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

Be a first-time college student at AVC

2

Submit FAFSA or CA Dream Act every year

3

California Resident or AB540 Eligible

4

Enroll in at least 12 units per semester and complete 30 units by summer of end of first year*

5

Complete 30 units in first academic year (including summer and intersession*) for second year eligibility

6

Cumulative AVC GPA of 2.0 or above AND pass all classes with a 'C' or higher (66% completion rate)

*The Promise Program only pays tuition for fall and spring semesters



What is TimelyCare?

Access to 24/7 medical and mental health support for all Antelope Valley College students.

Who can use TimelyCare?

Any enrolled Antelope Valley College student can use TimelyCare.

What services are available?

24/7 Medical visits, TalkNow visits (24/7 mental health support) and Scheduled Counseling (12 visits per year) are available at no cost.

How do I log in?

Go to timelycare.com/AVC and follow the prompts.

**Mobile users will be directed to download the TimelyCare app.*

What can I be treated for?

Our physicians and counselors can treat/discuss a wide range of common conditions, and after talking to you, will decide on the best course of treatment. Some common conditions are: cold, sinus infection, influenza (flu), stress and anxiety, relationships and depression.

How much does a visit cost?

There is no cost to enrolled Antelope Valley College students.

I already have insurance and a primary provider, how does TimelyCare benefit me?

With TimelyCare, you will have free, 24/7 access to doctors and counselors from anywhere in the United States, so you'll never have to spend time or money looking for resources when you're away from home or campus.

Can I get a prescription?

Yes, if the provider deems it clinically appropriate.



PHILOSOPHY: The Office for Students with Disabilities encourages students to be as independent and self-reliant as possible. We work closely with each student to assess their needs and will only provide those support services and accommodations that directly address a student's functional limitations as a result of their disability.

How to Qualify

OSD serves students with physical and/or cognitive disabilities who have an educational limitation resulting from their disability. If you are interested in receiving any of our services, please apply online to receive accommodations for your disability. Participation is voluntary and all information is kept confidential.

Academic Accommodations and Services

Academic Accommodation Services are based on the functional limitations resulting from your disability. Please be sure to follow the guidelines for each service you are eligible for.

Academic Accommodation Services include Sign language interpreters, test readers, scribes, ability to record lectures, textbooks in alternative formats, Kurzweil 3000, test accommodations, accessible seating, Peer Shared Notes, priority registration, and use of the High Tech Center. Other support services may be available if deemed appropriate. Please contact OSD for more information.

Student Responsibilities

1. It is your responsibility to provide the OSD Office with written verification of your disability and resulting educational functional limitations.
2. You are responsible for making your needs known to your instructors as soon as possible, thereby making it possible for you to work out any accommodations that might be necessary.
3. If you experience any difficulty in your classes, you need to notify OSD staff as soon as possible so that we can work with you to resolve the issue.

- Assessment/Placement: Your self-reported high school information that was entered in your admission application is used to automatically place you in transfer level English and Math courses. (To review your placements, you can login to your myAVC account and select the Student Success Components widget.)

- Fill out the OSD application online at: <https://teton.accessiblelearning.com/avc> and upload your IEP prior to your intake appointment.
- Check your individual registration appointment in your MyAVC account.
- Register for your courses through your myAVC account.
- Pay for your courses the same day you register, or you will get dropped.





THE PROGRAM

Antelope Valley College's Honors Transfer Alliance Program (TAP) presents an enriching **pathway for transfer students**. This program is committed to serving a diverse student population by offering **unique opportunities** for individualized collaboration.

Participants engage in **transformative learning experiences** within Honors courses, which feature **smaller class sizes** (maximum of 21 students). Students are encouraged to collaborate closely with faculty to pursue **innovative and independent projects**, while the program emphasizes the **development of writing, research, and critical thinking skills**. The carefully curated course offerings aim to facilitate a smooth transition to a four-year university, and students benefit from the guidance of an honors counselor to assist in course planning.

Additionally, the Honors Transfer Alliance Program (TAP) grants students **priority consideration for admission to various prestigious universities** both statewide and nationally. The Honors Transfer Council of California (HTCC) facilitates these transfer agreements between honors programs.

ELIGIBILITY

Students entering from high school must have:

- 3.25 unweighted minimum GPA
- Completion of A-G requirements
- Completion of Algebra 2 or higher
- Grades "C" or higher in previous 2 criteria points

Students currently attending college must have:

- 12 semester units
- 3.0 minimum GPA

REQUIREMENTS

After formal acceptance into the program:

- Maintain a 3.0 minimum GPA
- Enroll in at least one honors course/option per semester (fall/spring)
- Complete 5 honors courses
 - 3 of the 5 must be actual honors courses
- Meet with an honors counselor once a semester (fall/spring)
- Complete the requirements of any honors options


