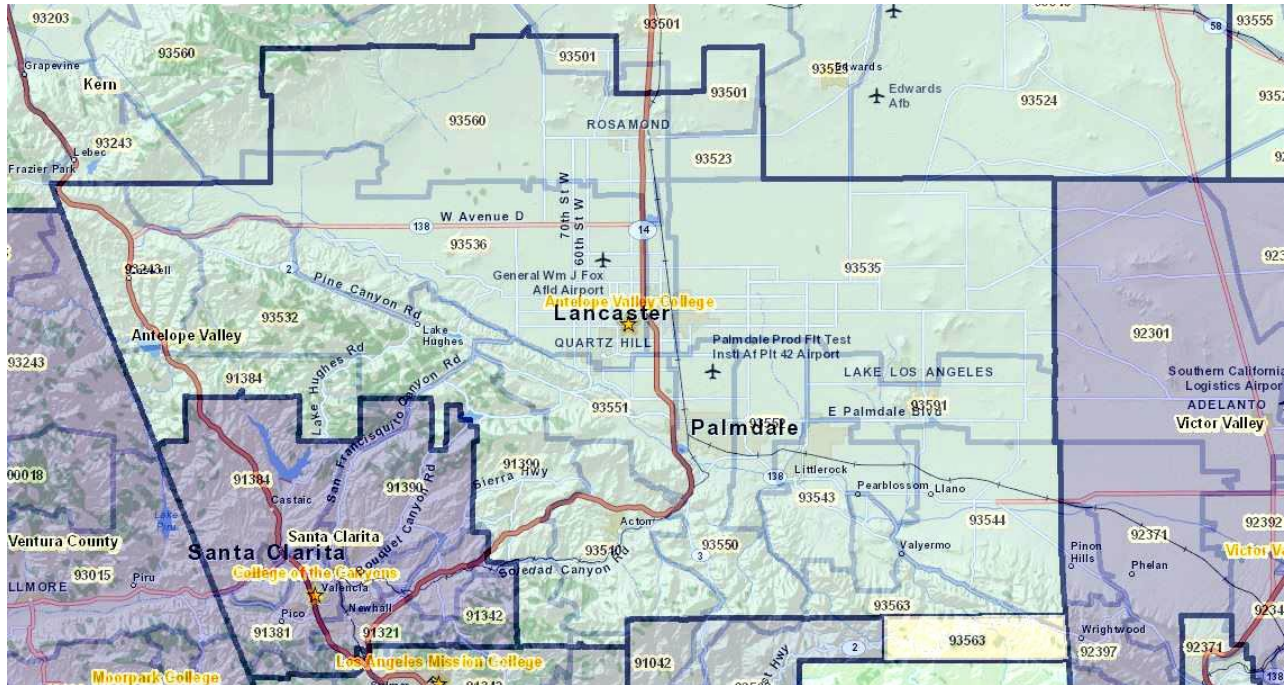

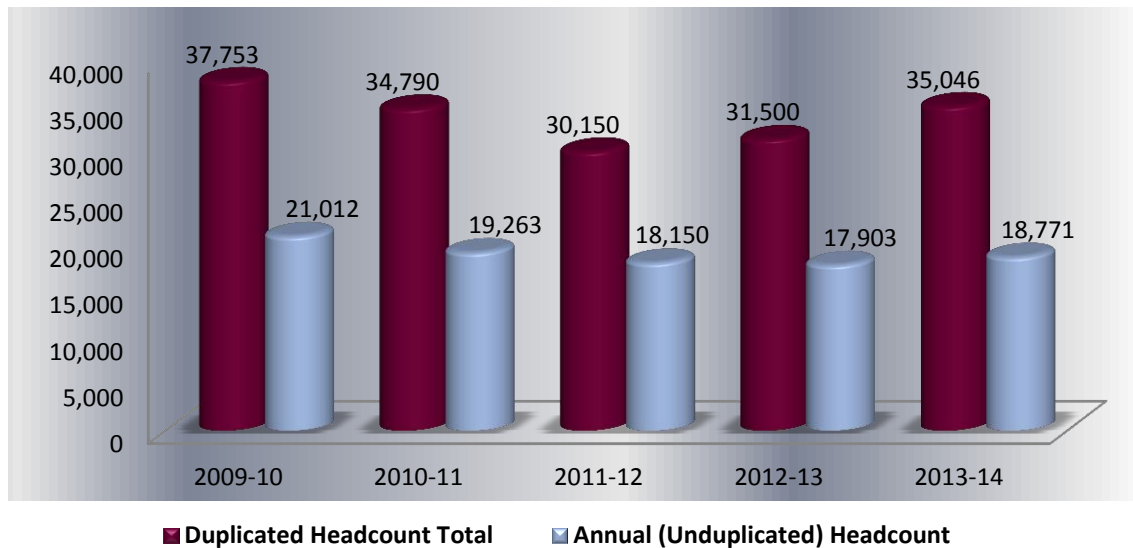

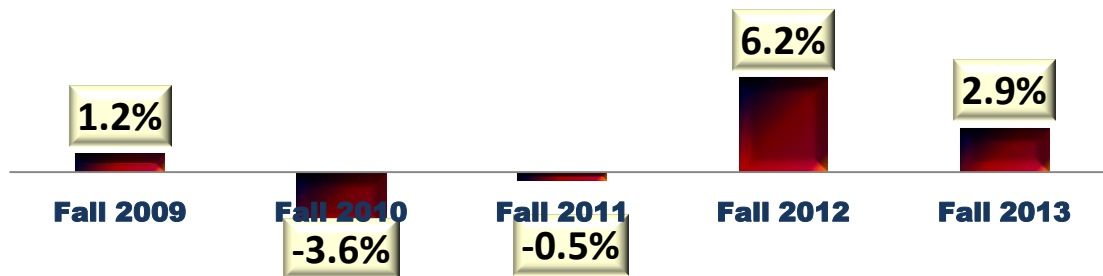

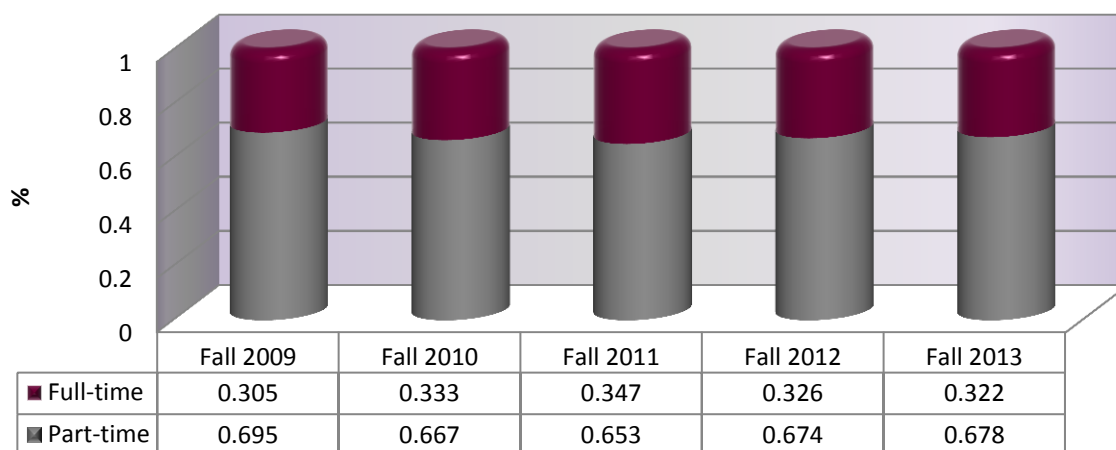

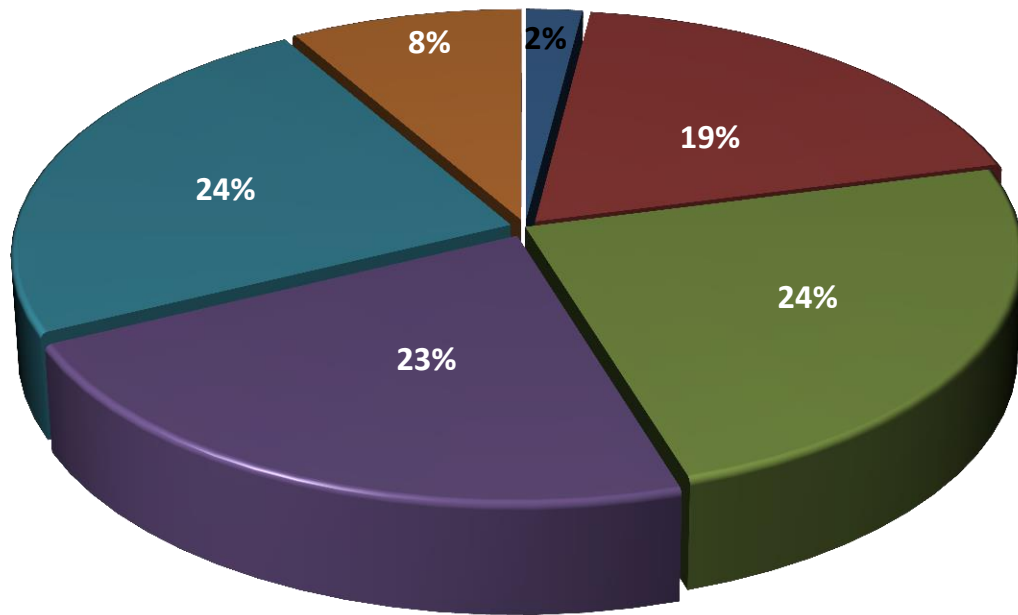
**Figure 2.3. Fall Student Load Comparison**

