4.3 Kimbirly Dolatowski discussed the issue of being better at doing club minutes and agenda. For the minutes please get them and any supporting documents on time. It is crucial to have the most accurate minutes as possible, especially when dealing with money and activities that you want to have done with your clubs and travel. Motions must be in the minutes supported with a motion with how much money is going to be spent. This helps the club's accountant Nancy Blundell to get proper paperwork so that she can submit it through to the College Board of Trustees. Also if you need funds from your club account the transaction will go much smoother with the proper documents. Look over the agenda ahead of time to see what will be covered at the future ICC meetings. If there is something that needs a motion, we can start off with a motion to get the ball rolling and see if it gets approved or not. It will also help to have more efficient meetings with less time on discussion and more time to get it done and report back to the

clubs on the status of things. Dr. Zimmerman added when you do a check request her staff is looking at three important things.

- 1.) Who is at the meeting? Is it just you or one other person?
- 2) What are you making motion on, be clear
- 3.) How much are you requesting, you can do an up to budget of whatever amount. Example, if your club wants to buy a gift card; specify the exact amount.

Also if students spend money from their personal bank account don't expect to be reimburse. Instead, get a college advance. Be mindful of turning in funds, reimburse funds or check requests in early and not in late. AVC STEM Club asked is there a length of time given if it expires. Answer it has to be within the academic year. Clubs can't spend funds that are not yours.

Next trip requests have to have minutes to back it up. You do not work independently from the college but rather within the confines of AVC. Travel has to be preapproved. Clubs do not have the right to travel without the college's authorization. The travel guidelines are mainly to protect students in case of unforeseen accident of some sort. In the Club and Advisor Handbook there is a sample of how to properly fill out all the information that was discussed.

4.5 The ways to access your club funds. Check request, reimbursements and cash advance. Or have Nancy Blundell buy it directly for your club. Dr. Zimmerman mentioned the objective is not to take personal money and float it within the club. But rather have the funds go directly from the club to the purchaser. Clubs need minutes and receipts for a cash advance and any money that equals the same amount. When a club is making a motion, it's preferable to do an up to budget to account for the costs. Try to use your club's money and not your own money.

Question: Is there a particular forum to fill out for the cash advance?

Answer: Yes and please have a conversation with Nancy Blundell.
