

## MLA Works Cited Page: Listing EBSCO Sources

- 1. Alphabetize entries in a Works Cited list by author's last name or by first word of the title (other than *a*, *an*, *the*) for a work without an author.
- 2. Double-space between lines.
- 3. Indent second and subsequent lines of each entry 5 spaces.
- 4. Use italics, capitalization, quotation marks, and other punctuation within lines as shown. For dates, use this order: day, month, year. Use standard abbreviations for months.
- 5. Give beginning and ending page numbers for each article. When pagination is not continuous, type the first page number and a plus sign. If page numbers are not available, leave them out.
- 6. Include the name of the database but not the company (Ebsco Discovery Services). Also include the DOI (digital object identifier) or permalink if available; otherwise, use the database URL.