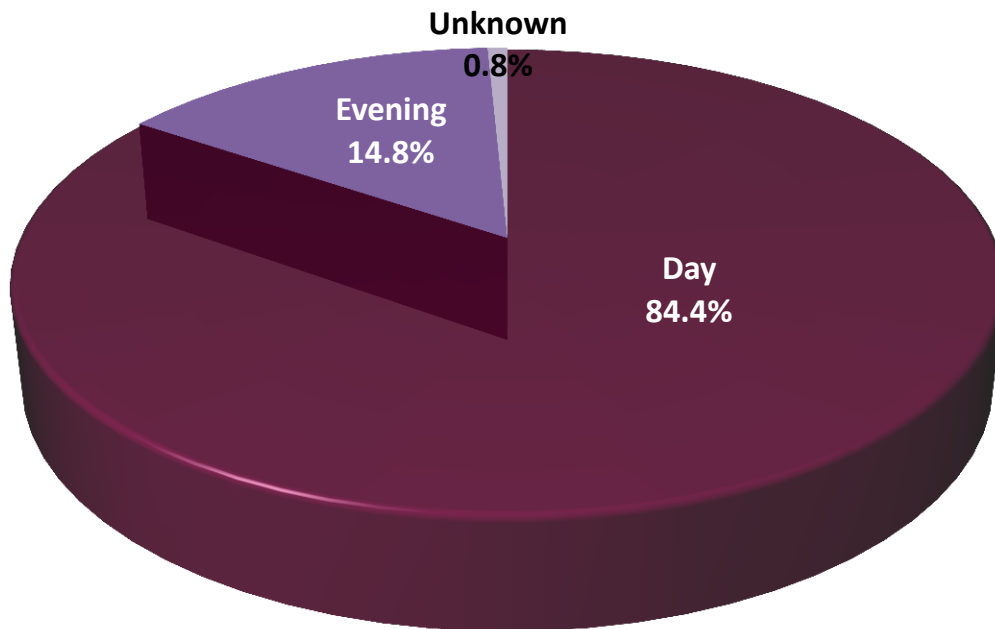

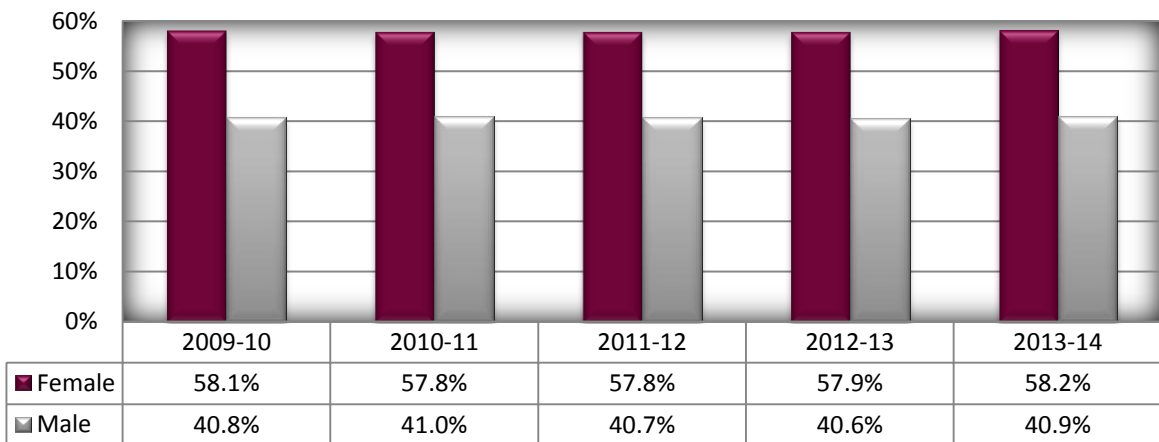

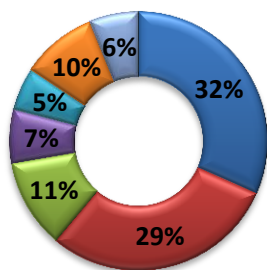

**Figure 2.7. Annual Enrollment by Age Groups, 2009-10 and 2013-14**

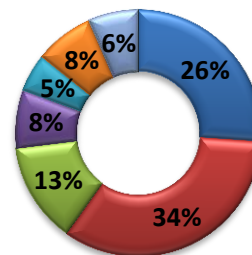

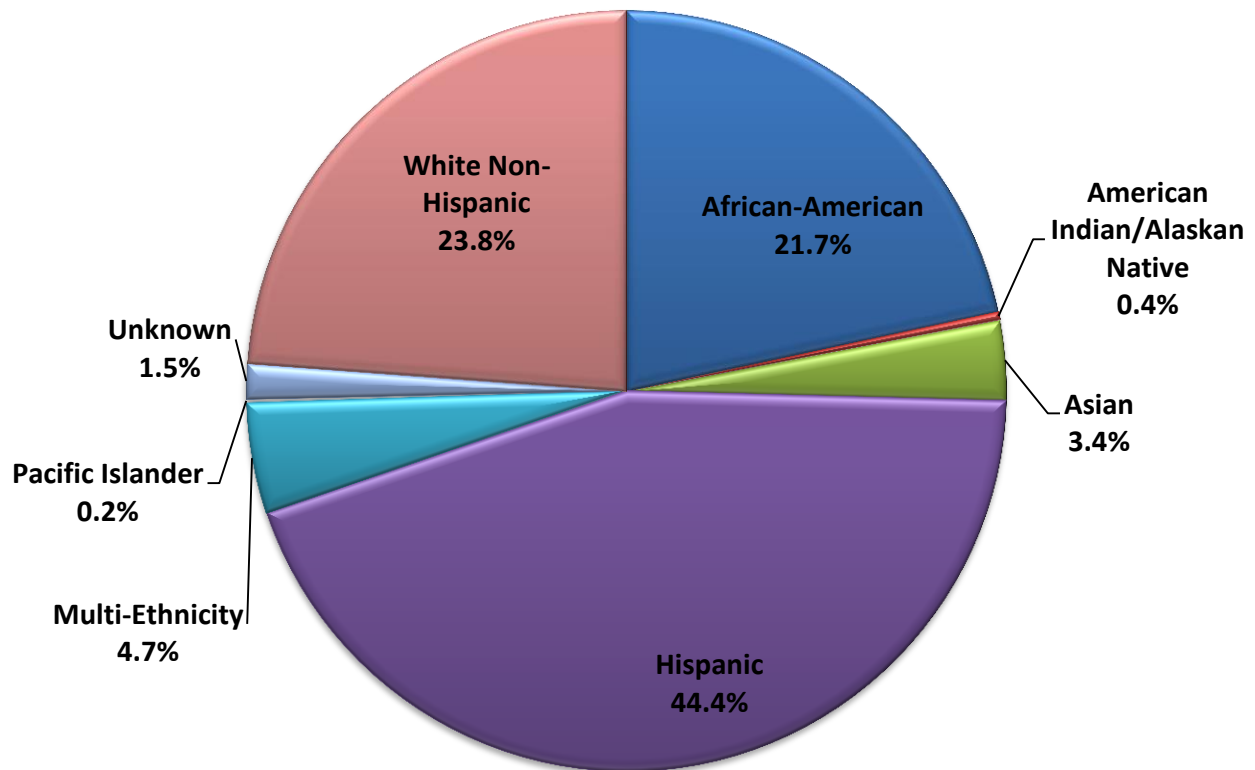

