

Student Learning Outcomes-Revision Checklist

Each SLO will exhibit the following qualities:

- Provides evidence of overarching student knowledge, skills, abilities, attitudes, or dispositions rather than discrete objectives
- Describes student competency rather than content coverage
- Use of active verbs from Bloom's Taxonomy
- Consistent with COR (Course Outline of Record)
- Assessment methods / tools are clearly identified (activity or assignment students undertake that can be used to determine whether learning has occurred)
- Assessment methods / tools appear to be meaningful, practical, and sustainable
- Assessment criteria are clearly identified (how well a student must score on the activity or assignment to be considered successful)
- Achievement targets are clearly identified (the percentage of students that meet the assessment criteria)
- If the SLO has been revised, a revision dialog explaining the reason for revision.

Definitions:

- *Assessment Method:* activity or assignment students undertake that can be used to determine whether learning has occurred
- *Assessment Criteria:* how well a student must score on the activity or assignment to be considered successful
- *Achievement Target:* the percentage of students that meet the assessment criteria
