Purpose: The mission of the Enrollment Management Committee is to develop, implement, and evaluate a comprehensive strategic plan involving the entire campus to achieve and maintain optimum student enrollment, promote access and student success, enhance retention and meet the educational needs of our community.

What is Success?

- Universities are not open admission
- AVC Students should take load (semester units) that will allow them to achieve the highest GPA in preparation for transfer.
- They often prepare for multiple universities that have different major prep.
 This adds units...
- STEM majors- Starting below Calc I (Math 150) will significantly impact students' timeline for grad & transfer
- Many AVC students are not university ready and may struggle with full time enrollment
- Many AVC students are nontraditional students who may be working, have small children, have disabilities, struggles with housing, etc. There is no "one size fits all," at the community college level.

Listed below are the lower division preparation courses for the major. THIS MAJOR IS HIGHLY SELECTIVE To be considered for this major, you *must* complete one year of biology with lab, one year of general chemistry with lab, one year of calculus and one semester of organic chemistry with lab by the end of spring before transfer. Completion of a second semester of organic chemistry or one year of calculus based physics (mechanics, electricity,and magnetism) is strongly recommended. If your college does not offer a two semester or a three quarter sequence in calculus based physics, it is recommended that you complete Physics 5ABC at UCLA after transfer. All courses must be taken for a letter grade. 

Ways to Promote Student Success

- How do we retain students, move them through efficiently, and assist them to successfully graduate and transfer?
 - Course modalities available
 - Course scheduling conflicts across disciplines
 - 2 year schedule
 - Other ideas?
- Support services How do we make incoming students aware of support services available to them?
 - In person orientation for incoming students
 - Having students meet with Counseling for Abbreviated Education Plans prior to first term
- Onboarding
 - Evaluating incoming students for course work already completed
 - Meeting with them prior to their first term, so they don't take unnecessary courses

What Do Students Want?

- Spring 2021 RISC Survey Results showed that students are split on returning to campus for F2F courses.
 - Q: How interested are you in returning to campus?
 - Extremely / Very Interested 38%
 - Moderately Interested 26%
 - Not at all / Slightly Interested 35%
- Spring 2021 RISC Survey Results showed that students want more diverse class schedule.
 - Q: Which type of course do you prefer?
 - Fully Online 33%
 - Mostly Online with some F2F 26%
 - Mostly F2F 27%
 - Only F2F 14%

Student Challenges

- Spring 2021 RISC Survey Results asked about challenges students faced in their pursuit of an education.
- Major Challenges to Student Success:
 - Work & Personal Issues 59%
 - Success in Courses 59%
 - Academic Support Services 42%
 - Finances & Financial Aid 40%
 - Campus Environment 34%