**Figure 2.8. AVC Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, Fall 2013**

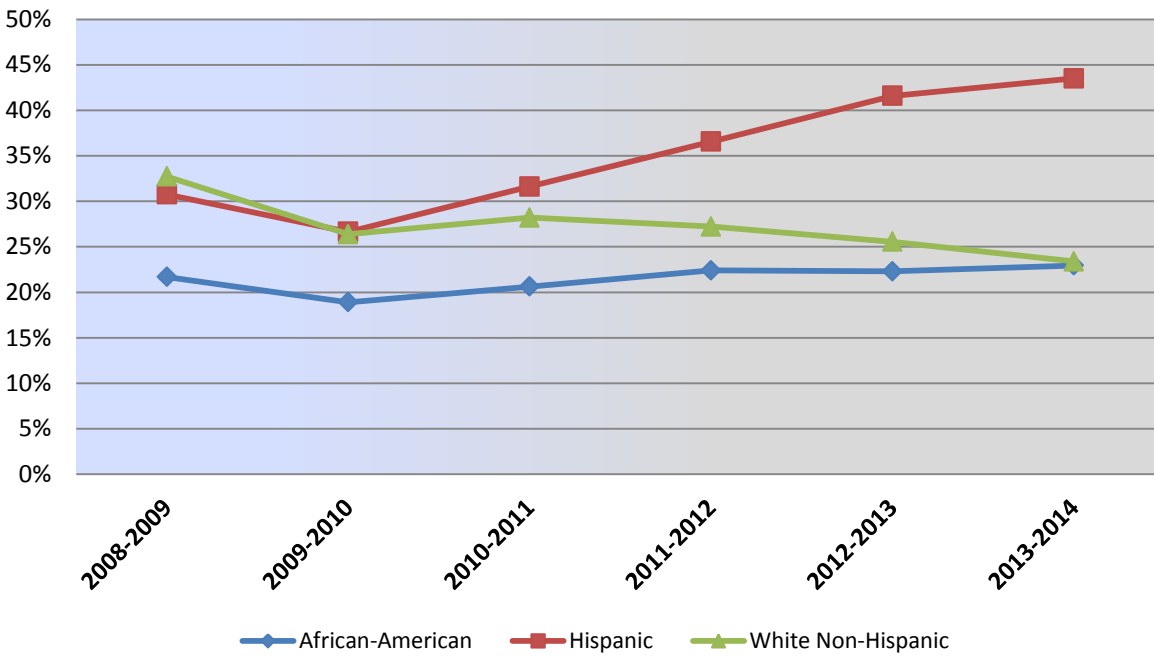

**Figure 2.9. Annual Enrollment Percentages by Race/Ethnicity, Five-Year Trend**



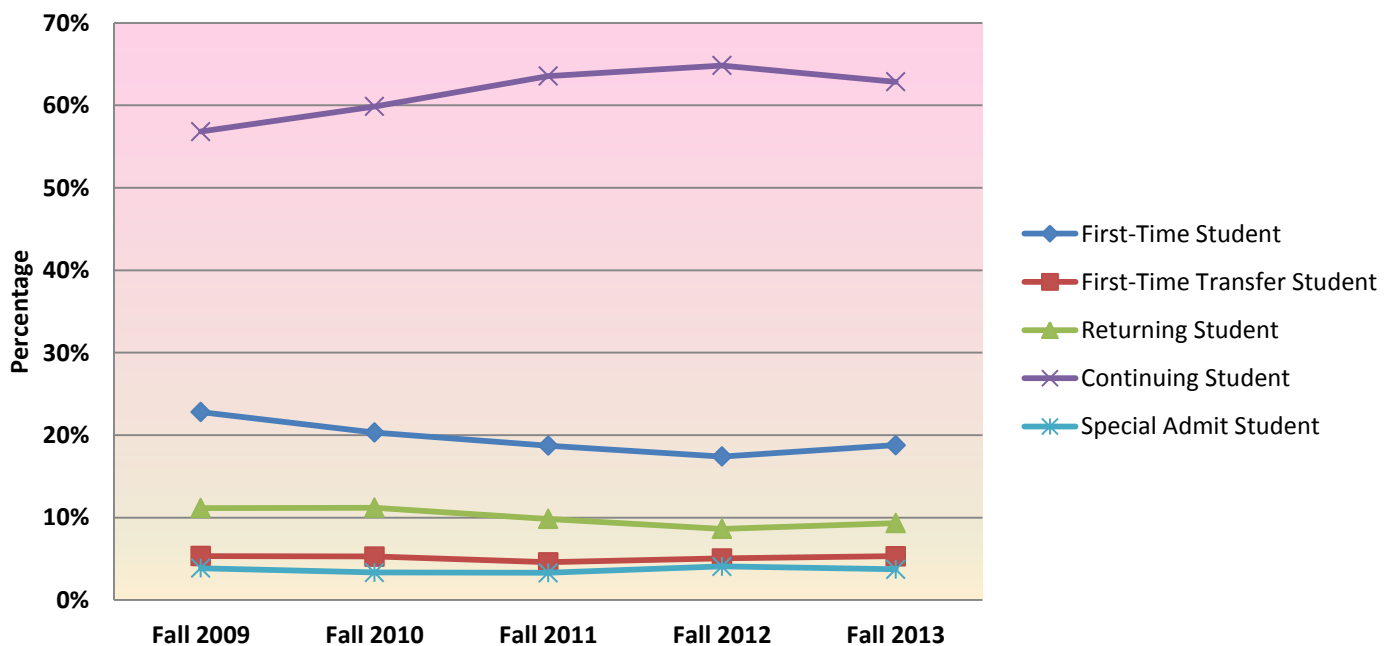

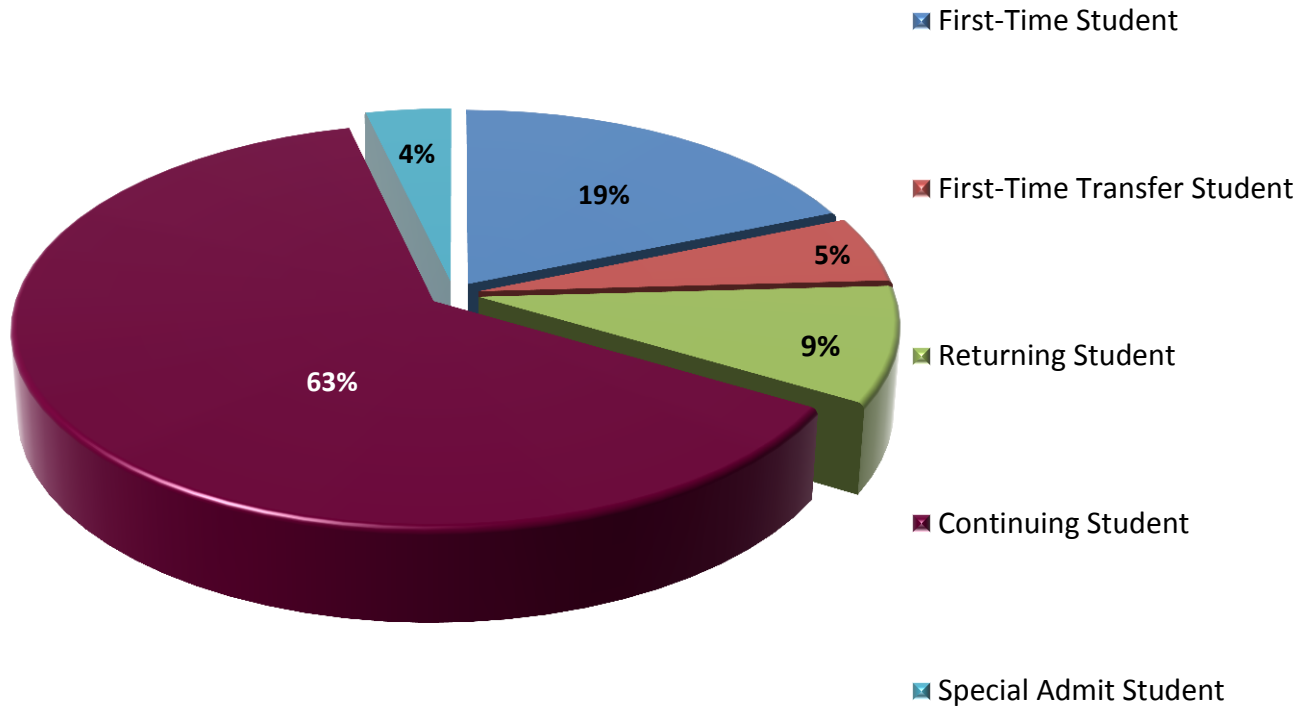

