Recent Projects from the Office of Institutional Research and Planning

Research for: Strategic Budget and Planning Committee

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The Institutional Learning Outcome (ILO) survey used a likert scale to answer specific questions which tied into the ILOs. The pre-analysis determination identified the two fields of Improved Significantly and Improved Moderately as indicators of outcome achievement. The following charts reveal the results for the 2010 ILO assessment.

ILO 1

Analyze diverse perspectives from a variety of disciplines and experiences that contribute to the development of self-awareness. The follow chart reveals a 71.2% agreement in ILO 1 achievement.

ILO 2

Value and apply lifelong learning skills required for employment, basic skills, transfer education, and personal development. The data shows nearly a 70 percent agreement with ILO 2.

ILO3

Demonstrate a breadth of knowledge and experiences from the Humanities, Social and Behavioral Sciences, Arts, Natural Sciences, and Mathematics. The results of the survey shows a slightly higher agreement rate on ILO3.

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ILO4

Solve problems using oral and written communication, critical thinking and listening skills, planning and decision-making skills, information literacy, and a variety of technologies. The following chart shows over 65 percent agreement with ILO 4.

ILO5

Demonstrate good citizenship and teamwork through respect, tolerance, cultural awareness, and an understanding of the role of diversity in modern society. The data reveals over a 60 percent achievement with ILO 5.
