### III. ACTION ITEMS

#### 3.1 Reimbursement to Advisor

Motion was made by Vice President for Student Services Sandra Govin, seconded by Senator of Mathematics, Science and Engineering Tuski Mason to allocate up to \$1000 from the Student Rep Fee to reimburse ASO Advisor for unforeseen expenses made at the SSCCC Spring 2011 General Assembly and to cover the cost of the SSCCC Advisors Workshop in order to train the advisor and accountant. Motion passed 9/0/0.

#### 3.2 ASO Constitution Overview

Changes were made to the previously modified Constitution to add language that describes the Student Court and overviewed some housekeeping changes. Motion to adopt the changes made to the ASO Constitution was made by Treasurer Patricia DelGaudio, seconded by Vice President of Academic Affairs Sara Rothenberg. Motion Passed 9/0/0.

#### 3.3 ASO/ ICC Activities

Vice President of Academic Affairs Sara Rothenberg suggested that we should hold a meeting outside instead of the Student Lounge to raise more awareness of ASO. The party had held a consensus and a date will be determined.

He thinks that a program should be started at AVC to start a way of promote kindness and trust to our students.
- Vice President for Academic Affairs Sara Rothenberg proposed that ASO should have an end time to all the meetings (even if all the items were not covered) in order to establish some sort of order to the meetings. She also shared some concern about people not taking enough responsibilities and wants more ASO members to take control of more things in ASO.