**Figure 3.2. Fall 2013 Enrollment Status**

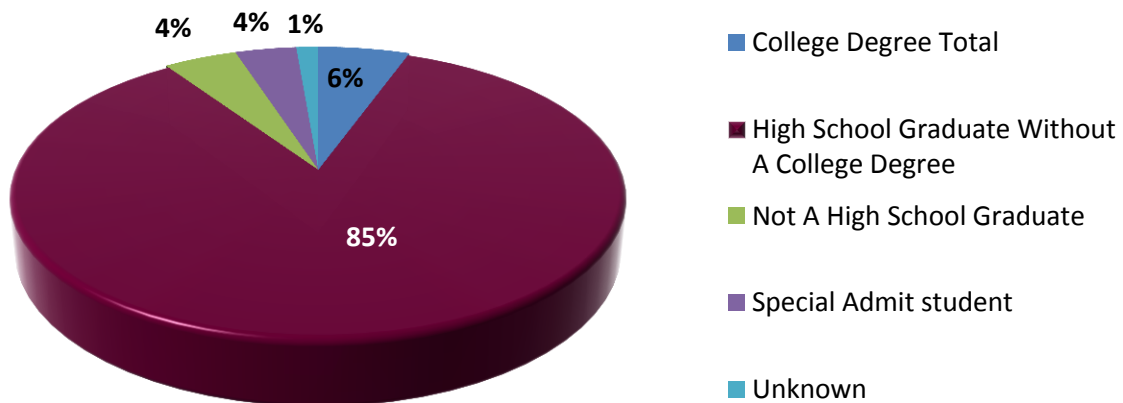

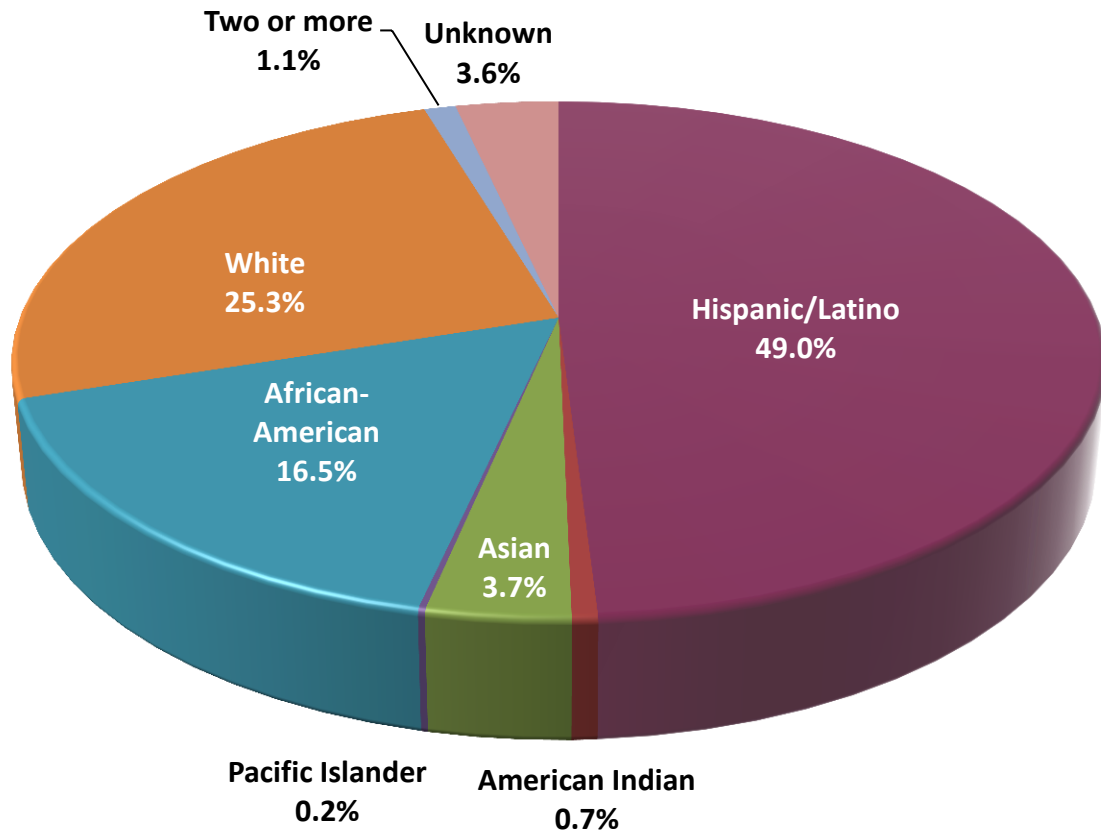

Graduates by Race/Ethnicity**



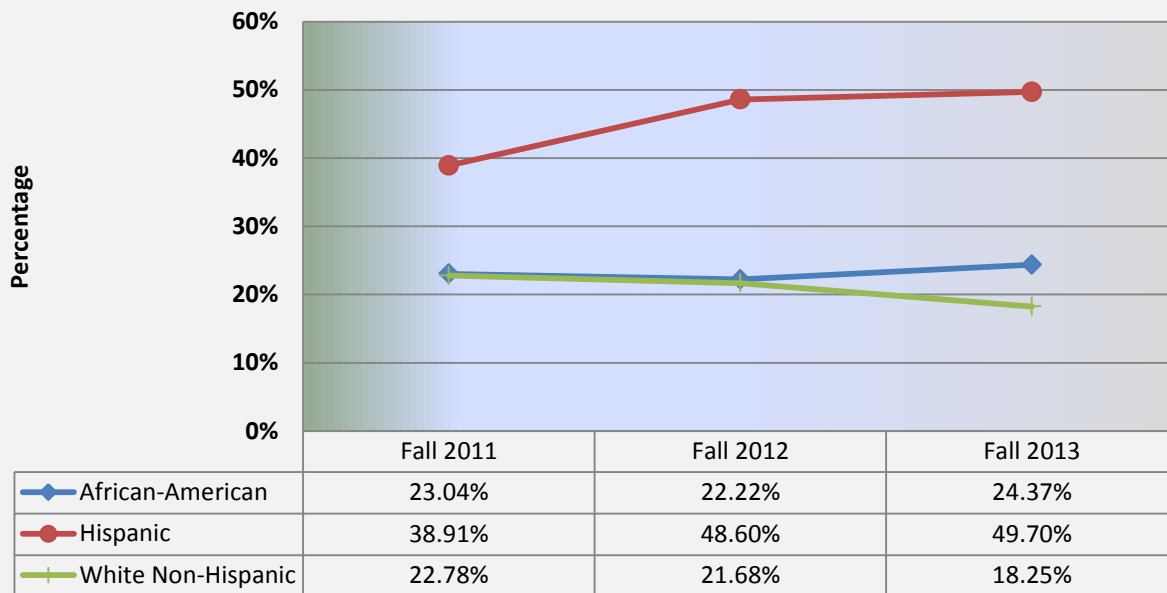

**Figure 3.5. Percent of First-Time Students by 3 "Major" Racial/Enthnic Groups, 3-Year Trend**

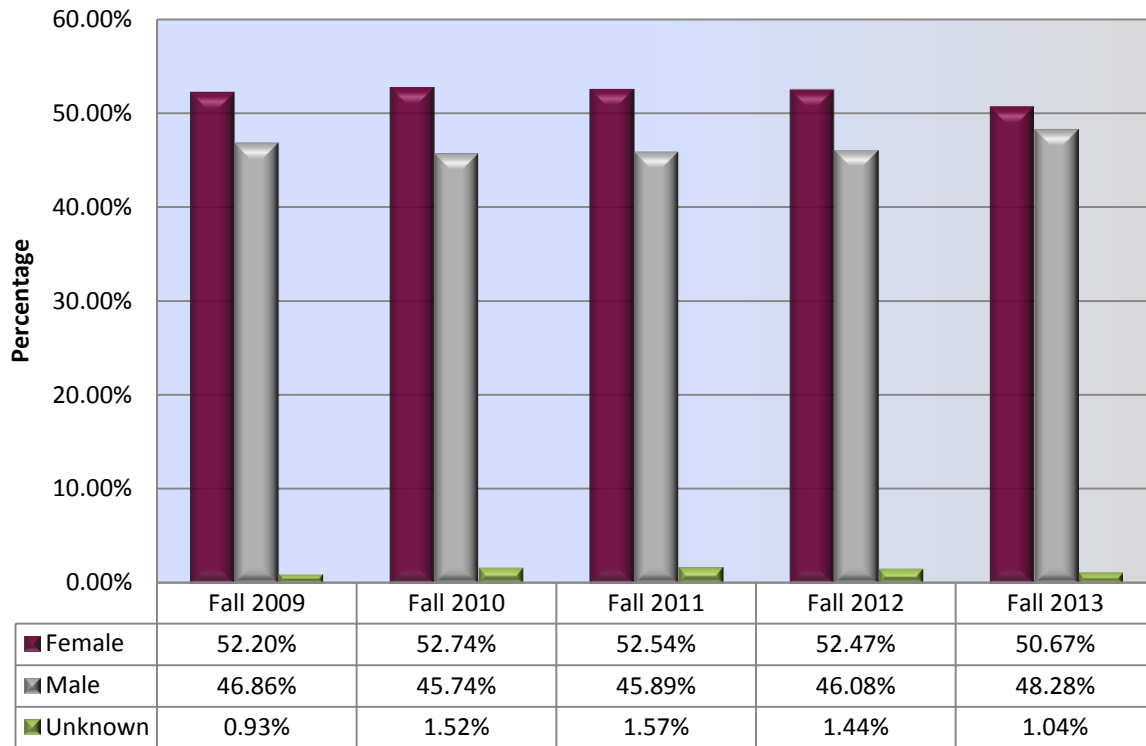

