3.1 SSSCC and Region VI Update

Megan Turrill: The resolution procedures have been approved and any sun setting resolutions will be sent out, sun setting means the resolution previously passed. So any resolution passed 5 years ago will sun set and become inactive. They are going through all the resolutions and will bring back the ones to General Assembly that need to be brought up again.

Mara Javines: They went over some of their goals. One of the plans was to go to the different school in the region and make sure that they have something in place when it comes to advocacy, whether it be an advocacy team or even an advocacy committee. That is just so that they can identify who those individuals are and network with them.

They also had a senator from Region II or Region III, he called in and he is really experienced and passionate with legislative advocacy and he talked to Region VI a lot about how to approach the legislators and also talked a lot about Prop 13 and what it was and what it meant for education. Other than that, they went over their legislator visits.

They were thinking about setting up advocacy teams for local AS's as one of their goals so they can visit their legislators on their own not just as a Region and so that they can report back and see what they can do as a region as well.

Spectrum: Met Sunday night. Spectrum is the LGBTQIA coccus in the SSSCC, which Mara Javines is now the president of. They went over items such as Preferred Name Accommodation which is something that has been a weird task to handle because the language that was brought up in the resolution that passed in Spring 2014 General Assembly, was not very clear for accommodation for current students. They are looking into researching that more and that is affecting the Preferred Name Accommodation ad hoc committee for Region VI, but they are seeing if there is a quick and easy fix for that, also they just started supporting the Latino Coccus and supporting their stance on AB 101 which is a bill brought up. Some of those students are going to be members of the CCC and hopefully the SSSCC.

Some resolutions are being thrown around right now, such as the campus index score. Which is like a rating on how friendly your campus is to the LGBTQ students and another resolution was to have staff undergo mandatory safe zone training and they just went over and had discussion on what they wanted to bring forward at general assembly.
