Semester, Intersession, and Summer Session Unit Load

The normal load for a full-time student at the college is 15 units per semester. For most purposes, the official designation of a “full-time” student is one who is enrolled in 12 or more semester units, while a “part-time” student is one who is enrolled in fewer than 12 semester units. A student may not enroll for more than 19 units per semester in fall and spring, 9 units in summer, and 6 units in intersession, without the written approval of the Dean of Counseling and Matriculation.

Academic Progress/Guidance

Antelope Valley College has transitioned from terminologies such as "Academic Probation" or "Academic Dismissal" to mitigate the negative connotations and stigma associated with probation within the community college setting. Through the R.I.S.E. Program's student-centered and equity-focused strategies, R.I.S.E. aims to consciously update its language to mirror the institution's commitment to transforming campus culture and emphasizing inclusivity when students do not meet the minimum academic standards outlined in Title 5 policy. R.I.S.E. provides individual counseling and purposeful workshops to assist students with returning to academic good standing with the college. For more information about the R.I.S.E. Academic Guidance formerly known as Academic Probation. A student who has attempted 12 semester units of AVC credit shall be placed on Academic Guidance levels 1, 2, or 3 when the earned overall GPA in all units attempted at AVC is less than 2.0. A student is removed from Academic Guidance and returns to Good Standing when the earned overall GPA in all units attempted at AVC is a 2.0 or higher.

Progress Guidance formerly known as Progress Probation. A student who has enrolled in at least 12 semester units of AVC credit is placed on Progress Guidance levels 1, 2, or 3 when the percentage of all units in which a student has enrolled with entries of W, I and NP "grades" reaches or exceeds 50 percent. In other words, having an excess of W, I, NP grades can affect the student completion rate. A student is removed from Progress Guidance and returns to Good Standing when the percentage of all units in which the student has enrolled and for which entries of W, I, and NP recorded drops below 50 percent.

Levels

- Guidance Level 1 refers to a student's first term on Academic/Progress Guidance.
- Guidance Level 2 refers to a student's second term on Academic/Progress Guidance
- Guidance Level 3 refers to a student's third term, which is a year or year and a half, on Academic/Progress Guidance.

California Code of Regulations, Title 5, Section 55034 mandates that each community college must make reasonable efforts to notify students of academic probation or progress notice status at the beginning of the term. It requires colleges to provide counseling and support to help students with academic difficulties and to notify them of their removal from probation or reinstatement after dismissal within district-established timelines. These policies and procedures must be published in the college catalog.

At Antelope Valley College (AVC), students are notified multiple times via email regarding their academic standing. These communications include important details about their status and outline available support programs and services designed to help students return to good academic standing.

Students are permitted to enroll in the following semester and are strongly encouraged to connect with the R.I.S.E. program through academic counseling and/or workshops. These resources provide personalized strategies and course recommendations to support students in achieving academic success.

Attention Veterans: For students who are eligible to receive educational benefits from the Veterans Administration, if the earned grade point average in all units attempted at AVC is less than 2.0 in each of three consecutive semesters, the college will not certify the student's enrollment to the Veterans Administration for payment of benefits until the student's overall earned grade point average is 2.0 or better.

Associate Degree**Modern Policing AS**

Modern Policing AS Degree will prepare graduates to meet the requirements of the State of California mandated by Assembly Bill 89 to achieve the core competencies of state officials/law enforcement officers, as defined in CA Government Code 1031.4. The Modern Policing AS Degree is foundational to and prepares students for a career as a Peace Officer, which shall be completed prior to obtaining a POST Basic Certificate or within 24 months of initial appointment as a Peace Officer. Focus on courses pertinent to law enforcement, which shall include, but not be limited to, psychology, communications, history, ethnic studies, law, and those determined to develop necessary critical thinking skills and emotional intelligence.

Elementary Teacher Education: Integrated Programs AA-T

The Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education: Integrated Programs for Transfer (AA-T) Degree is intended to meet the lower division requirements for Elementary Teacher Education majors (or similar majors) at a CSU campus that offers baccalaureate degrees.

This degree is designed for students interested in an introduction to the field of Liberal Studies, Integrated Teacher's Education and for students looking to further their understanding of Elementary Teacher Education. These courses will provide students with a solid foundation in Elementary Teacher Education that will serve them for transferring to a University.

The Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education: Integrated Programs for Transfer (AA-T in Elementary Teacher Education: Integrated Programs) degree meets the requirements of SB 1440 for Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT). These degrees are intended to make it easier for students to transfer to California State University campuses but do not exclude admittance to other colleges or universities. To earn an Associate in Arts in Elementary Teacher Education: Integrated Programs for Transfer (AA-T in Elementary Teacher Education: Integrated Programs) degree, a student must complete the following:

- Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of degree-applicable courses
- A minimum of 18-semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district
- Completion of the Cal-GETC pattern
- Minimum grade of "C" (or "P") for each course in the major
- Minimum overall grade point average of 2.0
