II. PUBLIC FORUM

Christy Collins has sent out emails asking for volunteers to help with relief efforts for the victims of Hurricane Katrina. Michelle Hernandez stated there is a need for people to go down Robertson's Honda in Van Nuys to help sort the donated goods prior to shipment. If interested, AVC may be able to provide transportation. AVC faculty and staff have been purchasing dry goods at COSTCO to send. Cash donations are also being accepted on campus. Doug suggested arranging a food drive.

III. REPORTS

Advisor's Report

Michelle reiterated that any club-sponsored event must be brought to ICC first. If an on-campus is planned, a Facilities request form needs to be presented to ICC for approval. If the event is to take place in the student lounge, ASO must approve the venue, however ICC still has to approve the event/activity. If it is an off-campus event, a Facilities request form is not required, however the event must be brought to ICC for approval. An advisor must be present at all events

Display cases will be made available to clubs on a rotating basis.

They plan to hold a fundraiser at Vince's Pasta & Pizza on November 7th. They are willing to participate in Relay for Life as part of an ICC team.

4.2 Club Promotions

There was an open question from last meeting concerning selling food at Club Days. Michelle stated that Health guidelines have changed a bit. Food can not be left out in open area. It must be covered. The Outreach office has three pop-up canopies that could be used to protect the food.

Music is a possibility for Club Days, but need to check with ASO on the availability of a trained technician.

There was some discussion of friendly competition between the clubs, such as egg toss, water balloons, tricycle relay, tug-of-war. A treasure hunt/scavenger hunt of some kind received the most support. Each club representative will return next week with ideas on questions which are unique to their activity.

Facilities request needed to be turned in today for Library Plaza. The general consensus was each club would need a table. Six clubs were expecting to do some type of fundraising. AV Gamers planned to sell sno-cones and the Alliance wants to offer blended lemonade. Both will need access to electricity. SAC and ASO will be invited to have tables.
