### Cal-GETC INFORMATION

\*All courses for Cal-GETC must be completed with a grade of "C" or better (a C- is not acceptable). A "C" is defined as a minimum 2.0 grade points on a 4.0 scale.

\*Cal-GETC does not guarantee admission to any CSU or UC campus. Consult with a counselor regarding limitations on acceptance of Cal-GETC.

\*Courses listed in multiple areas shall not be certified in more than one area.

\*No more than 14 semester units of Pass/No Pass (Credit/No Credit), excluding credit by examination, may be used toward Cal-GETC certification.

\*AP & IB external examinations, if applicable, may be used to satisfy Cal-GETC. CLEP is not accepted for Cal-GETC.

\*Students who have earned a CSU GE Breadth or IGETC Certification prior to Fall 2025 do not need to complete the Cal-GETC pathway.

### (Optional) UC GRADUATION REQUIREMENT: LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

Not part of Cal-GETC, courses may be completed prior to transfer.

### (Optional) CSU GRADUATION REQUIREMENT IN U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION, AND AMERICAN IDEALS

Although not a transfer or CSU admissions requirement, the CSU system requires students to complete coursework in American History (US-1), The U.S. Constitution (US-2), California State & Local Government (US-3) as a graduation requirement. This requirement may be met by completing POLS C1000 and one of the HIST courses listed below. Courses may double count with Areas 3B or 4, if applicable.