**Figure 3.6. First-Time Student Enrollment by Gender, Five-Year Trend**

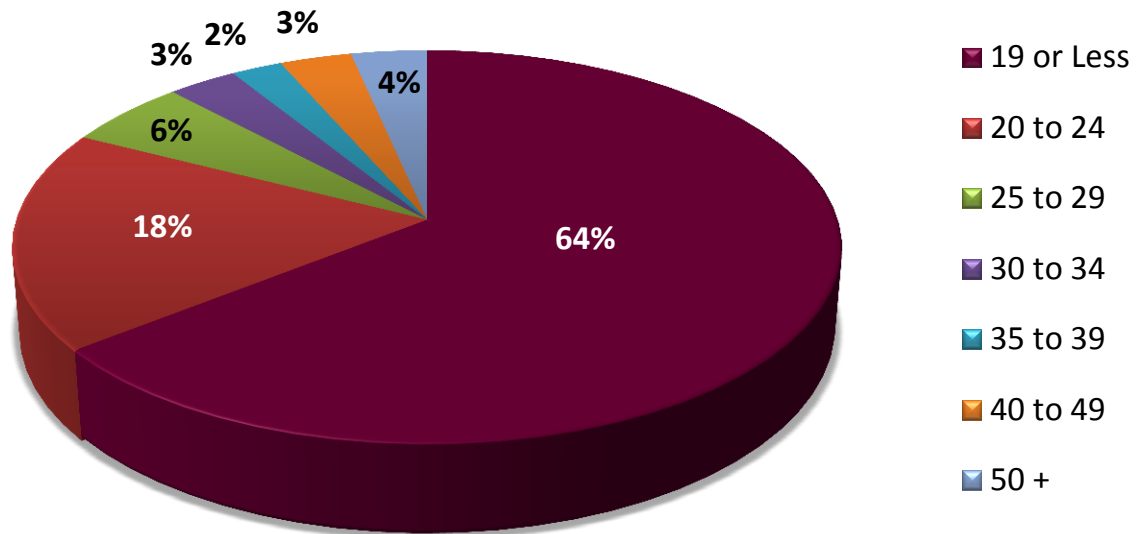

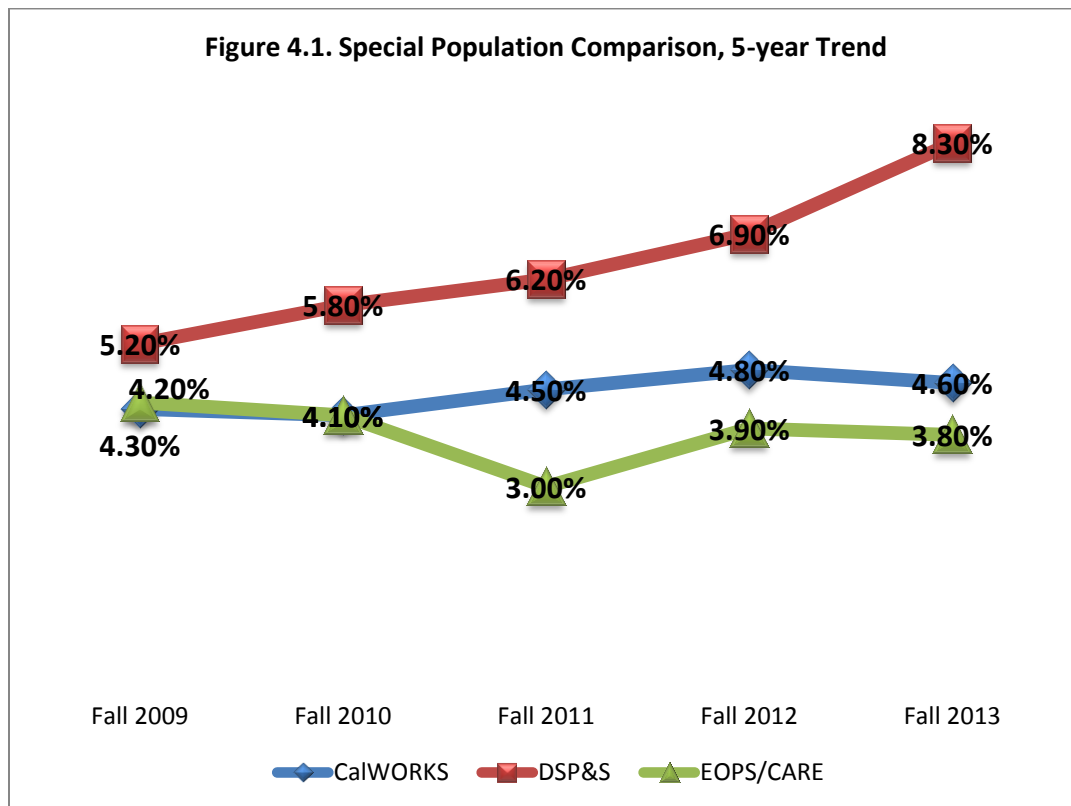

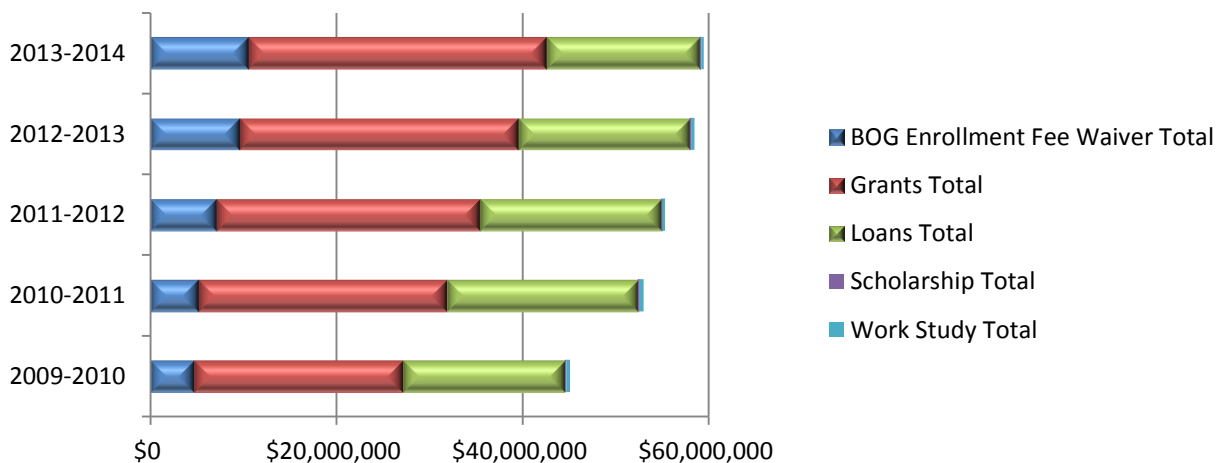

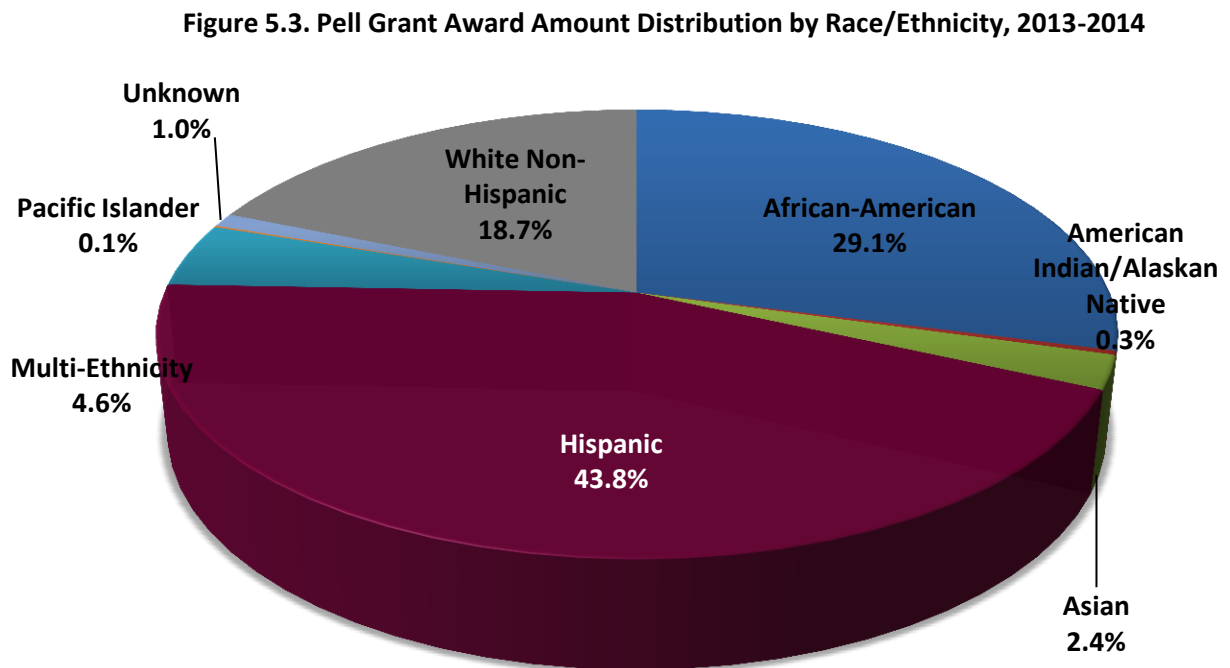
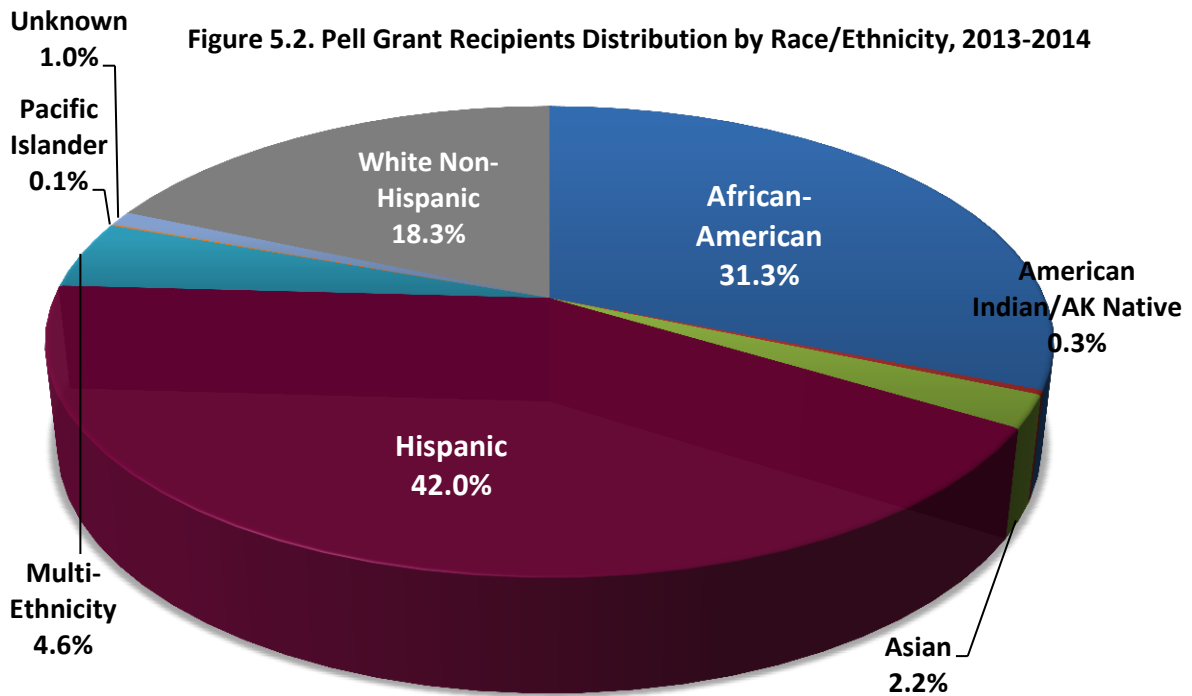
**Figure 5.1**



