## II. PUBLIC FORUM

Senator of Student Development and Services Elaine Tsai said she has a lawsuit with R. Dr. Zimmerman said we should never ask for donations from anyone because the Foundation takes care of that and if we do ask for donations as a separate group from AVC then it should be for something specific, such as a company willing to print something for us for free for a flyer or fundraiser.

## II. ACTION ITEMS

### 3.1 ASO Awareness and Promotion

#### 3.1.1 ASO Shirts Update

President Enrique Camacho said that since Vice President, Club Affairs Karole Obrikat is absent we will table the ASO shirts update for the next meeting.

#### 3.1.2 ASO Bookmark Update

Vice President, Public Relations Stephanie Conley said she and Senator of Student Development and Services Elaine Tsai went to 44 businesses, of which only 3 said a definite no and 14 completed contracts were present at the meeting. A contract with Camille's was due within the hour as well.

Vice President, Student Services Sandra Govin said she went to the Gamers club and asked them what kind of businesses they wanted to see on the list for the ASO Sticker benefits. She also gave the club contracts if they have businesses that want to be added to the ASO sticker list. She said that the price for 1,000 bookmarks is \$167; 2,000 bookmarks are \$300; and 5,000 bookmarks are \$515. Everyone decided that buying 5,000 bookmarks was the most reasonable.

Moved to approve up to \$600 for the ASO Bookmarks by Senator Visual and Performing Arts and Physical Education Issac Grajeda, seconded by Senator of Student Development and Services Elaine Tsai. Motion passed 10/0/0.

#### 3.2.1 ASO/ ICC Activities

Treasurer Patricia Del Gaudio said that for Welcome Week she has \$100 to pay for the Pie in the Face event, she wants the football players to participate and her father is making the plywood prop for the event.

### 3.2.1 Feed Your Brain

Vice President, Student Services Sandra Govin said she started the program last year with Rona Brynin and Anne Volk who are nutrition teachers and the goal was to encourage students to eat better which will equal to better mental acuity. Last year the prizes totaled up to \$500, this fall semester she was thinking about using up to \$250.
