Students without the AS Degree will earn a Non-Degreed License once the Board of Nursing exams are passed. There is no assurance that a Non-Degreed license will be recognized outside the State of California. The status of the license will be permanent and it will not change, even if, the student completes the other required courses for the AS degree after the initial license has been granted.</p> <p>Advanced Placement Options. (Degree):</p> <p>All prerequisites and General Education requirements for the regular ADN degree apply for this option. An LVN admitted to the second year of the ADN program can elect to receive credit for NS 101A, NS 102A, and NS203A for his/her LVN course work. LVNs must provide a transcript of their vocational nursing education and course description(s) showing content in maternal and newborn nursing and pediatric nursing. Electives: The remaining number of units (up to a minimum of 60) are considered electives. Any course that has already been counted toward (1) the general education requirements, or (2) the major, cannot be used as an elective. Any course with a designation of "AVC" at the end of a course description can be used as an elective.

Grade Point Average Requirement: An overall grade point average of 2.0 ("C" average) is required.