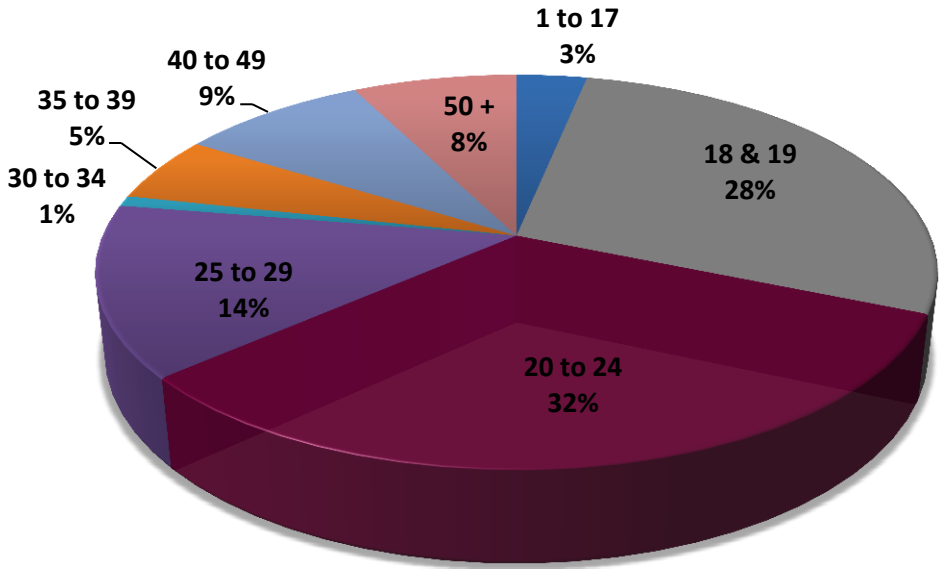

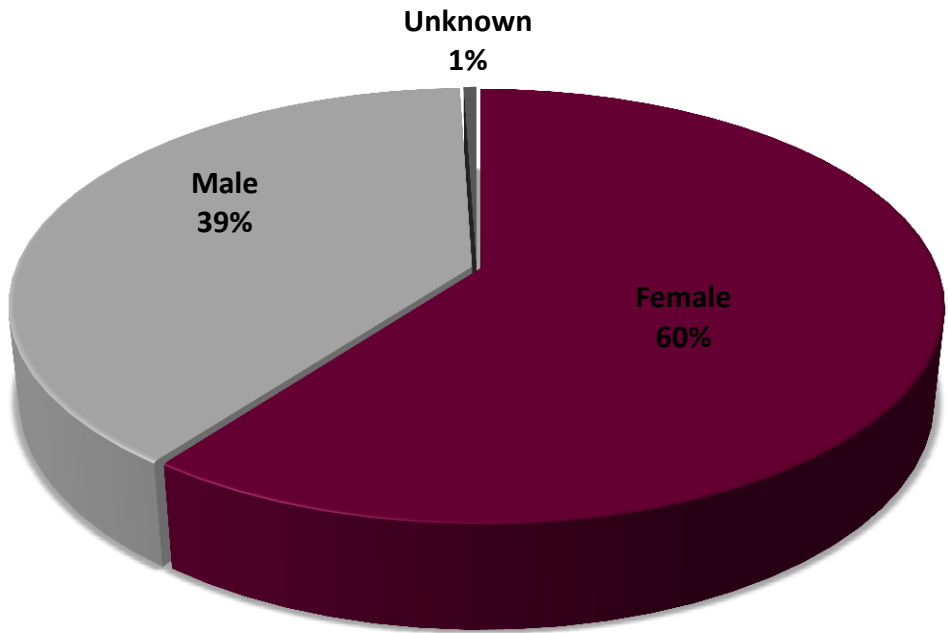

**Figure 5.5. Pell Grant Award Amount Distribution by Gender, 2013-2014**



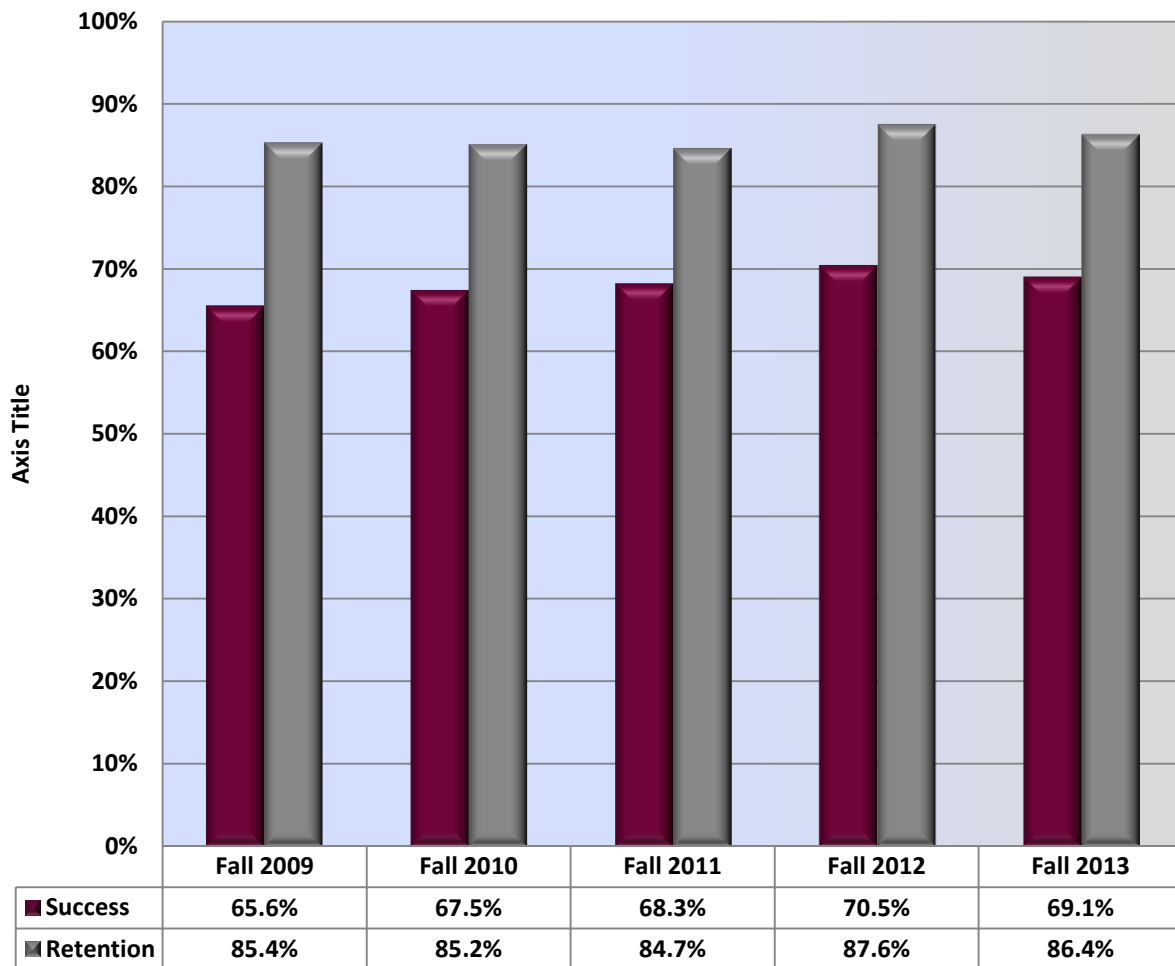

Figure 6.1. Success and Retention Rates, 2009-2013



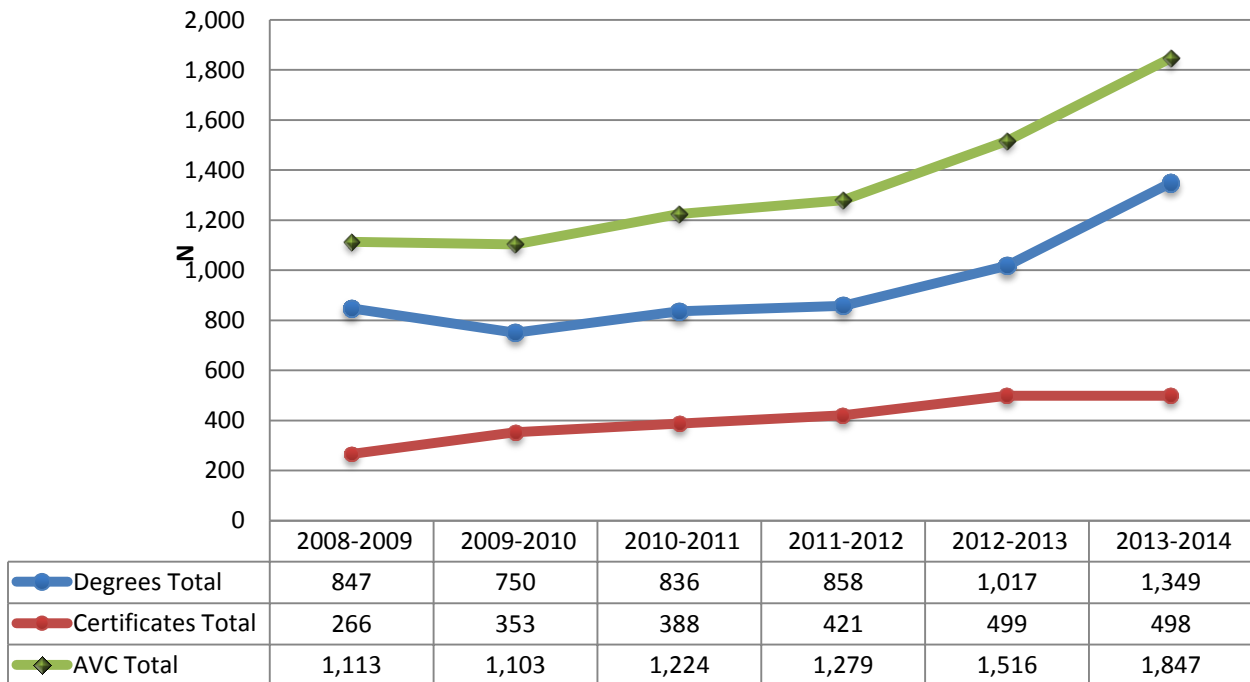

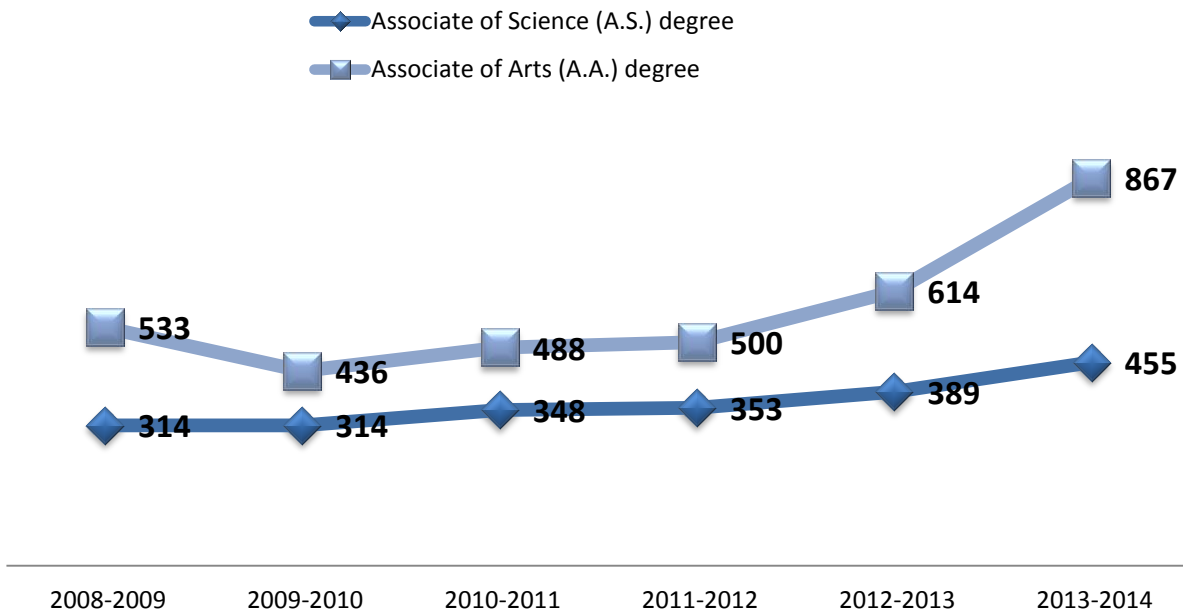

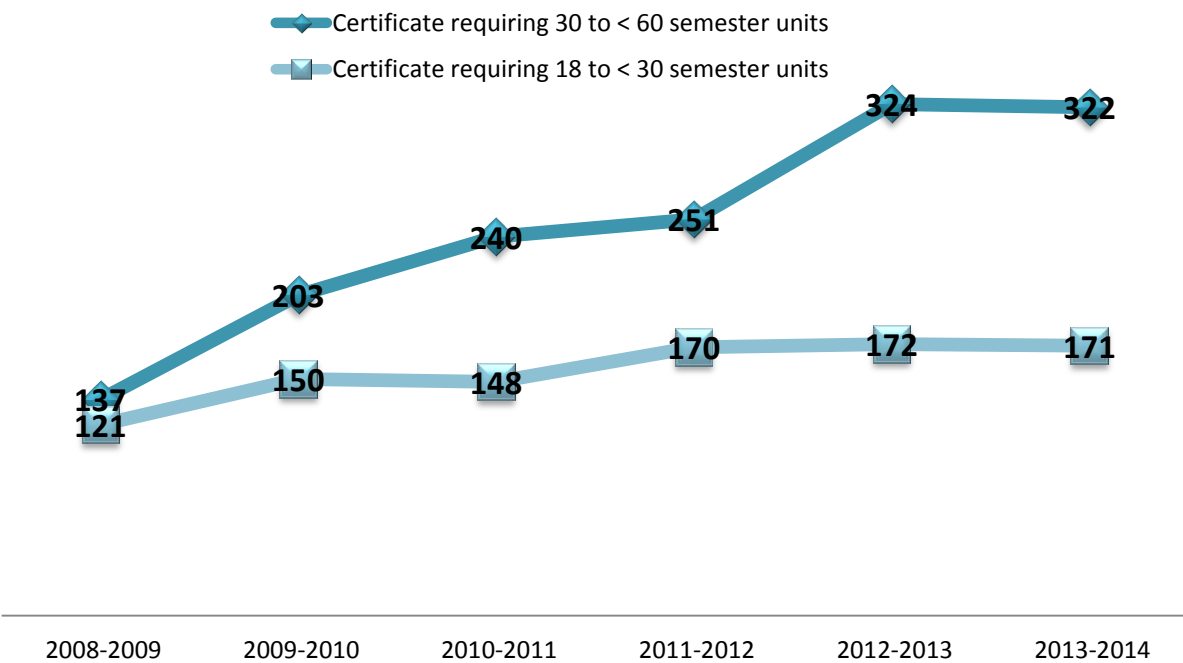
**Figure 7.1. Numbers of Degrees and Certificates Awarded, 6-Year Trend**

