II. ACTION ITEMS

3.1 ASO Appointments

Tiffany Taylor wants to be the Language Arts and Instructional Resources Senator. Everyone agrees she is a good candidate because she has been consistent in coming to the meetings ever since she got interested in the position.

Moved to ratify Tiffany Taylor's appointment as Senator of Language arts and Instructional resources by Senator of Visual and Performing Arts and Physical Education, Isaac Grajeda, seconded by Senator of Counseling and Matriculation, Terrance Myers. Motion Passed 11/0/0.

Moved to ratify Shanoah Garcia appointment for Senator of Technical education by Senator of Visual and Performing Arts and Physical Education, Isaac Grajeda, seconded by Senator of Economic Development, Tatiana Konovalov. Motion Passed 11/0/0.

3.2 ASO Grant Proposal

Anna Bacerra asked on behalf of SAC for \$ 2,925 for Fall activities. She reported that \$11,000 is needed in total and only \$8,000 is available. She said that the events promote the ASO and benefits the campus.

Vice President, Club Affairs, Karole Obrikat said that all the activities are planned for the semester already and the events cannot go on without the grant. Anna Becerra reminded everyone that the money is needed for events at both the Lancaster and Palmdale campuses. The money would come from the budget under the "Other" section of the Grant funds, and there are enough funds available.

Moved to approve \$2,925 to the SAC Department for Fall 2010 events by Vice President, Student Services, Sandra Govin, seconded by Senator of Visual and Performing Arts and Physical Education, Isaac Grajeda. Motion passed 11/0/0.

The Women's Volleyball Team came to ask for more meal money for their away games. Their team consists of fourteen players. Dr. Zimmerman said that the new state rate is that all athletes will get paid \$6 for Breakfast, \$6 for Lunch, \$12 for Dinner and \$6 for a post game snack.

Moved to approve meal money for the Women's Volleyball Team for away games per state rate by Senator of Visual and Performing Arts and Physical

Education, Isaac Grajeda, seconded Vice President, Club Affairs, Karole Obrikat. Motion passed 11/0/0.
