Student Learning Outcomes-Revision Checklist

Each SLO will exhibit the following qualities:

Provides evidence of overarching student knowledge, skills, abilities, attitudes, or dispositions rather than discrete objectives
Describes student competency rather than content coverage
Use of active verbs from Bloom's Taxonomy
Consistent with COR (Course Outline of Record)
Assessment methods / tools are clearly identified (activity or assignment students undertake that can be used to determine whether learning has occurred)
Assessment methods / tools appear to be meaningful, practical, and sustainable
Assessment criteria are clearly identified (how well a student must score on the activity or assignment to be considered successful)
Achievement targets are clearly identified (the percentage of students that meet the assessment criteria)
If the SLO has been revised, a revision dialog explaining the reason for revision.

Definitions:

- Assessment Method: activity or assignment students undertake that can be used to determine whether learning has occurred
- Assessment Criteria: how well a student must score on the activity or assignment to be considered successful
- Achievement Target: the percentage of students that meet the assessment criteria
