II. **PUBLIC FORUM**

It was recommended by a club member to establish a committee working specifically to advertise for the series. The committee will be discussed at the next meeting.

III. **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

3.1 **Club Rush**

A suggestion to hold a mini Club Rush event at the Palmdale Campus was made. Clubs can attempt to hold meetings and events a few times a month to help involve students not usually on the Lancaster campus. Clubs did not believe this to be efficient due to most students that attend weekly club meetings are already on campus. Changing the club meeting location can cause a large loss of attendance. Flyers and other club advertisement can be left at the Palmdale campus for those that are interested.

3.2 **Club Meeting Times**

This process will shorten the amount of time spent on club activities during the meeting and allowing for more time to be used for other discussions. One Linc can supply volunteers needed for the requested event. Dr. Zimmerman requested additional changes to form to include a comment section. The approved events will be updated on the ICC Google calendar. A paper handout of the calendar will also be made available.

VI. ANNOUNCEMENTS/UPCOMING MEEINGS AND EVENTS
