You are about to graduate with your associate degree or certificate from Antelope Valley College. Please read this information carefully so you don't miss any important information.

The Commencement ceremony will be held at 7 p.m. on Friday, June 1, 2018 at AVC Brent Carder Marauder Stadium.

GETTING READY FOR COMMENCEMENT

GRAD FINALE will be held Thursday, **April 12 from 1–6 p.m.** in the Student Lounge. Mark your calendars and join us for this special day just for you.

GRAD FINALE INCLUDES:

• Cap and Gown

All graduates participating in the ceremony need to purchase a cap and gown. Black cap, gown and maroon/silver tassel will be sold as a complete set at the Marauder Bookstore for \$27.95 plus tax. (Gold tassels designating honors will be sold separately for \$4.95 plus tax. You must be on the Honors list at the bookstore to purchase a gold tassel.)

NOTE: All graduates MUST wear an AVC cap and gown.

All graduates need to complete a Grad Card to be used the day of commencement. It will identify your photos, the pronunciation of your name and a degree or certificate to be announced.

• Class Rings

Academic Cap & Gown will be offering graduates AVC rings for purchase.

Admission

Graduates are required to complete an online participation survey. No admission tickets will be issued for family and friends. All are welcome to attend.

THE DAYS BEFORE COMMENCEMENT

Commencement Rehearsal

To make sure everything goes smoothly for you, we will have multiple opportunities for

rehearsal in the Student Lounge at 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on **Monday, May 21**, 12 p.m. and 4 p.m. on **Tuesday, May 29** and 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. on **Wednesday, May 30**. Rehearsals are voluntary.

THE DAY OF COMMENCEMENT

Dressing for the Day

Don't forget your cap and gown.

Please dress appropriately for the weather.

We will be on the football field, so please wear flat comfortable shoes; no spiked heels. Leave all valuables at home. Please don't bring purses or electronic devices (cell phones, pagers, etc.) since there is no place to store them.

Check-In

All graduates must check in at Brent Carder Marauder Stadium (look for "Graduates Check in Here" signs) to line up beginning at 6 p.m. Graduates will line up on a first come, first line-up situation.

The Ceremony

Brent Carder Marauder Stadium will open at 6 p.m. The procession will begin promptly at 7 p.m. regardless of weather conditions.

Once you enter the field, you **WILL NOT** be allowed to leave until the ceremony has concluded.

After the procession and upon arriving at your chair, please remain standing until you are instructed to sit down. You will stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and the singing of the National Anthem. Guests on the platform will make remarks.

Following the speakers, your degree will be conferred and at the direction of the commencement marshals, the first row will be directed to the stage. When your turn comes, move up to the stage area and have your picture taken, then hand your name card to the card reader. After your name is called, proceed to the center of the stage and receive your degree cover and have your picture taken with the college president. Exit the stage and return to your row and be seated.

At the conclusion of the ceremony, all graduates will be asked to stand and move their tassels from right to left signifying graduation. The commencement marshals will direct you to march out in reverse order. All graduates will pass through the Path of Scholars created by the faculty. Family and friends will not be allowed to interfere with the ceremony. All graduates **MUST** remain for the entire ceremony and all graduates will march off the field together.

Commencement Graduate Photos

At graduate check-in, follow the signs to pick up your Grad Card. You will need to hand the completed card to the card reader at the stage who will read your name during the ceremony. When you approach the stage and again while on stage, Ultimate Exposures will take your photograph and will e-mail commencement day proofs for your review and possible purchase.

Length of Ceremony

The commencement ceremony is expected to last about two hours, so please plan accordingly.
