC, to make sure the district is in line with the new policy.

#### 7. ACTION ITEMS

a. Hiring Committee Pools

Dr. Beyer addressed the need to streamline the appointments of faculty representatives for hiring committees. He suggested the creation of a hiring pool for faculty interested in serving on as a senate representative. The senate executive would hold the authority to appoint from within the pool, and a 1 or 2-day call would be made to faculty outside the pool that might be interested in serving. If approved, the process would reduce the appointments to a 3-day process.

A motion was made and seconded to create a hiring pool for faculty interested in participating in hiring committees. Motion carried.

Re: Senate Report

At the beginning of the fall 2014 semester, there were a total of 21 Tenure Review Evaluation Committees.

13 were first-year committees. In addition to these 13 first-year committees, we had 3 second-year committees, 4 third-year committees, and 1 fourth-year committee, which brought up the total of tenure review committees to 21 for the fall. No first or second-year committees recommended termination. Therefore, they will all continue their work in 2015-16.

During the fall semester, one probationary faculty member in engineering, in his  $3^{rd}$  year of the tenure review process, fell ill and resigned from his teaching duties. He did not come back for the spring semester.

The committee of a probationary faculty member in Respiratory Therapy, Wendy Stout, who is in her fourth year, recommended her for tenure. This request should go forward to the board before March 15.

Another committee of a faculty member in her second year - in counseling - who had worked at AVC full-time for four years prior to being hired tenure track, made a recommendation for early tenure. This recommendation should go forward to the president.

The work schedules for the remaining 18 committees were due to me on March 3 and most committees were able to adhere to this timeline. I will continue to send out reminders of the upcoming timelines.

I will also meet again with Dr. Suderman to discuss the plan of introducing Scantrons for the tabulation of the student evaluations. Dr. Suderman has looked into a program called "Class Climate Scantron". Further discussion will be needed.

The tenure review committee task force met on March 5 and discussed the mission statement and issues in article VIII that we would like to review during future meetings. The task force will meet again on March 19.

- 1. The ACCJC affirmed us based on our 3<sup>rd</sup> follow up report
- 2. I attended the Academic Senate Accreditation Institute last weekend in SF
  - a. Emphasis on meeting standards using PLOs 12/16 institutions had issues regarding PLOs this cycle
  - b. Emphasis on faculty's meaningful engagement with S/PLOs, including adjuncts
- 3. Committee meetings and writing the report
  - a. Teams are meeting on their own as well as with me
  - b. Most teams are now working on their 2<sup>nd</sup> draft after doing an outline and a 1<sup>st</sup> draft. Some standards are behind.
  - c. Using the gap analysis and tracking tool to find where we have problems meeting the standard.
  - d. I met with the Outcomes Committee and some divisions (VAPA on Friday) to emphasize the importance of PLOs and using the SLO data mapped up for PLO assessment. Please emphasize this with your divisions.
- 4. Need great examples from programs or large courses where P/SLO process has led to improvements for students ask your divisions.
- 5. We will be conducting an Accreditation Forum tentatively on April 28<sup>th</sup>. Please attend and ask your division to attend. Encourage part time faculty to attend.
  - a. Everyone on campus needs to know what is going on in accreditation it's not someone else's job
  - b. Everyone needs to understand how assessments feed into planning
  - c. Everyone needs to be part of the discussion on how to present the great things we do and the ways we work together to improve things in the report to the ACCJC.