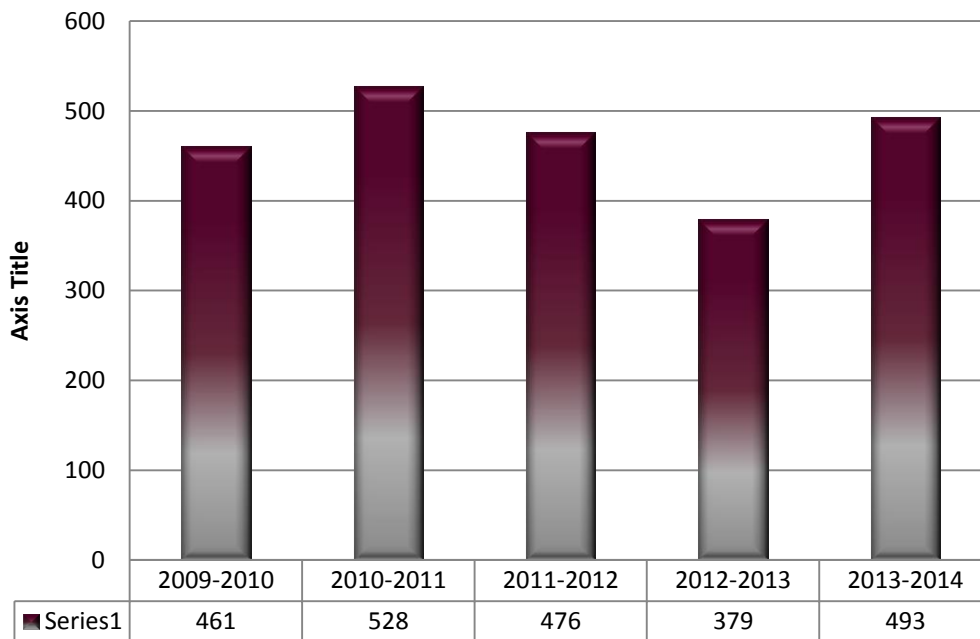

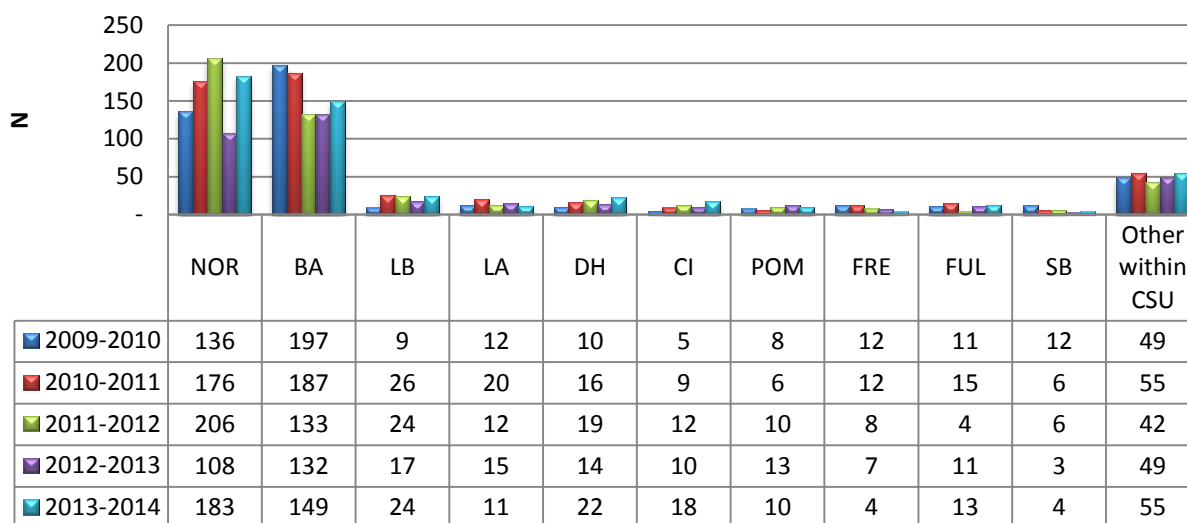

Five-Year Trend**

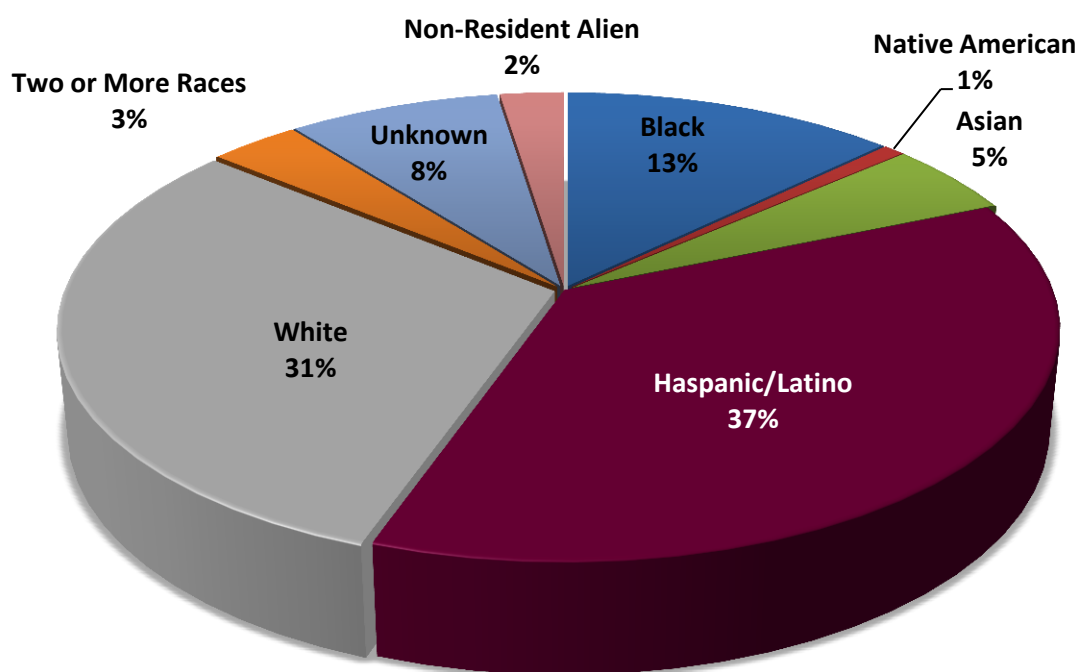




**Figure 7.5. Top 10 CSU System Campuses for AVC Transfer Students, 5-Year Trend**

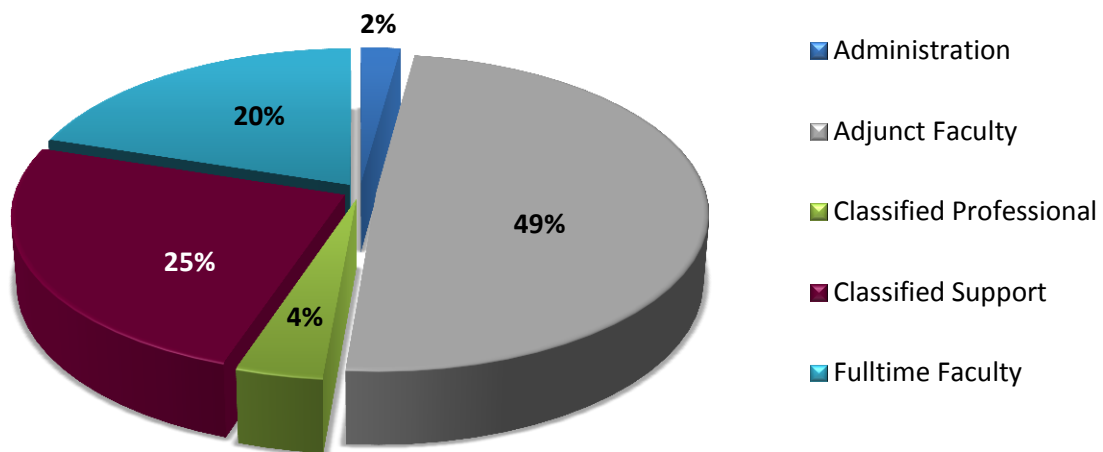

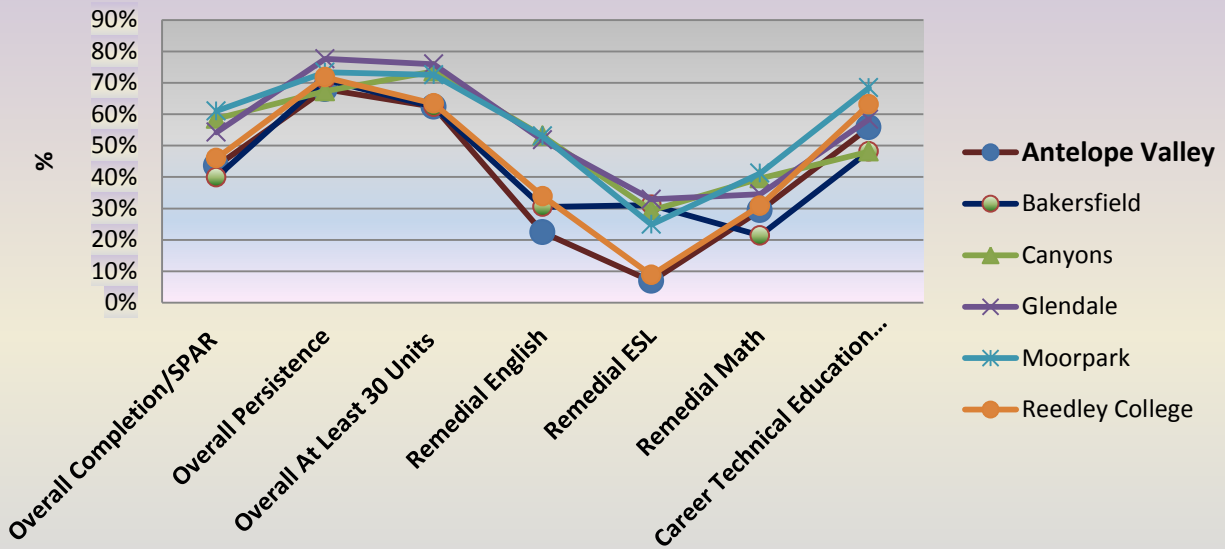

