#### General Education Requirements

Complete either the CSU Breath Requirements or IGETC.

The Associate in Arts in Geography for Transfer degree (AA-T in Geography) degree will prepare students to seamlessly transfer to a baccalaureate program in geography at a CSU. The program provides students with a well-rounded introduction to the physical and social science aspects of geography as well as the technology and techniques used by professional geographers. Students working toward the degree will complete survey courses in the two main sub-disciplines: physical and cultural geography. Students will also have the opportunity to focus their studies on one of these sub-disciplines or to continue a broad study of geography.

The Associate in Arts in Geography for Transfer (AA-T in Geography) degree meets the requirements of SB 1440 for Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT). These degrees are intended to make it easier for students to transfer to California State University campuses, but do not exclude admittance to other colleges or universities.

To earn an Associate in Arts in Geography for Transfer (AA-T in Geography) degree a student must complete the following:

1. Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
  - A. The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education –Breadth Requirements.
  - B. A minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
2. Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.

ADTs also require that students must earn a C or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.

#### Electives

The remaining number of units (up to a minimum of 60) are considered electives. Any course that has already been counted toward (1) the general education requirements, or (2) the major, cannot be used as an elective. Any course with a designation of "CSU" at the end of a course description can be used as an elective.

#### Grade Point Average Requirement

An overall grade point average of 2.0 ("C" average) is required.

**Double Counting:** While a course might satisfy more than one general education requirement, it may not be counted more than once for these purposes. A course may be used to satisfy both a general education requirement and a major or area of emphasis requirement.

#### Residence Requirement

Of the required 60 units, "at least 12 semester units must be completed in residence at the college granting the degree." Title 5, Section 54000 et seq. Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations is available at <http://ccr.oal.ca.gov> and in the Antelope Valley College Library.

#### Requirements for Two or More Associate Degrees

To be eligible for multiple associate degrees, a student must have completed all of the graduation requirements for each degree.

#### Transfer

Students planning to continue studies at a four-year college or university after AVC should visit the Transfer Resource Center and consult with a counselor as soon as possible to develop a plan of studies. Transferability of courses to the CSU or UC systems is indicated at the end of a course description by the notation "(UC, CSU)." For the transferability of courses to all other universities, please consult with a counselor or the Transfer Resource Center.

The "Catalog Rights Policy" sets forth the criteria used for determining the degree requirements under which students may graduate. Please refer to the AVC Catalog for a detailed description or consult with a counselor.

#### Prerequisite Completion

If a course is listed as a prerequisite for another course, that prerequisite course must be completed with a satisfactory grade in order to enroll in the next course. According to Title 5, Section 55200(d), a satisfactory grade is a grade of "A," "B," "C" or "P". Students who enroll in classes for which they do not meet the prerequisites will be involuntarily dropped. Students will be notified of this involuntary drop.

*Advisory:* Eligibility for College Level Reading and ENGL 100A. (CSU, UC, AVC)

*Advisory:* Eligibility for College Level Reading, ENGL 101. (CSU, UC, AVC)

**Prerequisite:** Completion of or concurrent enrollment in GEOG 101, and Completion of MATH 102.

GEOG 102 \*PHYSICAL GEOGRAPHY: EARTH'S WEATHER AND CLIMATE

*Advisory:* Eligibility for College Level Reading, ENGL 101 and MATH 102. (CSU, UC, AVC)

GEOG 105 \*CULTURAL GEOGRAPHY

*Advisory:* Completion of or concurrent enrollment in ENGL 101, and Eligibility for College Level Reading and MATH 102. (CSU, UC, AVC)

GEOG 106 \*CALIFORNIA GEOGRAPHY

*Advisory:* Completion of ENGL 101 and GEOG 101 or GEOG 105, and Eligibility for College Level Reading. (CSU, UC, AVC)

GEOG 110 \*WORLD REGIONAL GEOGRAPHY

*Advisory:* Eligibility for ENGL 101 and READ 099. (CSU, UC, AVC)

GEOG 201 \*MAP INTERPRETATION AND GPS

*Advisory:* Completion of MATH 105, and Eligibility for College Level Reading and ENGL 101. (CSU, AVC)

GEOG 205 \*INTRODUCTION TO GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS

*Advisory:* Completion of CA 103 and MATH 105, and Completion of or concurrent enrollment in GEOG 201 and MATH 102, and Eligibility for College Level Reading and ENGL 101. (CSU, AVC)

GEOG 299 \*SPECIAL TOPICS-FIELD GEOGRAPHY

*Advisory:* Completion of or concurrent enrollment in GEOG 101, GEOG 102, GEOG 106, GEOL 101 or ERSC 101. (CSU, AVC)

GEOL 101 \*PHYSICAL GEOLOGY

**Prerequisite:** Completion of MATH 102.

*Advisory:* Eligibility for College Level Reading, ENGL 101. (CSU, UC, AVC)

*Advisory:*

A condition of enrollment that a student is advised, but not required, to meet before or in conjunction with enrollment in a course or educational program.

**Prerequisite:**

A condition of enrollment that a student is required to meet in order to demonstrate current readiness for enrollment in a course or educational program. Prerequisites are enforced and a student will be blocked from enrolling or involuntarily dropped after enrolling if the student does not meet the stated prerequisite. A student must complete a course prerequisite with a satisfactory grade of A, B, C or P (pass).

Corequisite:

A condition of enrollment consisting of a course that a student is required to simultaneously take in order to enroll in another course. Corequisites are enforced and a student will be blocked from enrolling if the student does not meet the stated requisite.