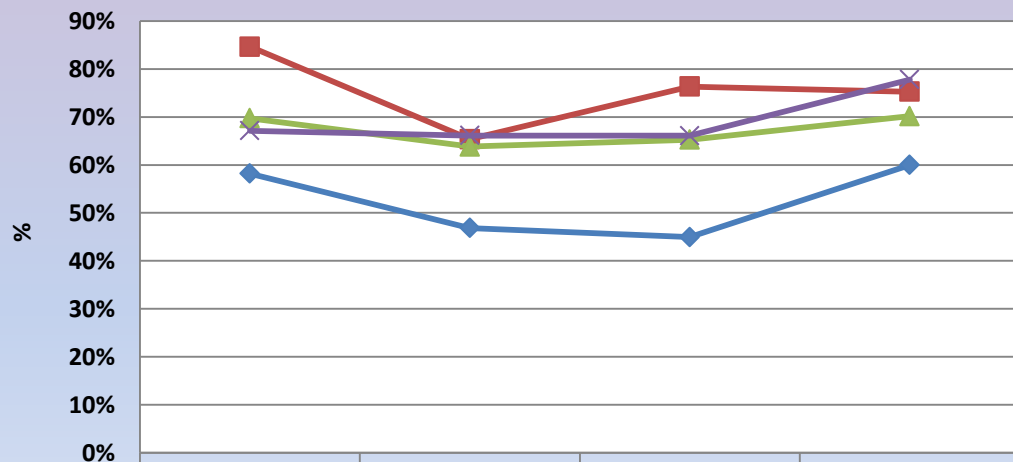

### AVC & Peer Group\* Scorecard Metrics Performance Comparison, Cohort of 2007-08



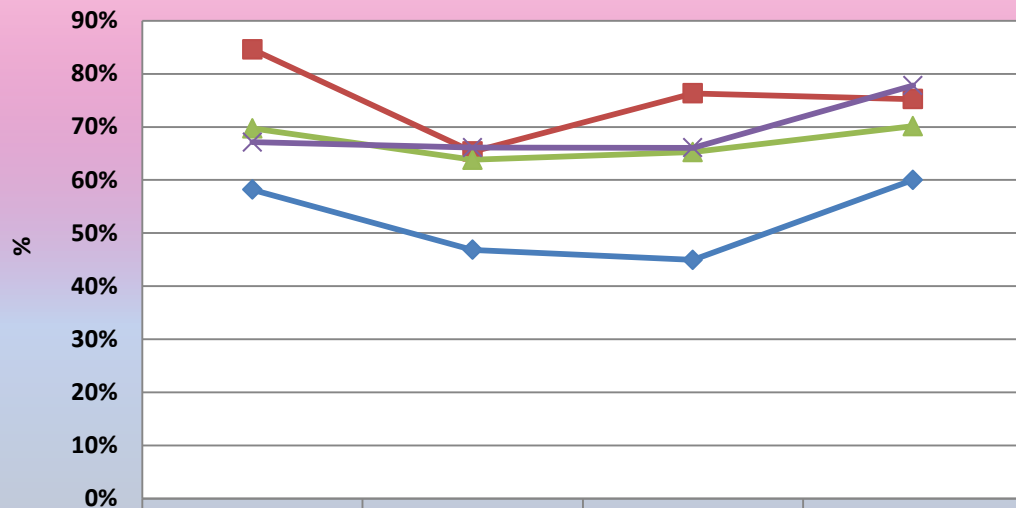

### AVC vs. Peers Basic Skills Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity, Fall 2013



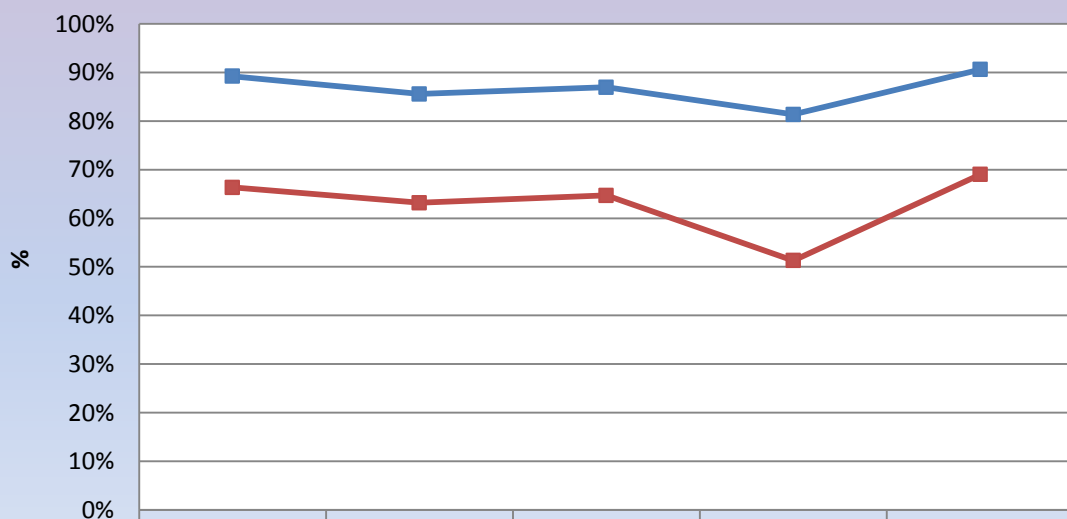
